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After almost fifty years in the music business, Tina Turner, now 81, has become one of the most successful international female Rock stars to date. Her sultry, powerful voice and her unforgettable story all contribute to her legendary status.

Simply the Best!

Tina Turner was born Anna Mae Bullock in Nutbush, Tennessee. Her parents, who split up, left Turner and her sister to be raised by their grandmother. When her grandmother died in the early 1950s, Turner moved in with her mother in St. Louis, Missouri.

Barely in her teens, Turner found herself in St. Louis's R&B scene. She met Rock-and-Roll pioneer Ike Turner in 1956, who often played at the club with the Kings of Rhythm. Soon, Turner was performing with the group, and she quickly became the highlight of their show.

In 1960, Turner sang the lead on a track titled *A Fool in Love*. The record released under the moniker "Ike and Tina Turner." The song became a huge R&B success and soon crossed over to the Pop charts. Before long, the group was touring as the Ike and Tina Turner Revue and earning rave reviews for their performances. The group also capitalized on the success by releasing a string of successful follow-up singles.

With their popularity growing, Ike and Tina were married in 1962. Two years later their son, Ronnie, was born. They had four sons together.

In 1969, they toured with the Rolling Stones. Their popularity grew in 1971 with the release of the album "Workin' Together," which featured a renowned slow-to-fast remake of the Creedence Clearwater Revival track *Proud Mary* that reached the top five of the U.S. charts and won them their first Grammy. *Proud Mary* became a cornerstone of the couple's shows, with Tina's vocal delivery along with the swirling, hand-rolling dance moves from accompanying vocalists, the Ikettes. They had a top five hit with 1973's *Nutbush City Limits*, a Rock-Country-Soul jam penned by Tina herself with autobiographical elements.

Despite their success as a musical duo, Tina and Ike's marriage was in shambles. Tina would later reveal that Ike was often physically abusive. By the mid-1970s, the couple separated both personally and professionally. In 1978, they were officially divorced.

In the years following her divorce, Tina's solo career got off to a slow start. She continued to perform in lower-profile venues and made guest appearances on other artist's records. In 1983, Turner recorded a remake of Al Green's *Let's Stay Together*. Turner took her remake to the top five on the domestic R&B charts and the top ten U.K. Pop.

The following year, she exploded back into the record industry when her much-anticipated solo album, "Private Dancer" was released to overwhelming and popular success. It went on to win four Grammy Awards and eventually sold more than twenty million copies worldwide.

The album "Private Dancer" included mega hit singles, What's Love Got to Do With It reaching number one on the U.S. Pop charts and earning a Grammy for 'Record of the Year.' The smooth-jazz title track Private Dancer and Better Be Good to Me both reached the top ten as well. Turner in her mid-40s was known for her energetic show and raspy singing technique along with her signature look performing in short skirts and voluminous, punk styled hair.

One year later, she published her autobiography, "I, Tina," which would later be adapted as the 1993 film "What's Love Got to Do with It," starring Angela Bassett as Tina and Laurence Fishburne as Ike. Turner's soundtrack for the film, in which she redid classic tracks and offered up the new top ten hit *I Don't Wanna Fight*, would go double platinum. Tina followed up with her successful second solo album, "Break Every Rule." "Tina: Live in Europe" followed in 1988 and won the Grammy for 'Female Rock Vocal Performance,' and "Foreign Affair," which included the top twenty hit single *The Best*, outdid "Private Dancer" in worldwide sales.

The following decade, Turner released albums "Wildest Dreams," featuring her cover of John Waite's *Missing You*, and *Twenty-Four Seven*. She also made several recordings for film soundtracks, including the James Bond title song *Goldeneye*, a U.K. top ten hit, and *He Lives in You* for The Lion King 2.

In 1991, Ike and Tina Turner were inducted into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame. Ike was unable to attend the ceremony. (He eventually died in 2007.)

In 2008, the iconic entertainer embarked on her "Tina! 50th Anniversary Tour," which became one of the highest-selling ticketed shows of 2008 and 2009. She announced that it would be her final tour, and essentially retired from the music business save for occasional appearances and recordings.

In 2013, Turner, at the age of 73, was engaged to marry her longtime partner, German record executive Erwin Bach. In July 2013, they were married in Zurich, Switzerland, only months after Turner had gained her Swiss citizenship.

Turner became a Buddhist, from which she found peace in the rituals of chanting. Turner released "Beyond: Buddhist and Christian Prayers" in 2010, as well as follow-up albums "Children Beyond" (2011) and "Love Within" (2014).

Returning to the spotlight in 2018, Turner was honored with a Grammy Lifetime Achievement Award (alongside other industry legends like Neil Diamond and Emmylou Harris) to open the year. A few months later, fans were treated to a showcase of her greatest hits with the opening of "TINA: The Tina Turner Musical" at the Aldwych Theatre in London. In October 2018, the music legend published another memoir, "My Love Story."

She came out of retirement in July 2020 to collaborate with Norwegian producer Kygo on a remix of *What's Love Got to Do With It*. With this release, she became the first artist to have a top forty hit in seven consecutive decades in the UK.

Turner's third book, "Happiness Becomes You: A Guide to Changing Your Life for Good," was released in December 2020. She co-wrote the book with American author Taro Gold and Swiss singer Regula Curti. The book details how she transformed her life and offers readers guidance on overcoming difficulties to live with joy.

Whether opening for Vince Gill, Ricky Skaggs, Sammy Kershaw, Connie Smith, Rhonda Vincent or playing The Ryman Auditorium, The Old Dominion Barn Dance, Bill Gaither's Fall Homecoming, The Von Braun Center, or Dollywood, the music ride is just beginning for this family.

Williamson Branch signed with Pinecastle Records in 2017. Since that time, they have grown a Facebook following of 350,000 plus, with videos boasting over a million views, including *I'll Fly Away* and *Palm Sunday*. Kevin explains the blessing of social media for this moment in time, "We have

turned to Facebook live videos, not as a career move, but because we knew our fans would need encouragement. The outpouring of love and support that we have received has been nothing short of miraculous. People often message us to say that we have impacted their lives, as they share their concerns. This amazing trust has presented the opportunity to speak into many lives, on a very personal level, to those facing health issues and isolation."

Struggling to figure out life amidst quarantine and the absence of touring and personal appearances is wearisome to even the most seasoned of artists. Where Are They Now?

A Retrospective Glimpse at Yesterday's Rising Music Stars Who Became Icons and Where They Are Today

Air Supply

Graham Russell and Russell Hitchcock met on May 12, 1975, during rehearsals for the Australian production of "Jesus Christ Superstar" in Sydney. They became instant friends who shared much in common, including their love of The Beatles whom they'd both seen in 1964 in England and Australia.

After the evening performance of "Jesus Christ Superstar" they would play anywhere they could to hone their

vocal skills and harmonies. Graham wrote constantly and they recorded a few songs on cassette, one of which was *Love and Other Bruises*. After much rejection, Russell and Hitchcock signed a record deal with CBS Records.

Their album was recorded in a week and *Love and Other Bruises* was released as the first single and immediately shot to the top of the charts. The name of the group came from a dream Graham had. He saw a billboard with flashing lights all around it and the words "AIR SUPPLY" in the center.

"Jesus Christ Superstar" ended in October 1976 and after only a couple of months, they were invited to open for Rod Stewart in Australia and Rod's North American tour in 1977 in the biggest venues, including Madison Square Garden in New York and The "Fabulous" Forum in Los Angeles.

Graham wrote several songs, including *Lost in Love* and *All Out of Love. Lost in Love* was released in Australia in 1978 and again soared to the top of the charts. It found its way to Clive Davis, founder and president of Arista Records, who immediately offered Air Supply a record deal. The song was released in 1980 and became the fastest selling in the world, topping the charts in a multitude of countries. *All Out of Love* was the second single released and topped the worldwide charts once again.

With seven consecutive top five singles, the albums "Lost in Love," "The One That You Love," "Now and Forever" and "The Greatest Hits" sold in excess of 20 million copies. *Lost in Love* was named 'Song of the Year' in 1980 and, along with the other singles, sold more than 10 million copies.

The trademark sound of Russell Hitchcock's soaring tenor voice and Graham Russell's simple but majestic compositions created a unique sound that would be forever



known as Air Supply. The live shows always held audiences captive around the world. In 1983, they recorded *Making Love Out of Nothing At All*, which solidified the group as a permanent force in modern music. The song was included on the "Greatest Hits" album, which sold 7 million copies in the United States alone. *Lost in Love*, *All Out of Love, The One That You Love*, *Sweet Dreams*, and *Making Love Out of Nothing at All* each achieved multiradio

million plays on the radio.

Air Supply toured with lavish production in places very few acts had performed. In 1988 they were invited to participate in Australia's Bi-Centennial celebrations and perform for HRH Prince Charles and HRH Princess Diana, who they learned were ardent fans. This engagement would be one of the most treasured in their career.

In July 2005, their live DVD "It Was Thirty Years Ago Today" celebrated 30 years of recording and touring and in the same month smashed attendance records by performing in Havana, Cuba, to 175,000 fans. 2005 also saw the release of "The Singer and The Song," an acoustic album of their hits featuring Graham on acoustic guitar and just their two voices. It received much critical acclaim.

After a five-year break from recording but still touring constantly, they released "The Mumbo Jumbo." Recorded in Graham's studio in Utah and in Las Vegas, the album was produced by Graham and engineered by Sean O'Dwyer, whose credits included Pink Floyd, Randy Newman and Blink-182. The first single released, *Dance With Me*, earned a prominent feature article in Billboard Magazine titled "Still Supplying The Hits After 35 Years." Just weeks after, the composer and vocalist were honored with a BMI Million-Air Certificate recognizing over 3 million plays of *All Out Of Love*.

The band then released "Live in Jerusalem" on DVD with two new songs, *Sanctuary* and *Everywhere*. Their latest release, "The Lost In Love Experience" recorded with the Prague Symphony, features the fan-favorite *I Adore You* along with beautiful instrumental versions of some of Graham and Russell's favorite compositions.




In January 2020, Australian newspaper, the Herald Sun, proclaimed Air Supply in the top five of "Greatest Aussie Bands" of all time in the company of AC/DC, The Bee Gees and INXS.

In this 45th anniversary year, the duo continues to tour the world, having performed in England, Ireland, Israel, the Philippines, Korea, Taiwan, Japan, Canada and many other countries, of course including their home, the United States.

A true testament to the respect, passion and love fans have for Air Supply and the deep friendship they share with delighted fans both new and old, the journey continues.

Sylvia

Sylvia became one of the most celebrated women in Country music in the 1980s. She released five albums with a dozen #1 and top including, ten hits Nobody, Snapshot, Drifter, Fallin' In Love, and Like Nothing Ever Happened. Sylvia has sold over four million

records and won multiple awards including the Academy of Country Music's 'Female Vocalist of the Year' and Billboard's '#1 Country Female Artist.'

In the 1990s, Sylvia began sharing new facets of her voice and perspective as an artist through her work on her own record label, Red Pony Records. She released the critically acclaimed "It's All in the Family" in 2016. This was her most personal album to date and the first ever on which she is a co-writer on the majority of songs.

Sylvia's talents and interests also extend beyond music; she has worked as a certified life and career coach to executives and artists of all genres and sat on the board of a non-profit organization that serves and supports people who have mental illness and substance use disorders. Yet she has never stopped singing. Even while on hiatus from performing, she kept a weekly appointment with her voice teacher and continued to hone her craft as a vocalist.

Sylvia is quick to point out that her path hasn't been a straight one, but she likes it that way. What is most important to Sylvia is continuous growth - personal, professional, and artistic - and gratitude for the choices, challenges, and turns in the road that have brought her to where she stands today. Sylvia's unique ability to honor the past while standing firmly in the present is what makes her new release, "Second Bloom - The Hits Re-Imagined," so striking. On this album, she re-imagines some of her greatest hits, using the life experiences and skills she's gained as a musician over the last three decades to imbue them with new life and let them bloom again. Sylvia's not trying to relive the past, but neither is she running from it. The album functions as a kind of bridge from her early career to the present, and she makes navigating the bridge look effortless.




While Sylvia's iconic music is of a certain era and genre, she notes that the songs themselves are not bound to a specific time and place. The creative process of making "Second Bloom" involved listening deeply to what each song had to say at its core and translating that message into a more contemporary musical dialect, while keeping her signature licks fans have come to recognize.

Sylvia shared with her listeners about her latest release, "In recording this album, I wanted to bring my music from the 1980s into alignment with the music I am creating today. As my voice teacher Gerald Arthur says, "Everything in your life is in your voice. It's all there!" Well, I have lived a lot of life in those intervening years. I fell in love with these songs all over again. Whether you are familiar with the originals or hearing them for the first time, I hope you enjoy the spirit of the music as I feel is just as relevant today as it was when it first bloomed."

On "Second Bloom," listeners will hear in Sylvia's voice genuine reverence and affection for each song as part of her artistic lineage. The result is an album that will remind fans why they first fell in love with Sylvia's music while allowing them to experience it anew.

Stevie Wonder Legendary Motown Artist, American Icon, and Musical Genius

Dubbed "Little Stevie Wonder" by Motown's Berry Gordy, he was signed to the label when he was only twelve years old and was just thirteen when the live recording *Fingertips (Part 2)* hit number one in Pop and R&B. Playing harmonica, drums and keyboards, as well as singing, the boy who had been blind from infancy proved aptly named. While still a teenager - dropping the "Little" from his stage name - he earned seven top ten Pop singles including *For Once In My Life, My Cherie Amour, Yester-Me, Yester-You, Yesterday, Uptight (Everything's Alright)* and *I Was Made To Love Her.*

By age twenty, he was self-sufficient in the studio, writing, playing every instrument and serving as his own producer, including for such hits as *Signed, Sealed, Delivered I'm Yours* and *If You Really Love Me*. He broadened his vision from pure Pop to the socially conscious. He began exploring exotic musical ideas incorporating Gospel, Rock, Jazz, Reggae, and African and Latin American rhythms, and pioneered the use of synthesizers.

Turning twenty-one in 1971, Stevie released the groundbreaking album, "Music Of My Mind." Later that year came "Talking Book," which boasted the number one Pop and R&B hits *Superstition* and *You Are The Sunshine of My Life.* "Innervisions," featuring the top ten hit, *Higher Ground, Don't You Worry 'Bout A Thing* and the epic *Living For The City*, was a landmark LP that became his first of three consecutive Grammy® Albums of the Year.

While the record was riding high, Wonder was in a *Called To Say I Love You*; was spotlighted in near-fatal accident. He recovered to record another deeply felt album, "Fulfillingness' First Finale," in 1974, that featured the number one Pop hit, *You Haven't Done Nothin'* became the first single to simultaneously top to the first solution on R&B Boogie On Reggae Woman.

"Songs In the Key of Life" was an instant number one album, the first by an American artist to debut at the top spot, where it remained for an incredible fourteen weeks. It was highlighted by the number one Pop and R&B hits, *I Wish* and *Sir Duke*. By the late seventies, Wonder was also leading the way in New Age instrumental music with the soundtrack album, "Journey Through The Secret Life of Plants," which featured the ballad hit *Send One Your Love*. He won fifteen Grammys in just four years.

Wonder kicked off the eighties with his funk classic *Master Blaster (Jammin')*, a tribute to Bob Marley, and *Happy Birthday*, the theme song for the successful campaign to establish the birthday of civil rights leader Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. as a national holiday. Both were included on the album, "Hotter Than July." Balancing public causes and private emotion, he scored with the number one R&B *That Girl* in 1982. A champion of racial harmony, he joined Paul McCartney on the number one Pop *Ebony And Ivory* later that year.

Wonder contributed songs to the Gene Wilder film, "The Woman In Red" in 1984, when the theme song, *I Just Called To Say I Love You*, hit number one in Pop, R&B and Adult Contemporary. It also became Wonder's first number one in the U.K. With Elton John and Gladys Knight, he also appeared on Dionne Warwick's 1985 number one Pop hit, *That's What Friends Are For*, which benefited AIDS research. That same year, he won the Oscar® for 'Best Song' for *I Just Called To Say I Love You*; was spotlighted in *We Are The World*, the landmark charity effort for African famine relief; and *Part-Time Lover*, from the album "In Square Circle" became the first single to simultaneously top the Pop, R&B, Adult Contemporary and Dance/Disco charts. collaborations with artists as diverse as Prince and Sting, Babyface and Busta Rhymes, Snoop Dogg and Andrea Bocelli, and Tony Bennett, and projects as varied as the Immortals - The Greatest Artists Of All Time," Elton John Broadway musical "Rent" and Spike Lee's film, "Jungle Fever."

Wonder was inducted into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame in 1989. As of mid-2008, Wonder had earned 25 solo top ten Pop hits, among them seven number ones, and won 22 Grammy Awards - plus a prestigious Lifetime Achievement Grammy in 1996. His 2005 Motown album "A Time 2 Love" garnered six Grammy nominations and won two, including one for So Amazing, Wonder's duet with Beyonce.

In 2014, Wonder received the Presidential Medal of Freedom from President Barack Obama. The following year a pantheon of performers paid tribute to Stevie Wonder in the televised "Songs in the

Probably somewhere around middle school (but it could've been earlier than that) I decided to turn the tables on them. I would get on to the skinny people so tough that everyone would be laughing."

It was in those moments he learned that humor could be redirected, and he knew he wanted to make people laugh for the rest of his life. "Comedy was like medicine, and a way for me to hide. That was the way I got friends. I thought that was the only way people would like me (if I made them laugh). This followed me into adulthood."

But when one comedian can make another seasoned comedian belly laugh - he has accomplished a nearly impossible task! A short while back, Steve and his family were contestants on TV's popular game show, Family Feud, where veteran comedian Steve Harvey is the host. Steven recalls this memorable experience. "It was amazing! It was a long process with multiple auditions and a long waiting process, but oh was it worth the wait! The staff was incredibly hospitable and treated us with celebrity style, including our accommodations.

rowing up, Steven says he endured the ridicule When the show finally started, we were all extremely excited and nervous when Steve Harvey came out. When Steve first approached our family and asked a question about Ellisville, Mississippi, I just spoke, being completely myself, like I always do. It was cool to have him laughing, but it was unbelievably amazing to be complimented like he did! Steve Harvey told me that I had a gift and that I needed to launch a YouTube channel. It was really a special moment."

PAYING TRIBUTE TO A TRAILBLAZER

ffectionately known as "The Pride of Country," Country music legend Charlie Pride passed away December 12, 2020, in Dallas, Texas. At 86 years old, he died of complications from Covid-19.

Becoming a trailblazing Country music superstar was an improbable destiny for Charley Pride, considering his humble beginnings as a sharecropper's son on a cotton farm in Sledge, Mississippi. After a brief time serving in the Army and some attempts at becoming a professional baseball player, Pride headed to Nashville in the 1960s and started a career that would last over 50 years.

A three-time GRAMMY® award and Recording Academy 'Lifetime Achievement Award' winner, Pride has garnered no less than 36 chart-topping Country hits, including *Kiss An Angel Good Morning*, a massive #1 crossover hit that sold over a million singles. Many of Pride's hits included *Just Between You And Me*, *Is Anybody Goin' To San Antone*, *Burgers and Fries, Mountain of Love, Someone Loves You Honey.* and many more fan favorites. Pride performed concerts worldwide and toured the United States, Canada, Ireland, the United Kingdom, Australia, and New Zealand over the last several years.

first black man to host the Country Music Association Awards. He also received a Grammy 'Lifetime Achievement Award' by the Recording Academy in 2017. The Nashville Association of Talent Directors banquet also saluted him that year, presenting him with the NATD's Career Achievement honor. Last year, Pride was honored with the PBS American Masters bio-documentary, "Charley Pride: I'm Just Me," narrated by Tanya Tucker. Pride received the 'Crossroads Of American Music' Award At the 2019 GRAMMY Museum® Mississippi Gala in November of 2019. The Grand Ole Opry Member became the first black artist to be inducted into the Country Music Hall of Fame.

The CMA's 'Willie Nelson Lifetime Achievement Award' was presented to him by current black Country hit maker Jimmie Allen during the 2020 CMA telecast on November 11, 2020. This was Pride's last public performance at the CMA Awards where he sang *Kiss An Angel Good Morning* with Jimmie Allen after accepting the CMA 'Lifetime Achievement Award.'

Upon hearing the news of his death, Jimmie Allen paid tribute to Pride. "Sometimes we will never understand why certain things happen. Through the pain we fight to hold onto the memories that were made. Do I always agree with things God allows to take place? No, but I trust through the pain of loss that He has a plan of healing and unity." fans to become Country music's first black superstar. He went has passed on. The Country Music Hall of Fame released this statement regarding Pride's death: "Rest In peace, Charley Frank Pride, 1934-2020. In the 1960s, he became Country music's first black superstar, with songs that captivated audiences, broke racial and cultural barriers, and led him to a place in the Country Music Hall of Fame."

The Grand Ole Opry also stated: "Thank you, Charley, for your contributions to our Opry family. You'll forever have a place in our hearts and our home!"

One of the most heartwarming tributes came from Neal McCoy. "I lost one of my best friends today. Charley has been kissing the same angel good morning for 64 years. Now he gets to kiss a heavenly angel this morning. Charley and Rozene were like parents to me and my wife for forty years. My son said it best. Thanks Charley for giving my dad the chance to become what he is today."

Country singer Ronnie Milsap remembered Pride in a statement to Variety. "Charley Pride, a pioneer, a music man,

Charley's smooth baritone voice won over millions of a baseball player, a good friend and the love of Rozene's life, of my heart."

> Marty Stuart shared, "I was so proud to call Mr. Pride my friend. He was, and will forever be one of the grandest of all my Country music heroes. I'll tell you the first time I heard his voice. I was standing in the living room in front of our console stereo. There was a Country music DJ that played a Charley Pride song called All I Have to Offer You Is Me. When the record was over, the DJ came back on the air, and



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Keyboardist Patrick Bradley

is set to start the New Year with a hope-filled exhalation

Like most things during 2020, the concept of contemporary jazz keyboardist **Patrick Bradley's** fifth album slated for release on January 15 took a dramatic turn when the pandemic hit and racial strife erupted. Although ideas for the eleven-song set were already sketched out, when he and producer

Darren Rahn wrote the uplifting title track, "**Exhale**," which drops as a single on January 4 on the **Patrick's Song Factory** label, the composition seemed to encapsulate exactly what Bradley was feeling and believes that we are all in need of: expel the fear, worry and division gripping the nation and inhale unifying hope and peace.

Bradley recorded "Exhale" during quarantine without ever being in the studio with Rahn, who produced nine tracks for the project, or **GRAMMY** winner **Jeff Lorber**, who produced a pair of tunes. After recording three albums produced entirely by Lorber, Bradley felt the need for change as he enters the next phase in his recording career. Both Lorber and a friend, sax sensation **Dave Koz**, recommended Rahn.

The "Exhale" album is a contemporary jazz amalgam constructed of jazz fusion, rock, R&B, blues, funk and pop. The musicianship throughout is top shelf. With Bradley playing piano, organ, keyboards and synths, he was accompanied by Rahn (saxophone, keyboards, synths & and programming), Lorber (keyboards, synth bass & guitar), guitarist Michael Thompson, horn player and arranger David Mann, bassist Mel Brown, percussionist Christian Teele, and drummers Tarell Martin, Gary Novak and Dave Weckl. Rahn, chart-topping trumpeter Rick Braun and guitarist Allen Hinds are featured as soloists. Bradley hopes that listeners will discover "Exhale" and be receptive to feeling and receiving his musical messages as we put 2020 behind us and start fresh.







Bob Dylan Sells Entire Song Catalog to Universal Media Group

Bob Dylan, the trailblazing troubadour whose songs became anthems of the civil rights and anti-war movements of the 1960s and who is widely considered one of America's greatest songwriters, has sold his entire catalog to the Universal Music Group.

The deal means that more

than 600 of Dylan's copyrighted songs written over nearly 60 years - "from 1962's cultural milestone *Blowin' In The Wind* to this year's epic *Murder Most Foul*" - the press release said, are now owned by the media giant.

"It is no exaggeration to say that his vast body of work has captured the love and admiration of billions of people all around the world," Lucian Grainge, Chairman and CEO of Universal Music Group said in the press release announcing the deal.

"I have no doubt that decades, even centuries from now, the words and music of Bob Dylan will continue to be sung and played - and cherished - everywhere," Grainge added.

This deal also means more of Dylan's music will likely wind up in commercials, movies, TV shows and "any place where familiar music can be monetized through licensing deals," said Syracuse University music history professor, Theo Cateforis.

Dylan, who is 79, made his indelible musical mark by blending Folk music with Rock and Roll and poetry to create what the Nobel Prize judges called "new poetic expressions within the great American song tradition" when they honored him in 2016.

Starting in 1962 with his self-titled debut album, Dylan emerged from New York City's Greenwich Village Folk music scene to write iconic songs like *The Times They Are a-Changin'*, *A Hard Rain's a-Gonna Fall*, and *Like a Rolling Stone* that became part of the soundtrack of the 1960s and continued to resonate with the generations that followed.

Dylan has sold more than 125 million records around the world and his catalog includes Rock classics like *Forever Young, Tangled Up In Blue, Gotta Serve Somebody, Make You Feel My Love,* and the Academy Award-winning *Things Have Changed*.

His songs have been covered by everybody from Jimi Hendrix (All Along the Watchtower) and The Byrds (Mr. Tambourine Man)

to Guns N' Roses (*Knockin' On Heaven's Door*) and Jeff Buckley (*Just Like a Woman*).

In total, Dylan's songs have been recorded more than 6,000 times, according to Universal.

The Mann family candidly covers topics like relationships, marriage, blended families, black stereotypes, COVID-19, gun ownership, love and sex, all in a roundtable, 'muckbang' format, a trending livestream video style where someone prepares a meal and/or eats on camera. The show is the latest series produced by the Manns' production company, Tillymann Entertainment.

"We talk and laugh. A lot. And we do it over our family meals all the time. No topic is ever off limits or taboo," says David Mann. "After hearing from the fans that they wanted to see us back on TV, we decided to do this new show just for them."

During the pandemic, Tamela has also been recording her new 2021 album release. The first single, *Touch From You*, meant to spread love, hope, and compassion to a hurting people left with fears, questions, and anxiety about what's happening in the world, recently topped the Billboard Gospel Radio chart and is the singer's seventh No. 1 single.

Gabby Barrett's Single "I Hope" Was 2020's Defining Crossover Hit

With its surprise gut-punch chorus, Gabby Barrett's *I Hope* turned heads, sparked a label bidding war and this year made Country music history.

During a writing session with songwriters Jon Nite (Keith Urban, Luke Bryan) and Zach Kale (Florida Georgia Line), the trio crafted *I Hope*, an unexpectedly vengeful breakup tune - and only the fourth song Barrett had written in Nashville.



"It was a thrown-together write that wasn't really supposed to happen," she recalls. "That night, Jon said right before he left that this may be the biggest song of his career, and I'm thinking, 'What? With all the number ones he's had?'"

It proved to be a historic hit. Though Barrett, twenty, first released the song independently in early 2019, the track's plot twist - in which well-wishes for an ex-flame curdle at the end of the chorus - was irresistible to listeners. After a bidding war last year, she signed with Warner Music Nashville, which in 2020 helped Barrett top Billboard's Country Airplay chart, then summit both the Adult Pop Songs and the all-format Radio Songs charts with the aid of a Charlie Puth remix. *I Hope* is only the fourth song to hit number one on Country Airplay and Radio Songs, and Barrett is the first artist to do so with her debut single. The track has also topped Hot Country Songs for 20 weeks - the most time at number one for a solo female artist (and no other billed acts) - and reached number three on the Hot 100 in November.



Merle Haggard Biopic in the Works

A new biopic about Country legend Merle Haggard is on the way. Deadline reports that Amazon Studios has acquired the rights to the project, which will be directed by Robin Bissell, who previously worked on 2012's The Hunger Games, 2003's Seabiscuit and more. Bissell will co-write and co-produce the biopic with Theresa Haggard, who is the late Country star's widow. The as-yet-untitled project will be based off of Haggard's memoir, Sing Me Back Home, which details the singer's unlikely rise to fame.

The new film will focus on Haggard's three-year stint in San Quentin (where he was one of the prisoners to attend the first of Johnny Cash's now-iconic prison performances) and his subsequent rise to the very highest echelons of Country music fame. The biopic will detail the singer's struggle to distance himself from his ex-con status, as well as his tumultuous relationship with his onstage partner and offstage love interest (and eventual wife), Bonnie Owens.

Sam Rockwell, the Oscar-winning performer known for his work in The Hitchhiker's Guide to the Galaxy, Seven Psychopaths and more, is on deck to play the leading role of Haggard in the biopic. He will do all his own singing as part of his role in the film, focusing on the portion of Haggard's discography that was recorded in the 1960s, when the film takes place.

Ringo Starr's New Song Features Paul McCartney And Friends

Ringo Starr's new recording, *Here's To The Nights*, features an impressive lineup of guest performers.

Ringo called on a long list of stars from the past fifty years, from his Beatles bandmate Paul McCartney, to Dave Grohl and Eric



Burdon, Sheryl Crow, Chris Stapleton, Joe Walsh, Finneas O'Connell and songwriting great Diane Warren, who penned the lyrics.

The feel-good song is four minutes of Ringo's "peace and love" mantra, cut with contributions delivered by Zoom. Starr turned the big 8-0 back in July 2020, and celebrated the occasion in style, with an "All-Starr" benefit concert featuring several of the big names from *Here's To The Nights*.

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
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The Music Lives On: Remembering the Lives and Legacies of Four Beloved Performers

We pause to remember these individuals whose music and legacies will live on in the hearts of music fans for generations.

Billy Joe Shaver August 16,1939 - October 28, 2020 Country songwriter Billy Joe Shaver, whose songs were

recorded by Waylon Jennings, Willie Nelson and Elvis Presley, died at age 81 on October 28, 2020 Billy Ioe Shaver left home at age sixteen to serve in the

Billy Joe Shaver left home at age sixteen to serve in the Navy and took a series of gigs to make ends meet. He went to Nashville and got his first break in 1968 with Bobby Bare's recording of his song, *Ride Me Down Easy*.

He became a reliable storyteller, logging songs with Kris Kristofferson (*Good Christian Soldier*), the Allman Brothers, (*Sweet Mama*) and Elvis (*You Asked Me To*). When Waylon Jennings invited Shaver to Nashville to work on what became his 1973 Outlaw Country landmark album, "Honky Tonk Heroes," Shaver burst into national prominence. He landed credits on ten out of eleven tracks on the album that is often tagged as the first, and some say best, "Outlaw" LP from a back-to-basics 1970s movement that included Willie Nelson, Kris Kristofferson, Merle Haggard, Johnny Cash and a number of others.

Johnny Cash and John Anderson had hits with his song, *I'm Just an Old Chunk of Coal (But I'm Gonna Be a Diamond Some Day)*, which he wrote after giving up drugs and alcohol. In all, Shaver released nearly two dozen albums on a variety of labels.

Shaver was Grammy nominated 'Best Southern/Country/Bluegrass Album' for his 2007 effort ("Everybody's Brother"). His most recent release, 2014's "Long in the Tooth," was his first to chart on Billboard's Top Country Albums tally and it featured a duet with Nelson on *Hard to Be an Outlaw*.

Shaver also acted in a number of films, including "Secondhand Lions," "The Wendell Baker Story" and "Bait Shop." His song, *Live Forever* was performed by his friend Robert Duvall in the Oscar-winning film "Crazy Heart." Duvall cast Shaver in his 1996 movie, "The Apostle."

Shaver had a sterling reputation for writing heartfelt, hard-luck songs about strivers looking for a break, or just a shoulder to cry on. The "good Christian" with an eighth-grade education who worked on his uncle's farm instead of going to high school and lost part of his fingers while working at a sawmill got all his country learning while "picking cotton, raising hell and bailing hay," as he wrote in the 1993 song *Georgia on a Fast Train*.

Shaver received the first-ever Lifetime Achievement Award in Songwriting from the Americana Music Association in 2002 and was inducted into the Nashville Songwriters Hall of Fame in 2004 and the Texas Country Music Hall of Fame in 2006. His highest praise, however, came from the men who towered in the genre and whom he called friends. Cash once referred to Shaver as "my favorite songwriter," and good pal Willie Nelson said he was "definitely the best writer in Texas... Everything he writes is just poetry"




Doug Supernaw September 26, 1960 - November 13, 2020

Country music singer Doug Supernaw died November 13, 2020, at his home in Texas after a longtime battle with cancer. He was sixty years old. Supernaw was diagnosed in 2019 with advanced stage IV lung and bladder cancer. After undergoing aggressive treatment, the cancer spread to his brain and spine. He was born on September 26, 1960, in Bryan, Texas, and was signed to BNA Records, a label tied to Arista Nashville and RCA Nashville. He referenced his Texas roots with the title of his first album, "Red and Rio Grande." Supernaw had several hits in the 1990s. He released four studio albums and between 1993 and 1996, he charted eleven singles on the Billboard Hot Country Singles & Tracks (now Hot Country Songs) charts, including *Reno, Not Enough Hours In The Night*, and his signature song *I Don't Call Him Daddy* that reached number one in 1993.

Supernaw received 1993 ACM nominations for 'Top New Male Vocalist,' and for 'Song of the Year' for *I Don't Call Him Daddy*.

Following the news of his passing, the Country music community sent messages of love and condolences. Country Rock band Exile shared, "Doug was a great guy and a good entertainer, and a Texan no doubt! We extend our sympathies to his family and fans and the Country music community."



Hal Ketchum April 9, 1953 - November 23, 2020

Country Music artist Hal Ketchum passed away on November 23, 2020 due to complications from dementia. He was 67 years old.

His wife Andrea shared the tragic news on Facebook, "With great sadness and grief we announce that Hal passed away peacefully at home due to complications of Dementia. May his music live on forever in your hearts and bring you peace," she wrote.

Hal's wife shared his diagnosis with his fans back in the spring saying, "Because of his love for his fans, he continued performing as long as it was possible. Dementia is an exhausting and confusing illness, and now it's time for Hal to stay home with loved ones. Hal is otherwise healthy and happy, enjoying time with his family and friends."

Ketchum had three songs make it to number two on the Billboard Country charts with *Small Town Saturday Night*, *Hearts Are Gonna Roll*, and *Past the Point of Rescue*. He wrote the song, *Stay Forever* with Benmont Tench of Tom Petty (1950 - 2017) and the Heartbreakers, which reached the Country top ten in 1995.

Ketchum collaborated with Country greats Dolly Parton and Shelby Lynne. He also acted, appearing in the films "Heartbreak Hotel" and "Maverick." Ketchum released nine

Aaron Wilburn

July 9, 1950 - November 27, 2020

Born July 9, 1950, in Ardmore, Alabama, Christian singer, songwriter, and comedian, Aaron Wilburn began his career as a member of the Happy Goodman Family. Playing rhythm guitar and often singing as a guest soloist during the group's appearances, Aaron traveled with the legendary family group throughout the early 1970s. During his tenure with the Happy Goodman Family, his passion and talent for songwriting moved him to the forefront of the Gospel music industry.

Throughout his five decades of songwriting, Wilburn wrote or co-wrote beloved songs including the Singing News 'Song of the Decade' Four Days Late, performed by Karen Peck and New River. Several of his songs topped the national radio charts. He won GMA Dove Awards in the early 1990s for two Bruce Carroll recordings, Who Will Be Jesus and Sometimes Miracles Hide. Two of his songs, What A Beautiful Day (For The Lord To Come Again) and Four Days Late, were voted as 'Song Of The Year' at the Singing News Fan Awards in 1975 and 2001, respectively. His songs were also featured on numerous Grammy-nominated recordings.

Wilburn was a multi-faceted touring performer, blending humorous tales and quick one-liners with a seemingly endless repertoire of comedic songs, as he shared the Gospel. Aaron shared his talents in Gospel concerts, church services, secular conventions, corporate banquets, and events of all sizes throughout the United States, Canada, Mexico, and numerous other countries. Frequently seen on Bill Gaither's Homecoming Concerts and videos, Aaron was also a pioneering Christian performer on YouTube, garnering more than 10 million views for his works.

Aaron passed away Friday afternoon, November 27, 2020,

Wilburn's publisher, Daywind Music Publishing's Rick Shelton, shared, "It seems that in each generation God creates very few with the ability to wield ideas, language and melody so effectively that those who experience it are moved to vigorous laughter and emotional tears. We are thankful for the songs and stories that remain to fill the void left by Aaron's untimely departure."







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
