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

In 2006, Bruce Elrod, a music professional and record producer, revived the magazine as an online publication with the revised name, Cashbox. Bruce partnered with music promoter and magazine publisher, Randall Wilds, in 2018. This partnership re-established Cashbox as a printed publication. Today, Wilds & Associates continues the publication of Cashbox with integrity and pride, preserving the legacy of its founders and former owners - the late Bill Gersh, George Albert, and Bruce Elrod.

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Adam Grant was born and raised in Harris County Georgia in a small town called Shiloh. He is 48 years old, married with 1 son who is 16 years old named Brock and he's a leukemia survivor from age 5.

Now retired from law enforcement after 13 years, he survived a horrible crash with severe injuries while on a traffic stop that required three surgeries. Adam was medically retired after the accident and started focusing back on his music with songwriting, recording and performing live shows between Georgia and Texas.


Adam had an independent record deal with his band Badhorse from 2010-2012 in Nashville with 3 consecutive #1 songs on country radio on New Music Weekly charts and Nashville Music Row charts, one #2 song on Christian Country charts, voted Best New Group 2010 by New Music Weekly. Badhorse was in two motion pictures, one with Travis Tritt and the other with John Schneider.

Adam has just released his 2nd solo album titled "MY TURN" which currently has a hit single titled "LEAVE-ME-THE-HELL-ALONE" with over 900,000 views combined on YouTube. The song was recorded in Nashville with members of Ronnie Milsap's band, co-produced by John Heinrich. Adam has put out a total of five albums, three of which were with Badhorse, the two recent albums are solo albums. Badhorse had a music video to their song 'It's All Good' with Terry Bradshaw from the Steelers at the Titans stadium in Nashville.

The very first country artist Adam ever met in person on his very first trip to Nashville back in 98' was Vern Gosdin himself at the Nashville Palace while Adam was staying at the Opryland Hotel. Badhorse also had their song 'It's All Good' selected to be the 2012 NFL Alumni song during the 2012 NFL Alumni awards. Adam continues to write amazing country songs and performing live everywhere he can.

AARON PARTRIDGE


aron Partridge's musical journey first started at the roots of his family. Growing up, his mother played piano and organ in church, while his father performed in Country bands. At the age of thirteen, he began learning the harmonica, engaging himself in the Blues. Soon after, he transitioned to the guitar and spent two

decades mastering Blues Rock, Rockabilly, and Country styles, performing at local bars, clubs, festivals, and rodeos.

His influences are as diverse as his musical upbringing. From the classic sounds of the '50s and '60s to the soul of Gospel and Blues, Aaron was drawn to artists like the Beach Boys, Bob Dylan, Bob Seger, BB King, Ray Charles, Rosetta Tharpe, and Jerry Lee Lewis. During high school, he worked as a radio DJ and that introduced him to '60s Soul music, lighting a love for the mix of Blues, Rock, and Gospel that continues to shape his style today.

Aaron's career highlights reflect his commitment to his music and his faith. One significant moment was performing an original guitar instrumental with the late Phil Emmanuel, a legendary Australian guitarist. Another unforgettable moment was collaborating with Gospel legend Steve Apirana on the song *You Can Call On Him*. Yet, some of his most cherished moments come from unexpected places, like performing with the Gospel group Restore the Broken in a Somerset, Tennessee parking lot, reaching over 30,000 live viewers.

Aaron's achievements include songs currently charting in four U.S. charts, including his latest single released through Grace Records Nashville, LLC, *Heaven Help Me*. He's been nominated at the Prayze Factor Awards in Atlanta and the Josie Awards in Nashville for his song *Strongest Soldiers*. While accolades are meaningful, Aaron's faith has shifted his



perspective on success. Rather than focusing on awards, he values the chance to reach people through his music.

A turning point in Aaron's life came in 2012 when he met Sam Childers, the "Machine Gun Preacher." After seventeen years away from church, this encounter renewed his faith and redefined his purpose. Aaron realized that God had been preparing him all along, guiding his talents toward ministry. This led to meeting Country music icon Leon Everette. Aaron was invited to appear on his TV show, God and Country Time, and eventually started working with the amazing Debbie Bennett from Grace Records Nashville LLC, setting his commitment to sharing his faith through music.

In the future, Aaron hopes to broaden his music ministry around the world. His band, Brothers of Redemption, inspires people that feel different or like misfits, which is how, at one time, Aaron felt. One of Aaron's aspirations for 2025 is to return to the U.S. to continue on the connections made and share his new music. He wants to continue to share his message of faith and redemption with prayers and support.

At his concerts, fans experience a powerful blend of Gospel-inspired storytelling, smooth guitar, and heartfelt lyrics. Whether solo or with his band, Aaron's concerts and shows are deeply personal, offering a real connection from the stage to the audience. His music is raw, real, and filled with faith.

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Perhaps her first words were not even spoken but likely sang. Billie Jo Jones started singing as soon as she could talk. This singer/songwriter is known for blending traditional Country music with her own, unique style and attitude. From her Texas roots to the global stage, she is captivating audiences everywhere.

Billie Jo Jones was destined for stardom from a very early age. Raised by her Grandparents in Emory, Texas is where she began singing. She recalls, "I would go in the living room and put on shows for them when I was four and five years old and sing Loretta Lynn, Tammy Wynette, Ray Price, Shania Twain and all the greats. My grandparents would sit, watch me for hours, and clap for me after every song. I went from singing to them in their living room and now they go to my shows. They are 86 and 90. We laugh and joke and say that I have kept them young."

Billie Jo is excited to have released her fiery new single, *Flame*, the track showcases her powerful vocal range and signature style, combining classic Country grit with modern-day attitude. With a bold spirit and undeniable sass, Jones delivers a performance that leaves no doubt - she's a force to be reckoned with.

Jones shares the story behind the song. "I co-wrote it last year. It's a little bit of a true story. Dolly Parton is a huge influence on me and *Jolene* is one of my favorites to cover! I wanted to have a little twist, similar to Jolene and make it what Billie Jo Jones would have done in that situation. I co-wrote it with Len Snow, Tammy Marler and Bobby E. Boyd. I am very excited about it. I think it's going to be my next breakout hit."

When listening to *Flame*, it's like a throwback to Loretta loved me and made me into the woman I am today. So I am Lynn with Fist City or You Ain't Women Enough. The song sounds like something Loretta might have written. Flame is a confident anthem of resilience and determination, showcasing Billie Jo Jones' strength and willingness to stand up for what's hers.

Her previous single, Right Now Kinda Girl, topped the Texas Regional Radio Chart. With a growing popularity the dynamic blonde Texan is reviving her favorite style of Country music with hard-hitting, honest lyrics, clever hooks, is write better songs to inspire people."

and unforgettable melodies. Her single, Some Girls Don't Cry, is the title track of her debut full-length Country album.

Jones shares her thoughts on her career. "I have had a lot of success in Country music. I've been playing with my band for over ten years and working really hard and now things are kind of lining up and coming into the place they should have been. It's been a really fun, wild ride. I have done a whole lot put I also feel like I am just getting started."

Like many artists, Billie Jo has some goals she is aiming for in her growing career. "I have played at the Grand Ole Opry with Lee Greenwood but I haven't stood in the circle or had my debut moment yet. I want to really play the Grand Ole Opry, The Ryman, I would love to go out on a big tour with an artist for several weeks. That would really be a big goal of mine. I want to keep writing songs and putting out more music that people can relate to and want to play over again."

Billie Jo shared who she looks up to as a songwriter. "Any and everybody, especially Loretta Lynn and Dolly Parton. I love all of Jack Ingram stuff he writes, Lori McKenna, Liz Rose, Paul Overstreet, Keith Whitley. I mean

there are so many I could name. I love to perform but I love wrote a song on her latest album, I Can't Take Keith Whitley Tonight. She adds, "I wrote that with Len Snow and it's one of my favorites so far."

A personal song that Jones wrote on the album was about her grandmother, entitled, She Did. "My grandparents raised me since I was one and my mom was and still is a drug addict to this day so I've only seen her a few times my entire life. My daddy is a truck driver and still is a big part of my life. I just didn't live with him. But my grandparents took me in and

blessed because of them."

Jones has held tight to her faith through all the ups and downs in life. "Being that my grandparents raised me, I grew up in a Christian home and that was very important to me and in my music. I am never going to put anything out that my grandma would not approve of. I have always said God didn't give me this voice just to sit at home with it. He gave it to share with the world. That is what I want to continue to do

She shares highlights during her career. "I did get to sing writing songs as well." Speaking of Keith Whitley, Jones with Lee Greenwood for the Veterans. I recorded my album with Kent Wells, and the big things I can't announce yet!" Jones was recently surprised with a #1 plaque for her single, Who's Tequila Are You Drinking, which was #1 on Amazon Music's Top Country Songs chart in February 2025. This makes three #1 songs from her debut album. Jones has been nominated for numerous awards with the Texas Regional Country Music Awards. She took home the award for 'Female Vocalist of the Year.'



Artist Spotlight MARTONE

artone's journey through the entertainment industry is one marked by passion, perseverance, and a powerful sense of purpose. From hosting the hit music video show Video Control at just fourteen years old, to becoming a rising force in the global house music scene, Martone's evolution is both inspiring and electrifying.

His early exposure to media through television and later radio - most notably as host of Industry Revue in the Mix, which grew into the independent IRMIX Radio - helped shape his signature voice. But it was his love for music, born from icons like Janet and Michael Jackson, Prince, Madonna, and house legends like Frankie Knuckles and David Morales, that truly ignited his artistic fire. Fusing high-energy house beats with

Electronic and Pop flair, Martone's sound is bold, expressive, and deeply personal.

A career-defining moment came with the release of "The Evolution of Martone", an album that not only celebrated its 10th anniversary with a special remix edition but also included tracks that hit the Top 10 on the dance/workout charts in 2016. Love You I Do Auoo (Extreme's Deep Love Remix) and Groove Tonight (Extreme's Late Night Remix) climbed to #5 and #9 respectively, affirming his status as a powerful voice in the Dance music world.

Recognition followed with a Global Music Award Silver Medal and a Detroit Music Award nomination for "Erogenous Zone." In 2016, Martone became a member of The Recording Academy and attended the Grammy Awards - a surreal night that included encounters with his childhood idols and unforgettable industry moments.

Martone's creative drive extends beyond music. His debut book, "Deep & Raw: The Erotica of Martone" opened new avenues of expression, showcasing a deeply introspective and sensual side. Yet, the road hasn't been without obstacles. Struggles with music distribution through Label Worx and TuneCore tested his resolve but reaffirmed his belief in trusting his own instincts.




Looking ahead, Martone is preparing to release his next album, "Phoenix Rising: The Emperor's Ascension" in July 2025. Before that, fans can expect the release of the lead single, *Too Bad, So Sad*, a collaboration with Intelligent Diva, dropping in May. These projects reflect his evolution as both an artist and a person - resilient, daring, and ever-transforming.

A self-described activist, Martone's artistry is grounded in a mission far deeper than the dance floor. As a Black gay man in music, he champions representation, inclusivity, and social justice, using his platform to challenge oppression and inspire change. "My music isn't just about making people dance - it's about empowerment," he says.

Martone's performances are more than concerts - they are immersive celebrations of life, love, and the liberating spirit of house music. And while he still dreams of acting in films and writing more books, his ultimate goal remains clear: to spread joy, spark connection, and empower others - one beat at a time.

With his fearless authenticity and relentless drive, Martone is more than a house music artist. He's a movement. And his evolution? It's only just begun.


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Country singer/songwriter Trey Calloway has over sixteen years of professional experience and a lifetime of performing. The multi-award winner is passionate about energizing and inspiring live audiences and collaborating with diverse groups of musicians. With a creative talent, great stage presence, strong work ethic, and a positive attitude, Trey Calloway is living out his dream and is passionate about his craft and touching lives through his music.

Trey was born and raised in North Carolina. The son of a preacher man, he grew up singing in church and was a seasoned performer by the age of ten. Trey reflects on those early years. "My folks are from the Appalachian Mountains of North Carolina originally, but my family and great grandmother moved to the Charlotte area. She was one of the first to come off the mountain and find work in Charlotte. My folks live in a town called Mooresville now. My dad was an evangelist, and it was hard to make a living as an evangelist so he worked construction and that's what he does to this day. We went to different churches in North and South Carolina, and he preached revivals. What got me into music was singing to those congregations, to different people and different crowds. I grew up with that deep love for Gospel music. I would say I love Gospel as much as I love Country music."

Trey remembers those Gospel influences. "The Watchmen Quartet, as a kid, was the first quartet I remember hearing, also Charles Johnson and the Revivers and Ray Bolz.

Then as I got older, I listened to the Newsboys, Mark Shultz and TobyMac. My dad exposed me to all the Gospel stuff. But once I got a hold of the Country music it was all over but the crying!"

Although Southern and Contemporary Gospel was his first musical loves, he was instantly mesmerized by the sounds of Country music after hearing songs from a Garth Brooks album. Trey recalls, "It was the Garth Brooks "Double Live" album that made me really want to do this. That album opened with *Callin' Baton Rouge*, and it was awesome. Then Mom and Dad bought me a "Country Gold" album with Geroge Jones, Loretta Lynn, Waylon and Wille, Patsy Cline and Conway Twitty. I had a deep-rooted love of Classic Country music and the 80s. I am a combination of different kinds of styles."

His passion for rocking, boot stomping, Country music artists such as Garth Brooks, Clint Black, Alan Jackson, and Travis Tritt started growing within him. "These musical influences inspired my artistic journey and changed my life."

open mic nights. "I began writing songs and performing in clubs at the age of fifteen and knew early on without a doubt I'd make music my career. Around the age of sixteen I started single Your Love Is Safe With Me. His debut album, "Wanted playing in bands and getting paid gigs."

Trey fronted multiple bands and won numerous awards in North Carolina before moving to Myrtle Beach, South Carolina in 2016. "I had a nice house near Myrtle Beach out in the country. I knew Nashville was where I wanted to be. I sold almost everything I owned and moved in 2019. I was heroes, including farmers and soldiers.

making some contacts and things were looking up and going great."

He became one of the featured acts at the legendary Alan Jackson's Good Time Bar when the pandemic hit in March 2020. The Nashville music scene locked down and professional musicians faced unprecedented challenges finding work.

"Luckily, something good came out of it. I moved back to Myrtle Beach and started a new band and met my wife, Raina. She had just graduated from Ohio University and moved to Myrtle Beach two days before we met. I snatched her up off the market before anyone could get her!"

Trey admits, honestly, it was all in God's plan. "It was meant to happen the way it did. I went back to Nashville, and we really accomplished a lot in the last three years. I have a great team of people and proud of everyone that works with me. The older I get the more things happen in God's time. The more we try to plan, the more He throws a monkey wrench in there. You just got to hang on and you got to work hard and be prepared."

For true Country music fans and those who love a good story song, Trey's latest single, The Ballad of Righteous and Wrong ranks up there with the best. The song brings a modern edge while evoking the spirit of classics such as Pancho & Lefty, and El Paso, set in a world that would fit any Taylor Sheridan drama. With its strong storytelling, evocative melody, and rich production, The Ballad

Of Righteous and Wrong explores the enduring conflict between justice and morality, drawing listeners into every word.

Trey shares how this unique song was born. "I love talking about this song! I wrote it with two of my great friends Greg Wilson and Hal O'Dell. I walked in to write that day and I said, guys, I don't want to write another Popish love, Country song today. Let's do something interesting and experiment. Let's write a song that stands the test of time. I had always wanted to write a song like Devil Went Down To Georgia, Poncho and Lefty, Big Iron or something like that. We eventually settled on a story of two twin brothers in the wild west. One brother is an outlaw, the other is a Deputy. We wrote this little murder ballad that delves into the timeless struggle between right and wrong, It's a story song that you have to listen to beginning to end." Plans are in the works for

In his teens Trey began playing guitar and performing at a video of the song. But there is a lyric video that was released with the single.

Trey has opened shows for Joe Diffie, Tracy Lawrence, McBride & The Ride, Pat Green, Edwin McCain, and Craig Campbell, and has played for audiences at the Charlotte Speed Street NASCAR Festival, the House of Blues, Billy Bob's Texas and The Tennessee State Fair Opry Stage.

Since mid-2023, Calloway has won 'Songwriter of the Year' at the Texas Country Music Awards, had a music video featured on CMT, been picked up by Spotify editorial playlists, and is approaching three million streams on Spotify alone.

Trey is working on getting back on tour after working on recordings for three years. "I got out the "Wanted Man" album this past year and we pretty much have not stopped and been working on a new album now. Then we will start releasing singles on this new record soon. I am excited to let the world hear the new music."

A special moment for Trey was when his son Cash, who is ten years old now, joined him on stage. "That was a special time during our vacation. I had no idea he knew a song I wrote called *Working Thing* and he got up there and snatched that microphone out of my hand and sang every word. He is musically gifted. I don't know what kind of music he is gonna end up playing but that is still to be determined. He loves Country music, Heavy Metal, Hip Hop and I am very excited to see where his music career goes. I want him to find music the way I did, very organically."

Trey relies on his faith and shares what keeps him grounded. "I think there have been times in my life where I doubted God. There have been times when I asked him, 'Why are you doing this to me?' I think we all battle that kind of stuff. I come to realize, as I put my faith and trust in Him, usually things work out the way they should. Honestly, what keeps me going now a days is wanting to be successful for my son. I want to be an example that he can look up to and say, 'my daddy chased his dream and took the time to be a good father.' You can do both! They say it's hard to do both in this career, but you can. You can chase a dream and be a



good parent and be someone he and my future children can look up to. That sense of morality that the Lord has instilled in me I try to instill in him as well. I want him to look at me the way I look at my dad."

He adds, "While I love performing for fans and want to be a great entertainer, I hope that above all I'm remembered as a successful songwriter. My dream is to bring positive original music to life to help others in whatever way my music might touch them. I've come to know that music can work miracles. It can make you fall in love;

it can remind you of the best day of your life; it can get you through any tough times; and it can even heal a broken heart. I wholeheartedly believe that music is the universal language. It has saved me time and time again, and I'm continuously inspired to write songs and express myself through music. I truly hope my songs resonate with people and can bring happiness and understanding to others. If I can positively impact one life with my words and melodies, then that's a career I'll gladly hang my cowboy hat on."




yatt Massingille is a rising Country music star who is quickly making his mark on the industry. At first glance, Wyatt may seem out of place with his modern and edgy appearance, but when he opens his mouth to sing, his voice transports the listener to the heart of classic Country music.

Some folks might say some of the music that is packaged as Traditional Country nowadays has more in common with Neil Young than it does with George Jones. Though he clearly loves them all, it is Jones that shaped Wyatt Massingille's early love for Traditional Country. As a matter of fact, he could probably do a whole show just singing George Jones songs. One that is most requested and one that Wyatt enjoys performing the most is Jones' *He Stopped Loving Her Today*. The young singer says it is the epitome of what real Country music should sound like from the lyrics, to the music, to the voice.

You won't mistake Wyatt's voice for George or Keith Whitley, another hero. But you will hear their influence. You'll hear an honest empathy, and deep understanding of what hard Country is all about. Drawing inspiration from legends like Jones, Merle Haggard and Johnny Cash, Wyatt puts his own unique spin on the genre, infusing it with a fresh energy that has captivated audiences across the nation. *Lord It Sure is Drunk Tonight* is a Keith Whitley song that Whitley wrote but never released. Wyatt is the first person to ever release the song.

In a world full of diverse music Wyatt has always stayed true to his roots and influences in the vein of Classic Country music. He's certainly one to watch!

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

Troy SealsNovember 16, 1938 - March 6, 2025

Troy Seals was born in Big Hill, Kentucky, and his family moved to Cincinnati, Ohio when he was eleven. Troy began his career at age 17 in 1956. He and his band, The Earthquakes performed on the Rock & Roll nightclub circuit during the 1950s, working with such legends as Fats Domino, Jackie Wilson, Bo Diddley, The Drifters, Lloyd Price, Dorsey Burnette and Chubby Checker.

Seals met Rockabilly recording artist Jo-Ann Campbell, who was featured in such teen films as "Go, Johnny Go" (1958) and "Hey Let's Twist" (1961). Not long after Seals and Campbell married, she scored a 1963 Country hit with *I'm the Girl From Wolverton Mountain*. Billed as "Jo-Ann & Troy," the couple had Pop success with *I Found a Love, Oh What a Love* in 1964.

After regular appearances on Dick Clark's TV shows American Bandstand and Where the Action Is, Campbell retired in 1965. Seals gave up music and founded a construction company in 1968. The couple moved to Nashville in early 1969. Seals continued to work in construction, building Music Row's Quadraphonic Studio. He also took work as a session musician, hoping to break into the Country industry.

By the 1970s, Seals had established himself as a respected songwriter. He earned his first No.1 hit when Conway Twitty recorded *There's a Honky Tonk Angel*. Twitty also had No. 1 hits with the Seals tunes *Don't Take It Away*, (1979), *Red Neckin' Love Makin' Night* (1982) and *Fallin' for You for Years* (1987). Three Troy Seals songs were duet hits for Twitty and Loretta Lynn, *Feelins* (1975), *I Can't Love You Enough* (1977) and *From Seven Till Ten* (1978).

By the close of the 1970s, Seals was established as a Music Row tunesmith. He worked with a variety of cowriters, most successfully Eddie Setser, Max D. Barnes, Graham Lyle and Mike Reid. Seals and wife Jo-Ann were also sometimes cowriters. His early songs were recorded by Johnny Paycheck, Jeanne Pruett, Jerry Lee Lewis, Nat Stuckey, Bob Luman and Connie Smith. In 1979, Elvis Presley had a posthumous, top 10 Country hit with his revival of *There's a Honky Tonk Angel*.

Troy recorded his debut album at Quadraphonic in 1973. Titled "Now Presenting Troy Seals," the Atlantic Records collection included his version of *We Had It All*, as well as *There's a Honky Tonk Angel (Who'll Take Me Back In)*. Producer Billy Sherrill recorded Seals as the songwriter's second album. It was issued by Columbia Records in 1976. Seals also recorded singles for Elektra, RCA, Polydor and several smaller labels. But he became increasingly known for his writing, rather than his recordings.

Seals was seen as a staple in Nashville's songwriting community. He went on to write some of the most memorable Country songs of the era and several Top 10 hits. His work included *You Almost Slipped My Mind* by Charley Pride, *Who's Gonna Fill Their Shoes* by George Jones, *Drinkin' and Dreamin'* by Waylon Jennings, *Ten Feet Away* by Keith Whitley, and *Lost in the Fifties Tonight* recorded by Ronnie Milsap. Seals secured another No.1 hit in 1985 with *Seven Spanish Angels*, a duet between Willie Nelson and Ray Charles. He went on to write many more songs for artists like The Oak Ridge Boys, The Judds, Reba McEntire, Randy Travis, Faith Hill, John Anderson, John Berry, Neal McCoy and more.

Seals' songs reached beyond Country music. In 1983, Eric Clapton had a Pop hit with the songwriter's *I've Got a Rock and Roll Heart*. Over the years, Seals' copyrights were also recorded by such Pop and R&B stars as Joe Cocker, Millie Jackson, Celine Dion, Three Dog Night, Etta James,

Jodeci, Delbert McClinton, Aretha Franklin, The Rolling release of the group's first full-length album. Other fan Stones and Barry Manilow, among others.

Seals' incredible contributions to Country music eventually earned him a place in the Nashville Songwriters Hall of Fame in 1988. He was named 'Country Songwriter of the Year' by ASCAP along with winning numerous other awards and nominations.

The songwriter's family were also involved in the music business. His nephew Brady Seals was in the band Little Texas and a solo artist. The extended family also included Seals of Seals & Crofts and hit songwriter Chuck Seals.

Troy Seals died at home in Hendersonville, Tennessee on March 6. He was 86 years old.



Huev P. Williams September 21, 1938 - March 24, 2025

Huey P. Williams was born in 1938 into Gospel music royalty. He was the older brother of Frank Williams, who founded the Mississippi Mass Choir, and of Melvin, Doug, and Leonard Williams, members of the Grammy-nominated Williams Brothers. The Williams family is widely recognized for its significant influence in shaping the sound of modern Gospel.

As the longtime front man with The Jackson Southernaires, Williams' unmistakable voice and soulful storytelling made him one of the most beloved vocalists in the genre. He is revered as a trailblazer in traditional Gospel.

The Jackson Southernaires, founded in 1940 in Jackson, Mississippi, rose to national prominence in the 1960s with the breakout single, *The Greatest Creator*, released in 1963. Too Late (1968) became a major success, leading to the

favorites include Don't Let Him Catch You (With Your Work *Undone*) and *How Long Will It Last*.

In 1975, the group became the first gospel act to sign with Malaco Records, where it released projects that charted on Billboard's Top Gospel Albums list, such as "Down Home" (1975), "Legendary Gentlemen" (1979), and "Lord We Need Your Blessing" (1985). They were frequently named among Billboard's 'Top Gospel/Soul Artists of the Year.'

The Jackson Southernaires won multiple accolades, Country stars Dan Seals and Johnny Duncan, Pop star Jim including three consecutive Gospel Music Workshop of America awards for 'Traditional Male Group of the Year' in the late '80s, a Stellar Award in 1989, and a Grammy nomination in 1992. They were inducted into the Mississippi Musicians Hall of Fame, and in 2010, the city of Jackson renamed a stretch of road in their honor: Jackson Southernaires Drive.

> Huey's commitment to Gospel never wavered. When asked if he'd ever retire, he famously replied, "My answer to that question is, how do you give up on God? How do you give up on Gospel? How do you say, 'I'm going to retire?' It's like a good marriage - until death do us part."

> Williams' final performance with the group was in late 2024, a testament to his enduring passion for Gospel. On March 24, 2025, he died peacefully at his home in Smithdale, Mississippi. He was 86 years old. His passing marks the end of an era for quartet Gospel - a style he helped define and preserve for over five decades.

> "My big brother Huey, in my eyes, was in a league of his own," said Doug, who is one of his brothers. "He possessed a signature voice that was unmistakably his own. His music ministry touched so many lives in such a positive way over the years. He had a big personality, but such a humble spirit. Huey was the epitome of a people's person, a man who loved everybody and never met a stranger. He would literally give you the shirt off his back. That's why so many people from across the country gravitated to him and loved him dearly. His presence will be sorely missed, but his undeniable legacy will live on forever."





LuLu Roman May 6, 1946 - April 23, 225

Born Bertha Louise Hable on May 6, 1946, in Dallas, Texas, Lulu's life was a testament to the power of perseverance. Raised in an orphanage after a challenging childhood marked by abandonment, she transformed adversity into a radiant career that spanned music, comedy, and ministry.

Her indomitable spirit and infectious joy propelled her to stardom, beginning with her breakout role as a founding cast member of Hee Haw in 1969. Alongside Country music legends like Roy Clark and Buck Owens, Lulu's comedic brilliance, hearty laugh, and commanding singing voice made her a household name. Her performances brought warmth and humor to generations of viewers, cementing her as a cornerstone of the show's legacy and a beloved figure in television history.

Lou's talents extended far beyond the screen. As a trailblazer in Gospel music, she released over a dozen albums, which showcased her soulful voice and deeply personal faith. Her music earned her a Grammy nomination, a Dove Award from the Gospel Music Association, and a 1999 induction into the Country Gospel Music Hall of Fame.

Lou's concerts were more than performances - they were spiritual gatherings filled with hope, testimony, and connection. Her openness about her struggles with addiction and her transformative journey to Christianity in the 1970s resonated deeply, offering inspiration to those facing their trials. Her story of redemption became a cornerstone of her ministry, as she shared her faith through music, speaking engagements, and outreach.

Her unwavering love for her family defined Lulu's life. She often spoke of her sons, Damon and Justin, as her greatest blessings. Sadly, Justin passed away in 2017, a loss that profoundly shaped her heart and deepened her faith.





There are numerous super-session musicians in Nashville, but very few with the longevity of Charlie McCoy. In addition to being a fixture in Nashville studios for over sixty years, he also has his own recording career.

The extraordinary harmonica player served as the music director for eighteen years for the syndicated television series, "Hee Haw." At 84, The Grand Ole Opry and Country Music Hall of Fame member Charlie McCoy is still enjoying the blessing of an extraordinary career and a God-given talent.

The Musician and the Man

harlie McCoy had a connection to Hank Williams before he knew anything about the Country legend. Charlie was born in Oak Hill, West Virginia. It was the town where Hank Williams passed away in the back of the car at the only gas station in Oak Hill. The driver was in route to take Hank to Canton, Ohio for a New Year's Eve concert. Hank's death was confirmed at the hospital where Charlie McCoy was born.

Charlie recalls, "I was eleven when Hank passed away and I didn't know anything about him at that time. Then, of course, when I moved to Nashville in 1960, I found out real quick who he was! I realized how important he was to Country music. He was only 29 years old with no high school education, but the songs he wrote are still popular seventy years later."

Charlie's family moved to Miami, Florida when he was nine. He attended a very musical high school and took Music Theory in the 12th Grade and began playing guitar in Rock Music, dropped out before the year was over and went back

& Roll bands. During a Country music dance, his job was playing Rock & Roll ten minutes each hour. Charlie shares his encounter meeting a Country artist that night. "Mel Tillis came in and heard me perform. I didn't know who he was. He said, 'Boy, if you come to Nashville I will get you on records tomorrow.' That was like throwing a steak to a wolf! The day after graduation, I went to Nashville and met Mel's manager and publisher, Jim Denny, and he said, 'Mel told me about you."

Charlie auditioned for two iconic producers, Chet Atkins and Owen Bradley. He played the guitar and sang Chuck Berry's, Johnny B. Goode. Charlie admits, "They both turned me down, but Owen Bradley invited me to a recording session. I saw a thirteen-year-old, Brenda Lee record one of her first hits. When I watched that session and heard the first playback, I said, I don't want to be a singer, I want to do this!"

McCoy went back to the University of Miami School of

to Nashville. "My father was so upset because it was his dream for me to go to college. He forgave me years later when I introduced him to Dolly Parton!"

He moved in with a songwriter, Kent Westberry, who became a Nashville Songwriter Association Hall of Famer and wrote many hit songs. Charlie remembers how that friendship opened the door in the beginning of his career. "Every day, people would come over and write. I was fascinated and would sit and listen. One day, Kent was working on a song and asked me to play my harmonica. It sounded great and I played on the demo session."

asked, 'Are you the guy that played harmonica on that song.'

Yes Sir, I am! He wanted me on the session and to play the way I did on the demo. He was recording a young girl from Sweden named Ann Margaret. At twenty years old, I walked in the session and Chet said, 'I know you!' I said, Yes, I auditioned for you two years ago. 'You played a Gibson and sang Johnny B. Goode. I wish you would have played that harmonica for me!' The greatest part about that session was when Bob Moore walked up and said, 'You free Friday?' At that time, I was free the rest of my life! He was recording Roy Orbison and I was already a huge fan! We recorded the song Candy Man. The record hit the radio and my phone started ringing, and it's been 63 years and it's still ringing."

Charlie began working sessions in the early 60s and became one of the most in-demand session players in Nashville known as the A-Team. He has played over 12,000 sessions. His session credits are literally a who's who of Country music. In addition to Country sessions, Charlie was a mainstay on Elvis Presley recordings both in Nashville and Los Angeles. When Bob Dylan recorded Highway 61, Blond On Blond, John Wesley Harding, and Nashville Skyline, Charlie was there, playing on these landmark recordings. He was also heard on Simon and Garfunkle's *The Boxer* He has toured across the U.S. and made appearances in Europe and Japan.

Charlie shares out of the thousands of sessions which ones stand out to him. "My favorite song I played on was Tom T. Hall's, Old Dogs, Children And Watermelon Wine. The biggest Country record I played on was George Jones' He Stopped Loving Her Today or Delta Dawn by Tanya Tucker. I didn't play harmonica but some of the biggest records I played on was baritone saxophone on *Pretty Women* by Roy Orbison, Trumpet on Everybody Must Get Stoned with Bob Dylan and I played organ on Easy Lovin' by Freddie Hart. I was the guy who tuned the guitar on Bobby Bare's Detroit City. Those classic songs of the 50s, 60s, 70s and 80s are going to last a lot longer than some of these songs today."

Charlie also played on I Was Country When Country Wasn't Cool by Barbara Mandrell, Loretta Lynn, When The Tingle Becomes A Chill, Dolly Parton's My Tennessee Mountain Home, Play, Guitar Play by Conway Twitty, Johnny Paycheck's hit, Take This Job And Shove It and thousands of other hits and recordings.

Artists that Charlie has played for include, Jerry Lee Lewis, Waylon Jennings, Blake Shelton, Marie Osmond, Ray Stevens, Willie Nelson, Wynonna, Carl Perkins, Fats Domino, The Oak Ridge Boys, Connie Smith, Tammy Wynette, Roy Acuff, Paul Simon, Charley Pride, The Jordanaires, Bill "A month passes, and I get a call from Chet Atkins. He Anderson, Gene Watson, Pasty Cline, Brenda Lee, Jim Reeves, The Happy Goodman Family and many others.



He won a Grammy in 1972 for his album, "The Real McCoy." He won CMA's "Instrumentalist Of The Year" two times and the Academy Of Country Music's "Specialty Instrument Award." Charlie was a member of a legendary recording band, Area Code 615. The band featured many of the top session players in Nashville. Charlie is predominantly known as a harmonica player, but his musical talents include guitar, bass, mallet percussion, (vibes, marimba, bells), keyboards, and various wind instruments. In addition to "Hee Haw", Charlie served as music director for other television shows including playing in the house band for the TNN show "Music City Tonight" with Crook and Chase.

Charlie reminisces about his legendary career. "It's been so amazing! For many years I was so busy. I was doing more than three hundred sessions a year. Then all the perks that came along with it. Hee Haw, The West Virginia Hall of Fame, The Country Music Hall of Fame, and the Musicians Hall of Fame. Then the real icing on the cake was in 2022. I was made a member of the Grand Ole Opry."

Sunday Mornin' Country is celebrating forty-three years this month and Charlie has been a major part of most of them. through the Opry House at this historic event. He states, "I started it when Joe Babcock, who was a member of the Nashville Edition and on Hee Haw, invited me. The first time I played was in 1990. I have missed a few years traveling abroad but I have made a bunch of them."

"I was fortunate when I first got to Nashville. I got with friends who were worship leaders at a church. They invited me to come join them and I did that," says Charlie concerning his love for the Lord. "I enjoyed doing that, I really got into the message. A friend from Holland that I played with in Europe and who didn't believe in God, asked me a question. 'Tell me why you believe what you believe?' I said that was easy. #1, It happened over two thousand years ago, and the church is still going strong. #2, The Bible was written by many people who had no cell phones or no way of communicating and lived miles apart, but the theme of the

Bible is constant all the way through. Then the third thing, Israel is the country that is surrounded by people who want them off the face of the earth, but they continue to thrive, and you can't deny those three things. I have also recorded three Gospel albums so far because I do believe it! I've been more blessed than I thought I deserved to be. I thank the good Lord for it every day!"

Charlie continues to tour, including dates with Jason Coleman who is Floyd Cramer's grandson and who was also part of the A-Team. He is still working sessions in the studio. He admits, "I did about sixty last year and over forty this year. I still love it! I just want to go in with great musicians and play for people that want to be there and have a love for it."

Now that he is a member of the Opry and played it thirty-nine times last year, he foresees being a frequent artist in that iconic circle. Charlie is currently working on a new album with more information to be announced soon.


The harmonica virtuoso has great advice to young musicians. "When I was with the A-Team, I was young and excited and wanted to play! One day my hero Grady Martin took me outside and gave me advice. 'You got to calm down. Listen and don't interrupt the words and play in between them.' Harold Bradley, Owen Bradley's brother, walked over after the session. 'I saw Grady take you outside, what did he tell you?' He said I was playing too much and he was right!"

"The motto of the A-team is 'the singer and the song are It's always a highlight when Charlie's harmonica rings the picture and we are the frame.' My advice for a new musician, it's more important to know where not to play than where to play. But when it is your turn, do something that fits the lyrics and fits the song."

> "I think even though the music style has changed we still have great artists. These people give their heart and soul to Country music and if you can get a chance to come to Nashville, visit the Country Music Hall of Fame, the RCA Studio B tour which was the first place I recorded with Ann Margaret and Roy Orbison. The Grand Ole Opry is so great. We have veteran artists and feature newcomers and there is a good mix. The band and background singers are so great. It's so much fun to do it. For me it's a 25-minute drive. Play three songs to the greatest audience in the world. What's not to like?!"

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



Over the past 40+ years of playing music, Webb has released four albums - "I Won't Be Scared," "Honk If You Wanna Honky Tonk," "Mine's Bigger," and "Things Left Undone." The single At The Drop Of A Hat from Webb's first album ("I Won't Be Scared") reached #47 on Cashbox.

> Webb has enjoyed two #1 songs on the Independent Country charts and two #1 songs on the Top Rock charts airing across the United States. as well as Internationally in Romania, Belgium, the UK, Belize, New Zealand, Berlin, Australia, France and Brazil. With Webb's latest release, Don't Forget, Remember Me, he's showing no signs of slowing down.

> Webb founded the Gulf Coast Musicians Medical Fund in 2018 with the launch of his aforementioned Gospel CD, "Things Left Undone." The charity helps Gulf Coast musicians and songwriters in Alabama, Mississippi, Louisiana and Florida with financial assistance for medical care at no cost to the musician or songwriter. 100 percent of the sales from the CD ("Things Left Undone") goes to GCMM Fund and a fundraiser is held every year in Pensacola, Florida with two stages with different acts on both stages every hour from Noon until 10 PM. Gulf Coast Musicians Medical Fund is a non-profit 501(C)3.

In 2023, Webb was a Josie Music Awards independent music awards recipient for 'Artist of the Year' and 2024 JMA Award for 'Songwriter of the Year.' Standing in "The Circle" Webb's fourth album was a Gospel project, "Things Left at the Grand Ole Opry to receive these awards and deliver his

acceptance speech, Webb considers it an honor to be recognized with such a special award at such a special place as the Grand Ole Opry. Webb was also a 2024 nominee as 'BAMA Country Artist' at the Alabama Music Awards held in Bessemer, Alabama.

Webb's love to entertain and perform has spanned over four decades. He has also dedicated 37 years in public service working in the law enforcement profession in Tennessee and Alabama, protecting and serving the citizens. Over the years, Webb has received the 'Key to the City' for Memphis, Tennessee and for Bartlett, Tennessee for his charitable works. When asked about his charitable works he has done over the years, Webb says "Life is about passing it on. It's just something that God expects us to do and is pleasing to Him. The glory goes all to God."

Hailing from Virginia, June Carter Cash was a vibrant presence in Country music for more than sixty years as a singer, comedienne, songwriter, and Grammy-winning duet partner of her husband, Johnny Cash. Tony Brown from North Carolina advanced from being an in-demand keyboard player to shaping the genre's modern sound as a hit record producer and savvy label executive who signed many influential artists. A four-time CMA 'Entertainer of the Year.' Tennessee native Kenny Chesney parlayed a resonant baritone voice, a talent for songwriting, and a competitive spirit into more than fifty Top Ten country hits, sixteen platinum albums, and stadium-filling tours.

Non-Performer

Born in North Carolina and schooled as a keyboard player in the topnotch road bands of Elvis Presley and Emmylou Harris, Tony Brown became a key record executive in shaping the sound of modern Country music. As a record producer, he supervised many best-selling recordings by Country Music Hall of Fame members Vince Gill, Wynonna Judd, Patty Loveless, Reba McEntire, George Strait, Marty Stuart, and others. As a label executive and talent scout at MCA Records, he also brought daring, outside talents into mainstream Country music, including Steve Earle, Nanci Griffith, Lyle Lovett, the Mavericks, and Kelly Willis.

Veterans Era Artist

June Carter Cash was a vibrant presence in Country music for over sixty years as a singer, comedienne, and songwriter. She began performing at age ten in 1939, singing with her mother, Maybelle Carter of the Carter Family, and her two sisters on Mexican border radio. Mother Maybelle & the Carter Sisters later starred on the Grand Ole Opry and joined Johnny Cash's roadshow. June Carter wrote more than 100 songs, including *Ring of Fire*, a #1 hit for Cash, whom she married in 1968. They recorded several hit duets, including *Jackson* and *If I Were a Carpenter*, both of which won Grammys.

Modern Era Artist

A former high school athlete from Luttrell, Tennessee, Kenny Chesney parlayed a resonant baritone voice and a competitive spirit into one of the biggest careers in Country music since the year 2000. He has earned sixteen platinum albums, more than fifty Top Ten Country hits, and twenty-three #1s on Billboard's Hot Country Songs chart. Among his best-known hits are *The Good Stuff, There Goes My Life*, and *The Boys of Fall*, all of which crossed over to the Pop charts. A perennial top touring attraction, he's been voted the CMA 'Entertainer of the Year' four times -2004, 2006, 2007, and 2008.



The compilation of 48 never-before-released Cline recordings are now available in a two-LP set. More than 60 years after her tragic death, Country music legend Patsy Cline still has more to share with the world after never-beforereleased recordings of the iconic star were discovered in a basement.

A limited-edition, two-LP set, "Imagine That: The Lost Recordings (1954-1963)," which includes 48 songs from live concerts and radio and TV appearances, was released on April

Elton John and Brandi Carlile Announce New Studio Album, "Who Believes in Angels?"


Elton John and Brandi Carlile released their collaborative studio album "Who Believes In Angels?" on April 4th via Island EMI Records.

The concept for "Who Believes In Angels?" was devised by close friends and regular collaborators Elton John, eleven-time GRAMMY winning US superstar Brandi Carlile and multiple GRAMMY Award winning producer and songwriter Andrew Watt. They set out to create a genuinely collaborative studio album between Elton and Brandi. The album would mix Elton-led songs and Brandi-led songs, with long term collaborator Bernie Taupin and Brandi both contributing lyrics, and producer and co-writer Andrew Watt acting as the producer, mediator and creative conduit. Entering Los Angeles' Sunset Sound Studios in October 2023 with a completely blank slate, they pushed each other out of their comfort zones to write and record an album completely from scratch in just 20 days.



A film crew was allowed in the process of making "Who Believes In Angels?" This is the first time that Elton has allowed cameras to film his writing and recording sessions. Static cameras positioned around the studio captured thousands of hours of raw footage, and ultimately documented the entire creative process - breakdowns, breakthroughs, tears, torn up lyric sheets and all.

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.The candid footage offers fans an unprecedented, searingly honest insight into the emotionally turbulent creative process for Elton, Brandi and the rest of the team.

The results of this creative friction are stunning, and the kaleidoscopic scope of "Who Believes In Angels?" draws comparisons with some of Elton's very finest works. Ballads co-exist with raw Rock and Roll, Pop songs and Country-hued Americana rub shoulders with synth-heavy psychedelia. It's an album as unexpected as it is triumphant. 



illy Payne is not just a name in the world of traditional Country music; he's a force keeping its soul alive. Born and raised in southern West Virginia, Payne picked up a guitar at age twelve, setting himself on a path that would eventually take him across the world. From singing in church and family gatherings as a teenager to playing in local bars in the early '90s, his journey has been driven by passion, perseverance, and a deep respect for the legends who came before him.

Billy's career is filled with remarkable highlights. Performing at the Ernest Tubb Midnight Jamboree and the Famous Wheeling Jamboree were defining moments, but his biggest break came in 2014 when he became an official artist member of the Wheeling Jamboree. That same year, he was selected to tour and record with Waymore's Outlaws, the band that once backed the legendary Waylon Jennings. In 2024, Payne was honored with multiple awards, including the Josie Music Award for 'Outlaw Album of the Year' for his album "A Little Rough Around the Edges," which was presented at the Grand Ole Opry House in Nashville.








Studdard rose to fame as winner of the second season of American Idol. He received a Grammy Award nomination in 2003 for 'Best Male R&B Vocal Performance' for his recording of *Superstar*. That happened to be the song he auditioned with for American Idol, sung by Luther Vandross. Since his American Idol win in 2003, Studdard has released seven studio albums, including his platinum-selling debut, "Soulful," and the top-selling Gospel follow-up, "I Need an Angel."

He is most well-known for his recording career, which has produced hits including *Flying Without Wings, Sorry 2004*, and *Change Me*, but he has also segued into television and stage work. Most notably, he starred as Fats Waller in a national tour revival of Ain't Misbehavin', which spawned a Grammynominated soundtrack.

In 2013, Studdard appeared as a contestant on the fifteenth season of weight-loss competition show The Biggest Loser. He later signed to Verve Records and collaborated with the label's chairman, David Foster, on Studdard's sixth studio album, "Unconditional Love," in 2014. That album received strong reviews and included a tour with Lalah Hathaway.

In 2018, Studdard, who has long been compared to R&B singer Luther Vandross, released a cover album called "Ruben Sings Luther" and launched his Always & Forever national tour. All totaled, Studdard has released eight studio albums, with the most recent being "The Way I Remember" It in 2023.

He made his Broadway theatre debut in December 2018 in Ruben & Clay's First Annual Christmas Carol Family Fun Pageant Spectacular Reunion Show (aka Ruben & Clay's Christmas Show) at the Imperial Theatre. The pair has performed together often, most recently in 2023 in a tour celebrating the 20-year anniversary of their appearance on the show. In a recent interview with timesonline.com about the tour with Aiken, Studdard spoke about the milestone. He discussed wanting to return the favor to the fans who first



supported him all those years ago: "Twenty years is a real monumental moment in your life after achieving something I never thought would happen to us. I always wanted to be a part of the music industry, but I never thought in a million years it would happen the way it did, being on 'American Idol.' And we wanted to celebrate with the people who gave us the chance to live out both of our dreams in some ways. This is something to be proud of and celebrated and just thankful we're still here twenty years after."


He adds, "I want to be around for a long time. I want to make sure I continue to make good music that my mom and everybody around me can be proud of.."











"Country music is the greatest thing in the whole world," declares David Wills, and with a voice as rich and resonant as the Tennessee hills he hails from, it's easy to believe him. With a baritone that can both haunt and heal, and a pen that's crafted some of Country music's most unforgettable lyrics, Wills has carved his place among Nashville's elite - a storyteller at heart, and a true steward of the Country music tradition.

Born in Pulaski, Tennessee, to John and Roberta Steinfath, Wills' musical journey began early, when his mother bought him his first guitar. "My mother is the one that basically taught me how to play the guitar," he recalls. It wasn't long before the young prodigy was performing with local bands, sharpening his sound with every note. As a teenager, he joined the Dynamic Downbeats with lifelong friend Frank Speers, showcasing an early mix of Rock'n'Roll edge and Country Soul.

Wills' turning point came in a most Nashville-like fairy tale. At a local talent contest in Lakeland, Tennessee, he caught the attention of Seymour "Sy" Rosenberg - thenmanager of Charlie Rich. Impressed by the young singer's talent and charisma, Rosenberg asked a then 22-year-old Wills if he wanted to be a star. "Heck yeah!" was the eager reply. That moment sparked a career that would carry Wills

His debut album "Barrooms to Bedrooms" (1974) was the perfect launchpad. With two Top Ten Billboard hits - *There's A Song On The Jukebox* and the title track - Wills instantly cemented himself as a Country mainstay. A year later came "Everybody's Country," which paid tribute to his roots and musical inspirations with renditions of *Long Tall Sally* and Rich's *All Over Me*. Collaborations with industry greats like Blake Mevis led to his RCA release "New Beginnings," showcasing his vocal range and storytelling prowess with tracks like *The Eyes Of A Stranger*.

talent and charisma, Rosenberg asked a then 22-year-old Wills if he wanted to be a star. "Heck yeah!" was the eager reply. That moment sparked a career that would carry Wills million copies of his songs sold worldwide, his catalog reads

like a greatest hits collection for Country legends. His credits include George Strait's *If You're Thinking You Want a Stranger*, Sawyer Brown's *Leona*, John Schneider's *You're The Last Thing I Needed Tonight*, and Keith Whitley's poignant *Charlotte's In North Carolina*.

Perhaps most iconic is the ballad *Wild Horses*, co-written with Bill Shore and recorded by Garth Brooks for his "No Fences" album. Though the album debuted in 1990, *Wild Horses* was released as a single ten years later, charting at number seven on the Billboard Hot Country Singles and Tracks and contributing to the rodeo song's staggering 23 million units sold altogether.

In the early '90s, Wills' songwriting continued to shine. His gospel-leaning album "Line On Love" included *You Don't Know How Lucky You Are*, recorded by Patty Loveless, and *Line on Love*, featured on John Michael Montgomery's triple-platinum debut album.

Beyond commercial success, Wills has been a cornerstone at Charley Pride Music Group for over four decades, his songs crossing genres and audiences. *Holding Out Hope To You*, performed by Michael English, won 'Inspirational Recorded Song of the Year' at the 1994 Dove Awards, showcasing Wills' rare versatility.

More recently, in 2021, Georgia native and entrepreneur Wesley Fricks helped ignite a new era for Wills' music. Together, they planned two retrospective albums - one featuring previously recorded tracks and another filled with


unreleased treasures from Wills' archives. Released in 2022 and 2023, the albums reflect a career steeped in sincerity, soul, and storytelling.


"I have never met a more talented singer or songwriter in my life," Fricks said. "It will be easy to understand why these albums will resonate with Country music fans around the world."


And the legend continues. David Wills is preparing for the release of his third album on Tugalo Records, titled "Way Too Much Fun." With tracks like *Honor Bound*, *Made In The Shade*, and *No Anchors*, this new project promises to deliver everything fans have come to love - authentic Country, from the heart. The single *Honor Bound*, accompanied by a music video, will debut the weekend of his upcoming concert at the Historic Ritz Theatre in Toccoa, Georgia, where he'll perform alongside Strait Country Tribute artist Howard Decker.

"Honor Bound is a moving tribute to our U.S. Military soldiers who have sacrificed so much of their lives for us to live safely and sleep comfortably while they are putting their lives on the line every day," said Wesley Fricks, Wills' manager and President of Tugalo Records.

From Pulaski to the Grand Ole Opry, from barrooms to Billboard, David Wills stands as a timeless figure in Country music - one who reminds us that behind every great country song is a story worth telling, and a voice like his to sing it.

43rd Innual Sunday Mornin' Country® The Tradition Continues...



Three Country music legends - Lynn Fox, Brenda Lee, and Charlie McCoy

The tradition continues as Music City Christian Fellowship presents their 43rd Annual Sunday Mornin' Country® at the Grand Ole Opry House in Nashville Tennessee, June 8th. 2025. This special event has always blended the top Country music artists and your favorite Gospel music together for a time of celebration and Inspiration. The event is filled with many special moments as the presence of the Lord fills the Opry House each year.

unday Mornin' Country® is the longest running named Country/Gospel event associated with the week of CMA Music Fest, previously known as Fan Fair. It's sponsored by the Nashville-based nonprofit, Music City Christian Fellowship. For over four decades this legendary event always leaves fans and guests feeling uplifted and encouraged with memories that last a lifetime.

We look back at the history and special memories through the years with founding member Cowboy Joe Babcock and co-producers Lynn Fox and Melanie Walker. The event was birthed from the desire of a few Country music industry professionals to have a church service in Nashville during Fan Fair.

Cowboy Joe Babcock sang with the Nashville Edition, backing hundreds of artists on Hee Haw and on many hit songs. He is a founder of Music City Christian Fellowship and tells us how it all began. "We hired female artist Sandy performers Posey to be a part of the Nashville Edition in the early days which included Ricky Page, Hurshel Wiginton, Dolores After a cou Edgins, and myself. Sandy left to be a soloist and had some Auditorium.

hits. Sandy, who was a Christian had been to Fan Fair in Nashville. She said, 'Joe, there is no Christian influence at all during Fan Fair. We should do something.' We had seven of us to kick the idea around. We eventually got together and decided to call the organization Music City Christian Fellowship. I thought of the name Sunday Mornin' Country® and Teddy Wilburn from the Wilburn Brothers said, 'That's it! That's the name!'"

In 1980, Sunday Mornin' Country® began at 10:00 AM on Sunday mornings. Due to the huge production and number of artists performing, the time has changed through the years to the afternoon. Sunday Mornin' Country® still has the feel of a Sunday morning church service with many uplifting songs!

The first Sunday Mornin' Country® program was held at the War Memorial Auditorium in Nashville. A few of the performers were Billy Walker who was the Master of Ceremony, The Stonemans, LuLu Roman and many others. After a couple of locations it was moved to the Ryman Auditorium

Cowboy Joe expresses his appreciation to those carrying on the tradition. "Sam Lovullo, who produced Hee Haw produced the show back then. Sam taught me the ropes then I placed it in good hands to handle the production. I give Lynn Fox, Melanie Walker and the board credit. The board that produces this show now has learned to do it in a professional manner and we have a production team that ranks with the best. I am proud of them! I helped produce Hee Haw along with Sam Lovullo and our production team ranks up there with them. It has been worth it to have it at the Opry House. It takes around thirty people to put this event together all year long."

From the award-winning Fox Brothers, co-producer Lynn Fox shares his experience from the beginning. "We started many years ago first at War Memorial, then a few years at Opryland in the Chattanooga Ball Room. LuLu Roman, Jeannie C. Riley, Billy Walker, Grandpa Jones, The Fox Brothers and many others were a major part of it. Then the board decided they would try to have it at the Opry house around 1985. That year we had an opportunity to get Tammy Wynette. In the mid-90s, Joe's daughter Lorrie Babcock started producing the show at the Ryman during that time because Fan Fair had moved downtown near the Ryman. We've been at the Opry house ever since, for many years now."

Christian Country artist Melanie Walker, who is the current president of Music City Christian Fellowship, has been a part of Sunday Mornin' Country® for over twenty years, Melanie recalls. "Songwriter Daniel Johnson invited me to a singing event, and it was there that Carol Babcock invited me. I started co-producing the show in 2016."

Melanie shares a special memory from SMC. "It would have to be the time we had Skeeter Davis on the show. Skeeter had been battling cancer. She gave her testimony, and literally there wasn't a dry eye in the place. The Opry band was weeping because they knew what she had been through with cancer. That was Skeeter's last performance, she passed away shortly after."

Lynn Fox shares these special moments. "We had Lynn Anderson perform and she did a Gospel version of the big Pop hit, *Drift Away* on our show. She came backstage and shook our hands and said, 'I really needed this today.' Then a month later she passed away. This year marks ten years since her passing and that memorable performance at Sunday Mornin' Country.®"

"Also, for our 40th anniversary we did a tribute to all the artists that had passed away. You don't realize how many who helped paved the way for this event that's no longer with us. Country music Hall of Fame and Grand Ole Opry member, Charlie McCoy played a beautiful rendition of the *Lord's Prayer* on harmonica while these artist's pictures were shown on the screen. From the production side of it, that was very important to me."

"Last year, Joe Babcock and the Babcocks performed a song for his wife Carol, *Until That Time*. The photographer

got the picture when Joe kissed Carol at the end of the song. That was an extra special moment to be captured in pictures."

Cowboy Joe's sweet wife Carol went home to be with the Lord in January. *Until That Time* has recently been in the Top Ten on several music charts.

Cowboy Joe was blessed to share that precious moment that day on stage and many times prior with his sweet wife and family. He remembers his good friend and fellow Hee Haw alum Roy Clark. "We had Roy Clark on the show. He gave a beautiful testimony. I have known Roy a long time and he was a good man but I never heard him share his testimony before and it was so touching for him to share that day."



This precious moment was captured last year as Joe Babcock kissed his wife, Carol, after performing the song *Until That Time* for her. Carol went home to be with the Lord in January.

Melanie mentions, "Two years ago a gentleman who was an Opry staff member had taken a lady to her car. The Opry staff host asked, 'How did you enjoy the show? She said, 'it was wonderful! I met Jesus tonight! My husband passed away recently, and I know I will see Jesus and my husband again." Lynn adds, "We hear all these stories about people that got saved and were touched by something on the show. It's just fabulous!"

They shared their goals for this year and the future of Sunday Mornin' Country.® "Artists scheduled are Brenda Lee, Ray Stevens, Mandy Barnett, Lori King with special

guest Rhonda Vincent, John Berry, Cutter and Cash and Kentucky Grass, Charlie McCoy, Tennessee River Boys and many more. "Lynn states, "As for the future it is our desire to keep this going for many years."

Melanie mentions, "It's a privilege to be a part of this. My goal and prayer is that God will continue to bring younger people and the next generation to us that can continue with this tradition in the future."

Many members of Music City Christian Fellowship come from all over the United States and Canada to sing in a ninety-voice choir known as the Country Chorale under the direction of Mark Thomas. Cowboy Joe shares what inspired the choir to become a staple of Sunday Mornin' Country® "We heard the Christ Church Choir from Nashville. They were wonderful but they weren't singing the choir numbers. It was a different sound when you do Country sounding songs with the choir. I called it the Country Chorale and it has grown to 80-90 members every year."

Lynn Fox says, "The choir is the backdrop of SMC. When it all comes together it's like a wall of sound. The Country Chorale are all amazing singers and are serious about this event. It's bigger and better than ever."

Sunday Mornin' Country's past artists and performers have also included Connie Smith, The Oak Ridge Boys, Lulu Roman, Ronnie McDowell, Barbara Fairchild, T. Graham Brown, Rhonda Vincent and many others.



This year, Legend celebrates the 20th anniversary of his groundbreaking debut album with the release of a digital deluxe version of "Get Lifted (20th Anniversary)" via Legacy Recordings, the catalog division of Sony Music Entertainment. The celebratory release expands the original album with eleven bonus tracks, including eight brand-new remixes, rare B-sides, and two previously unreleased studio performances recorded during the original "Get Lifted" sessions.

The deluxe digital 3LP editions of "Get Lifted (20th Anniversary)" include the original fourteen-track album plus bonus remixes: So High [Cloud 9 Mix] featuring Lauryn Hill (as included on the "Get Lifted" digital album); Used To Love U [9th Wonder Playmates Imagining Remix] featuring Black Thought; Number One [Obi Remix]; Let's Get Lifted Again [Man-Man Remix] featuring Killer Mike and Lil Wayne; Ordinary People [Man-Man Remix] featuring Tems; Refuge (When It's Cold Outside), [Man-Man/The Imports Remix] featuring Simi; She Don't Have to Know [Man-Man Remix]; and It Don't Have to Change, [Man-Man Remix] featuring The Stephens Family.

During the official press release, Legend stated. "I'm so thrilled to be celebrating twenty years of the album that introduced me to the world," said Legend. "Get Lifted has always meant so much to me and to so many of my fans and supporters. I'm so grateful for the career that this album launched. These last twenty years have taken me far beyond my wildest dreams."

Legend continued, "Revisiting the original album and some of the unreleased songs from that era has been such a meaningful experience. Reinvigorating the music with fresh remixes and collaborations featuring some of my favorite artists makes this celebration even more special."

Recorded in a variety of studios across the U.S from 2001-2004, "Get Lifted" was originally released in the United States through GOOD Music, Sony Urban Music and Columbia Records on December 28, 2004 (Legend's 26th birthday). The album's uncanny melodic blend of R&B, Neo-Soul, Hip-Hop, cosmopolitan sophistication and sly street smarts signaled the arrival of a new major artist with deep musical roots, an affinity for Pop music and a plan for the future.

With all songs written or co-written by Legend, who also served as co-producer on much of the album, "Get Lifted" introduced him to the world as a top-tier tunesmith with a lyrical sensibility that captured the full spectrum and emotional reality of human affairs, from the raunchy to the sublime.

"Get Lifted" spawned four singles: *Used to Love U*, a moderate success peaking at #74 on the Billboard Hot 100; the Grammy-winning *Ordinary People*, Legend's breakout hit and first to crack the Billboard Top 40 (#24), the track hit #1 on the UK R&B Singles chart and #4 on the UK Singles chart; *Number One* and *So High*.

In celebration of Legend's 20th Anniversary of his debut album, he has launched the Get Lifted 20th Anniversary Tour. "I'm so excited to announce that I'm heading back on the road for the Get Lifted 20th Anniversary Tour! Join me and my band for an unforgettable performance of the entire "Get Lifted" album - the album that introduced me to the world - plus a few favorites from my career that *all of you* know and love." The tour kicked off on May 27 and runs through December 9.

A prodigious musical talent, singer/songwriter/pianist Legend had already appeared on hit records before writing and recording "Get Lifted." A sought-after behind-thescenes talent, Legend played piano on Lauryn Hill's *Everything Is Everything* and sang backup vocals for Jay-Z and Alicia Keys. The first artist to sign with Kanye West's GOOD Music, he broke into the Billboard 200 Top 10 (#4) with *Get Lifted*, which hit #1 on the Billboard Top R&B/Hip-Hop Albums chart. Legend didn't just cross over from R&B/Hip-Hop to Pop, he both bridged and defied the genres.

Legend's debut album earned eight nominations at the 48th Annual Grammy Awards, with the artist taking home three: *Ordinary People* won 'Best Male R&B Vocal Performance,' "Get Lifted" won 'Best R&B Album' and Legend was named the year's 'Best New Artist.'

"Get Lifted" entered the Billboard 200 at #7, selling 116,000 copies its first week, Legend's first Top 10 debut. The Recording Industry Association of American (RIAA) has certified "Get Lifted" as a Double Platinum Album and *Ordinary People* as a Double Platinum Single.

The *All of Me* singer has released ten albums over the course of his career; "Get Lifted" (2004), "Once Again" (2006), "Evolver" (2008), "Love in the Future" (2013), "Darkness and Light" (2016), "A Legendary Christmas Deluxe" (2019), "Bigger Love" (2020), "LEGEND" (2022), "LEGEND (Solo Piano Version)" (2023), and "My Favorite Dream" (2024).

"Get Lifted (20th Anniversary)" follows the release of "My Favorite Dream," an album of sing-alongs and lullabies for children and families, largely inspired by Legend's own experiences as a father to four children. Produced by singer-songwriter-multi-instrumentalist Sufjan Stevens, the album includes nine original tracks penned by Legend. "My Favorite Dream" was nominated for two 2025 Grammy Awards: 'Best Children's Music Album' and 'Best Arrangement,





Instrumental and Vocals' for the heartfelt track *Always Come Back*. Additionally, Legend won his thirteenth Grammy for 'Best Arrangement, Instrumental or A Cappella' for his collaboration on *Bridge Over Troubled Water* with Jacob Collier and Tori Kelly. He shared the news on his Instagram account on his way to the Grammy Awards from February 2, 2025. "OK guys, I entered today as a 12-time Grammy winner

and now I'm a 13-time Grammy winner because Jacob Collier, Tori Kelly, and I did a really beautiful arrangement of *Bridge Over Troubled Water*, one of my favorite songs, and we won for best arrangement. Thank you to the Academy. Love you."


Beyond his music career, Legend is a co-founder of Get Lifted Film Co., a production company which has developed projects with major networks including ABC, NBC, FOX, HBO, Showtime, Netflix, and FX, alongside co-founders Mike Jackson and Ty Stiklorius. Aside from film, TV and theater, Get Lifted has partnered with Zando to form Get Lifted Books, which builds upon Get Lifted Film Co.'s mission of spotlighting stories from dynamic creatives. In 2023, Legend launched Loved01, his effective and affordable unisex skincare brand formulated to treat the needs of melanin-rich skin. As an activist, Legend launched FREEAMERICA in 2015 to change the

Instrumental and Vocals' for the heartfelt track *Always Come* conversation surrounding criminal justice policies and to end *Back*. Additionally, Legend won his thirteenth Grammy for mass incarceration.

Legend has been a coach on NBC's The Voice for nine seasons, beginning on Season 16 through 22. He returned to serve as a coach on Season 24 and most recently on Season 27

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


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


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


















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CASHBOX Artist Spotlight JLIETTE BROWN

ospel singer/songwriter Juliette Brown started -writing music during her childhood. "Both my parents were singers, so singing has always been in my DNA," she mentions.



It also exceeded expectations by breaking into the #12 spot in the mainstream iTunes charts (across all genres) and the #18 spot in the UK iTunes mainstream chart. It was also the #3 best seller of all time for an iTunes Blues album pre-sale. "Death Roll Blues" enabled K.K.'s first breakthrough into the Billboard Blues Charts with a #7 position.

K.K.'s has also had some great successes with her self-produced and directed music videos. The music video for *Heart Shaped Box* won a multitude of awards including wins at the Video Nasties Genre Film Festival, the David Film Festival in Turkey, the Euro Music Video Song awards, the Anatolia Film Festival, The Golden Wheat Awards, as well as K.K. receiving an honorable mention at the London Director Awards.

K.K.'s music receives regular plays on esteemed Blues radio shows around the world including Cerys Matthew's BBC Radio 2 Blues show, Gary Grainger's award-winning Blues show, Steel Radio and Nola County.

K.K. recently joined forces with fellow Blues musicians Ian Davidson on cello and Kaspar 'Berry' Rapkin on slide guitar to create an epic and exciting, foot stomping, dark and broody ballad, *Walk With Me Through the Fire*. The result is an eclectic piece

K.K.'s has also had some great successes with her with elements of traditional Blues, Country and Western, produced and directed music videos. The music video Folk, Southern Gothic and contemporary Blues Rock music.

With Spaghetti Western films and the music of Ennio Morricone being a huge inspiration to K.K., Trumpeter Lewis Taylor was invited to play some mariachi style licks on the track. The music video written by and starring K.K., Kaspar and Ian pays strong homage to the Spaghetti Western genre whilst also harnessing K.K.'s signature gothic horror accents.

eCe Winans has long since cemented her status as one of the most accomplished and celebrated women in music history. Winans has sold over 19 million records, making her one of the best-selling Gospel music artists. Accolades include 15 Grammy Awards, 27 Dove Awards, and 16 Stellar Awards. All these accomplishments are a blessing but more than this is sharing the music and the love of God to the multitudes.

CeCe was born in Detroit, Michigan, to Delores and David Winans of the famed Winans Family Gospel group. For CeCe, nothing on the planet compares to her love of family. As one of ten siblings, CeCe has always been part of a large, musically-talented family. Her parents and siblings have released music under a wide variety of artist names including Mom and Pop Winans (CeCe's parents), The Winans (four of CeCe's Brothers), and BeBe & CeCe (a duet with her brother Benjamin). In an interview with Christian Voice Magazine CeCe shares, "My parents made an amazing impact oh my life and music. They not only taught us the Word but lived it in front of us. I saw how God worked in their lives. It played a very important part in my life."

"I enjoyed singing but never wanted to do it out front. Then my family started giving me solos," she admits. would sing here and there, but never pursued it like, 'oh this is my dream.' It wasn't until I was sixteen or seventeen that I realized I was anointed to do this. I still didn't know where it would lead me but I began to seek God for His perfect will in my life and He began to open doors.

CeCe first rose to prominence in the 1980s as a member of the double platinum selling Gospel duo BeBe & CeCe Winans with her brother, BeBe, before launching her own highly acclaimed solo career. Billboard magazine lists all of her solo albums as top Gospel, Christian, and R&B music sellers, and six albums as a duo with her brother Bebe. It would be easy to look back and rest on such illustrious honors, but Winans has always had her eyes fixed firmly on the future and is constantly evolving. The Michigan native mentions, "I am just an example if you give God what you have, it's amazing what he'll do with it."

CeCe continued to share her musical gift with the world closing out 2024 with the nearly sold-out Christmas tour, stage with on American Idol. Her new Christmas album titled, LLC. and recorded live at Rocketown in Nashville,

in return we give Him all He deserves," says Winans.



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Artist Spotlight RICK LANG



ery few writers have enjoyed as many cuts, hits, and joy than Stratham, New Hampshire 's Rick Lang. Rick has enjoyed some simply incredible accomplishments over the last three and a half decades. The New Hampshire native has been Grammy nominated, won numerous awards, and had well over two hundred of his songs recorded. Almost thirty of Rick's songs have hit #1 on the charts. His songs have been recorded by a virtual "Who's Who" in Bluegrass. These performances include Dave Adkins, Kristi Cox, Stephen and Jana Mougin, Daryl Mosley, Jerry Salley, Williamson Branch, The Grascals, Blue Highway, Rick Faris, Nick Dumas, and Wilson Banjo Co.

That's the short list. There are dozens more.

Some of the most exciting projects of Rick Lang's include his concept albums. According to a recent article, "Blue Collar Gospel" is Rick's 3rd multi-artist Gospel recording project. It was released in 2024 on Billy Blue Records. The album features eleven original Gospel songs, co-written by Rick with some of the top songwriters in Bluegrass. It was produced by his dear friend, and several times co-writer Jerry Salley, Some of the artists include Jerry Salley, The Oak Ridge Boys, Becky Buller, Nathan Woodard, Dave Adkins, Barry Abernathy, John Meador, Tim Raybon, Bradley Walker, Daryl Mosley, Jaelee Roberts, Danny Paisley, Ben James, Darin & Brooke Aldridge, Williamson Branch, Donna Ulisse, Alan Bibey, Magnolia Williams and Alecia Nugent.

The album's first single, *Just Beyond* reached #1 on three of the top radio airplay charts and was nominated for IBMA 'Gospel Recorded Event Of The Year' in 2024. It deserves mentioning, Rick's Gospel album "Gonna Sing, Gonna Shout" on Billy Blue Records made a tremendous impact on Bluegrass Gospel. The title track was awarded an IBMA 'Gospel Recording Of The Year' and the album received a Grammy Award nomination for 'Best Roots Gospel Album.' Two of the songs from "Gonna Sing, Gonna Shout," *Heavens Back Yard* and *Don't Tune Him Out* reached #1 on the Singing News Bluegrass Gospel Charts. At the time, radio programmer Buddy Michaels said, "Rick Lang has done it again! The master of the co-write with a knack for getting the most out of every line; and everyone involved too!"



With all this said, the most impressive traits I've personally noticed about Rick Lang would be his sincere faith in God and his kind-hearted humility. Plus, he's a natural dry humorist. He worked hard and conscientiously made a good living in the lumber business for many, many years. He married a good woman, Wendy. They raised two wonderful daughters who gave them three beautiful granddaughters.

All that time, Rick held a passion for music. He got his first, and only set of drums when he was a child. Soon, it was very obvious to himself, his family, the neighbors, and their pets that the Lord didn't mean for him to be a drummer. That didn't discourage him, or his good parents. Not long after, he received a Sears Roebuck guitar. Then, he was off to the races. He fell in love with the popular artists of that day - Roy Orbison. The Everly Brothers. The Kingston Trio. That's how it all started.

Before long, he discovered the simple, moving grace of Southern Gospel and Bluegrass. When he was in his forties, he gave his writing career more serious and disciplined effort. He discovered it was like most artistic endeavors. Everything doesn't come all at once. He loved the process. He stuck with it. In doing so, he gained a surprising benefit. The more he wrote sincere Bluegrass Gospel lyrics, the deeper, and more powerful his faith grew. Rick says, "I can't help but feel I was meant to write Gospel music, that it is my calling. I've been blessed by doing so." And so have we by his music, and by his attitude and example.

A Life Rewritten **Through Music and** Redemption

Music has the power to heal, to transform, and to give a second chance. Few artists embody that truth as deeply as Jason Ray Welsh. A retired Army combat veteran, Jason's life has been a testament to resilience, redemption, and the undeniable influence of music. From the battlefields of Iraq to the dark depths of addiction, and finally to the bright stage lights of award-winning performances, his journey is nothing short of remarkable.

ason is not just another Country music artist; his songs are a lifeline, a testimony to survival and second chances. Through his heartfelt lyrics, raw emotions, and powerful melodies, he delivers a message of hope to those who are struggling. Whether it's addiction, mental health battles, or feeling lost in life, Jason's music resonates with anyone who has ever fought their own demons.

A Soldier's Journey: From War to Struggle

Born with music in his blood, Jason grew up traveling across the country with his family's Gospel band, Heaven Bound Express. He spent his childhood singing and performing, learning firsthand the power of music to bring people together and uplift the soul. But life had a different path in store for him.

course of his life. Like many veterans, he found himself on prescribed pain medication to cope with the physical wounds of war. However, when the prescriptions no longer worked, he sought relief elsewhere, turning to IV drugs and alcohol as an escape from the pain both physical and emotional.

For the next ten years, Jason battled addiction, falling into a downward spiral. The vibrant, passionate musician he once was had been replaced by a man struggling to find his way

"It got to the point where I didn't recognize myself anymore. I had lost everything: my health, my relationships, my sense of purpose", Jason recalls.

The Turning Point: Music as a Lifeline

Every rock bottom has a turning point. For Jason, that In 2008, while serving in Iraq during Operation Iraqi moment came on April 2, 2018, when he made the life-Freedom, Jason sustained injuries that would change the changing decision to enter recovery. He knew that if he didn't

fight for his life, he would lose everything for good. And in his fight to reclaim himself, he found an old friend waiting for him - his guitar.

Picking up his guitar again, he began writing and performing, using his songs as a vehicle for healing and hope. The emotions he had bottled up for years poured into his lyrics, and he soon realized that his music could be more than just a personal outlet; it could be a way to reach others who were going through the same struggles.

His influences are as vast as they are profound, spanning Country, Bluegrass, Gospel, and Rock 'n' Roll. From Hank Williams Sr. to Waylon Jennings, from the Beatles to Lynyrd Skynyrd, and from the Gaithers to the Hinsons, his music reflects a deep appreciation for storytelling and raw emotion.

A Family Legacy: Honoring His Roots

Jason's passion for music started at home. Traveling with his family's band, he learned not just the technical aspects of music but also the heart and soul behind it. Gospel music taught him the value of storytelling through song, a skill that would later define his own music career.

One of the most unforgettable moments in his career was recording I Heard You Crying alongside his mother, Brenda Turner. The song, written by his mother, holds deep personal meaning, and having her in the studio with him was a full-circle moment. "Having my mom in the studio with me, singing background vocals on her own song; it was beyond special," Jason shares.

The Challenges of Sobriety in the Music Industry

For a recovering addict, the music industry can be a tough place. Bars, concerts, and backstage parties often involve heavy drinking, and sometimes even drugs. But Jason remains steadfast in his commitment to sobriety, reminding himself of why he's here in the first place.

"It's rough sometimes," he admits. "But I remind myself why I'm here. I'm not just singing songs, I'm telling my story. And if my music can help even one person realize they're not alone, then it's all worth it."

Award-Winning Music with a Message

Jason's raw, heartfelt songwriting has earned him More Than Music - A Movement significant recognition in the music industry. His singles *Lies* the Year' in 2019 and 2020, and his album "Write The Wrongs" was crowned 'Album of the Year' in 2021 by the International Singer-Songwriters Association (ISSA).

In 2021, he was named 'Male Artist of the Year' by the Carolina Country Music Association. His accolades span multiple prestigious platforms, including the World Songwriters Awards, the USA Songwriters Competition, the of addiction to standing on award-winning stages, Jason Ray InterContinental Music Awards, and more.

Most recently, at the 2024 ISSA Awards in Atlanta, Jason won 'Single of the Year' for Life Sentence, a song deeply personal to him. "Life Sentence is about cleaning up my past

drug addiction, homelessness, and criminal behavior," Jason explains.

The track was recorded at Tune Designer Recording Studios in Covington, Georgia, and recorded by Beverly Gosdin Jenkins, widow of the legendary Vern Gosdin, fittingly known as 'The Voice' of Country music.

A New Chapter: "Battle Born"

Beyond his personal story, Jason also finds inspiration in the struggles and triumphs of others. His latest song, Battle Born, is based on the book trilogy The Shield-Maidens: Warriors Through Time by Jennifer Laughlin Stevenson.

Jason's mission as an artist is clear: "to remain authentic, to speak truth through my music, and to reject the cookiecutter expectations of the mainstream music industry".

"There will always be those who rebel against the way things are done," he says. "And I'm proud to be one of them."



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
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NOTHING MORE PARTNERS WITH K9S FOR WARRIORS

Tothing More is one of Rock's most electrifying bands. They blend a full-on assault with soaring melodies and unique soundscapes in songs that unflinchingly embrace raw emotion. The boundary-pushing 3x-Grammy-nominated outfit - Jonny Hawkins (vocals), Mark Vollelunga (guitar), Daniel Oliver (bass), and Ben Anderson (drums),released the deluxe edition of their acclaimed 2024 album "Carnal" across all digital outlets via Better Noise Music. CD and vinyl - due out May 16.

"Carnal" has seen the band achieve two #1 Active Rock radio singles – *Angel Song* (featuring David Draiman) and *If It Doesn't Hurt* - and has, to date, amassed 100 million streams. Nothing More teamed up with director Stephen Wayne Mallet (who did the same honors for the band's *Fade In, Fade Out* video, from 2017's "The Stories We Tell Ourselves" album, which has over 10M views).

"We wrote an anthem for the people who find themselves in an uncertain and chaotic phase of their life," explains singer Jonny Hawkins about *Freefall*. "Every single one of us have had, or will have, experiences where it feels like the rug is pulled from under us... an end to a relationship, a job loss, or the death of a close family member. These times can be filled with anxiety, or they can be filled with spiritual euphoria as we accept our transformation. We've always believed that our losses are invitations to ascend to a higher level of reality, and this song is our way of encapsulating that realization.

Chris Daughtry elevated that feeling with his soaring and pristine vocals. We are so honored to have him on one of the best songs we've ever written."

The video - filmed in Clifton, Tennessee - features the town's fire chief and sheriff, who also served as technical advisors on the subject matter. In casting for this narrativedriven video, the band prioritized collaborating with individuals who understand the unique challenges faced by firefighters and first responders. To ensure even more authenticity, they enlisted real-life heroes as technical advisors. Additionally, director/actor Michael Lombardi was asked by the band to star in the video because of his personal experience and affiliation with firefighters. Lombardi is well-known for his role as a series regular in the acclaimed FX series "Rescue Me," which aired for 100 episodes and received multiple Golden Globe and Emmy nominations and wins and delved into the lives of firefighters grappling with real-life issues, including the aftermath of 9/11 trauma and personal struggles.

Born and raised in Edinburg, Texas, Mike McCarrell discovered his love for music at an early age. His passion for singing and songwriting led him to perform wherever he could, refining his craft with each opportunity. Starting in middle school choir, he learned to read music, which became the foundation of his musical journey. However, his path to professional success was anything but conventional.

After high school, McCarrell took a detour from music to serve in the Marine Corps. It was during his time in the military that he picked up the guitar, which reignited his passion for songwriting. Stationed on the East Coast, he joined The Super Grit Cowboy Band, where he played alongside talented musicians. One of the most influential figures in his journey was Clyde Mattocks, the bandleader, who would later play a crucial role in McCarrell's breakthrough in the Country music scene.

Returning to Texas in 1990 after serving eight years in the military, McCarrell received an unexpected call from legendary Country artist Vern Gosdin. Initially, he dismissed it as a prank and hung up, only to have Gosdin call back and explain that Clyde Mattocks had recommended him.

"The next morning, I caught a plane to Nashville, auditioned, and got the gig. That was about the time Vern's hit song *Chiseled in Stone* had won 'Song of the Year,' so we hit the road immediately, and I never looked back," McCarrell recalls.

Life on the road had its challenges, including long periods away from family and exhausting schedules, but the rewards far outweighed the difficulties. Traveling alongside national artists opened doors to new opportunities and lifelong friendships. Throughout his career, McCarrell has had the privilege of working with Beverly Gosdin Jenkins, whom he considers a dedicated advocate for real Country music. "It's an honor to be a member of her A-team," he says. "She really cares about real Country music."




"Never stop just because it seems like you're at a dead end or facing a roadblock. Don't listen to others more than you listen to yourself. Go for it, you only live one life!"

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










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
