In a world that often feels off key, some melodies emerge not just from instruments, but from lives lived in harmony through trials and triumphs. Such is the story of Mark and Cindy Maynard, an award winning husband and wife duo renowned for their powerful Southern Gospel music, close knit vocal harmony and unwavering commitment to their faith. This evangelistic ministry has shared their songs at many churches, camps, retreats, seminars, revivals and Christian organizations throughout the United States. In 2019, Mark and Cindy won the Mountain State Gospel Awards, 'Duet of the Year.' In 2024 and 2025, they were nominated for 'Duet of the Year' by Christian Voice Magazine. Both are published song writers and together they have recorded six albums. Their love for each other, music and the Lord has been their steadfast guide through some of life's most difficult seasons.

indy began singing at the age of four, standing on platform railings to be seen. At a very young age she also appeared on a television show that featured The Three Stooges, performing the song, If You'll Take My Jesus. Her love for singing grew through her teen years, performing as a soloist and a member of a ladies trio.

Mark's interest in Southern Gospel music started as a young teen. His father would invite various Gospel groups to their church where Mark would often join in, playing drums. He frequently accompanied their local church quartet as well. Soon after, a regional Ohio Gospel group who had performed at Mark's church invited Mark to accompany them for a variety of performances; it was that opportunity that would change his focus from drums to lead singer. He traveled and sang weekends during his adolescent years. His senior year in High School, he went full time with a vocal trio and finished his high school classes on the road.

A Story That Started In Love

Mark and Cindy's story began the way many love songs do; unexpectedly on a blind date. They met at a local A&W Root beer stand and quickly discovered their mutual love for the Lord and Gospel music. They both were blessed to grow up in Christian homes where their fathers were ministers of the Gospel. This strong foundation and faith has shaped their lives and their music, infusing it with deep meaning and genuine desire to touch the hearts of their listeners. In their 51 years of marriage, the Maynards are no strangers to life's trials and triumphs and God's faithfulness in the middle of those struggles to carry them through.

Blessings Through Trials

Eight years after their first daughter Kim was born, they were overjoyed to anticipate the arrival of another baby into the family. But their delight was short-lived as Cindy suffered a heartbreaking miscarriage. Despite this setback, Cindy's faith remained unwavering, and she felt profoundly grateful that God had blessed them with Kim, especially given her struggles with severe endometriosis.

In the early 2000s, Mark faced a daunting health challenge when he began experiencing recurring bouts of double vision. Following an MRI scan, his medical team suspected a spot on his pituitary gland, prompting an outpouring of prayers from friends and loved ones. Mark underwent a second MRI with contrast, and the results were nothing short of miraculous - the scan was perfectly clear, revealing no spot on his pituitary gland and no need for further treatment. Mark was deeply convinced that God had healed him in response to the prayers.

In 2009, Mark and Cindy faced another series of formidable health trials. Mark was diagnosed with melanoma on his arm, which was successfully removed. As they navigated this uncertain time, prayer was their instinctive response. After removal and testing, it was determined that the melanoma was confined to the surface, requiring only

clear check-ups later, it was evident that God had answered their prayers once again. That same year, Cindy underwent major surgery due to a cancer scare, but God's faithfulness shone through once more. Throughout their ministry, Mark and Cindy have encountered numerous travel-related challenges, each one demonstrating God's unwavering love, faithfulness, and protection. They attribute their triumphs over these trials to God's sovereign hand, acknowledging that their travels and ministry are securely in His care. Through it all, they have discovered an unshakable peace that only God can provide, as well as a powerful testimony to His faithfulness.

A Mother's Mind, A Daughter's Heart

More recently, Cindy's mother, Marlys, began showing signs of dementia. At first it was small things - repeating questions, forgetting dates, etc. Soon the progression quickened and Cindy found herself becoming a caregiver alongside her other roles as a wife, mother, grandmother and ministry partner. As Cindy remarked, "There were days I couldn't find the words to even pray, all I could do was cry. Watching someone you love disappear piece by piece is a unique kind of grief. Even in those moments, when the words wouldn't come, God heard each tear. Somehow God gave me strength moment by moment." Cindy often claimed the verses in Lamentations 3:22-23, "Through the Lords mercies we are not consumed, because His compassions fail not. They are new every morning; great is your faithfulness."

In late July 2024, Cindy's mother fell and broke her hip. Cindy was faced with the difficult decision of having her mother go through surgery at the age of 94. The odds were great for her mother to likely end up on a ventilator, should she survive the surgery. If Cindy refused the surgery, her mother would be bed ridden for the rest of her life. Thankfully, the Lord, through His compassion and mercy, made the decision for Cindy, and took her mom home, surrounded by family. Marlys received her ultimate healing in the arms of Jesus.

An Anniversary Adventure Turned Into A Test of Faith

In celebration of their 50th wedding anniversary, Mark and Cindy decided to take a cruise to rest and reconnect after years of care giving and ministry. The couple set sail on an 11 day voyage to Aruba and other ports with joyful hearts and plans to celebrate God's faithfulness. Their anniversary cruise turned into a test of faith. On the first night of the cruise, Cindy woke up in excruciating pain which quickly escalated, forcing them to seek emergency medical help on annual checkups to insure no recurrence. Sixteen years of board the ship. Unfortunately the very first port was in 3 days, so Cindy had to make multiple trips to the ship medical facility to allow her to manage the pain she was in. With limited equipment and medical diagnostic procedures available, the ships doctor could only make an educated guess as to her diagnosis. They decided that they needed to get off the ship at the very first port and fly home if possible. Mark recalled, "We were in a foreign country, thousands of miles from home with our plans turned upside down. But we prayed along with many friends and family and kept believing that the Lord would make a way, and He did." Mark found that there was one flight



leaving the day they arrived in Aruba, with the last two seats flight was canceled for 24 hours, so wanting to get home, they chose to rent a car and drive the remaining eight hours home. Once home, they went to the emergency room where it was discovered Cindy had a large kidney stone that she would not have passed on her own. After a surgical procedure to eliminate the stone, Cindy was able to go home to rest and recuperate. Looking back, they definitely saw God's hand in every detail. Back home, Mark and Cindy resumed their music ministry, now with deeper stories of God's faithfulness to share.

A Life Composed of Faith

Through the years, they have dedicated their lives to spreading the message of Christ in the songs that God has given them to sing. Reminding audiences that while storms father's God, and I will exalt Him." - Exodus 15:2 may come, they are never without shelter.

Today, Mark and Cindy continue to balance family life and their music ministry. Blessed with their daughter, son-inlaw, three grandchildren, their spouses, and a beautiful great granddaughter. Their love has been tested, their faith refined, and their purpose deepened. They have learned when facing trials in life, pray through it and trust that God is orchestrating something beautiful even if all you can hear is the discord. In the Maynard's lives, as in their music, the sweetest harmonies are often born from the hardest seasons.



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Artist Spotlight THE FANTASTIC SPIRITUAL VOICES

The Fantastic Spiritual Voices have become more than a quartet - they're a movement. With roots stretching back to the legendary Fantastic Violinaires and a sound steeped in falsetto tradition, their journey from humble beginnings to national acclaim is a testament to perseverance, faith, and musical excellence.

This year, the group was honored with the Zadella "Mama" Curtis Quartet of the Year Award at the Prayze Factor Awards Show. "This is a great honor, and only God made this possible," the group shared with characteristic humility. They also received a Lifetime Achievement Award from Gospel Train Award Productions, cementing their place among Gospel royalty.

Though based in Atlanta, the group's story is deeply tied to Wilson, North Carolina. Brothers Danny and Tim Boone, along with Tim's son Christopher Boone and longtime friend Bishop Reginald Saunders, trace their musical lineage to their grandmother, Fannie Boone, who played piano for churches across Wilson. "We're hometown boys," Tim Boone told NewsBreak. "We're Wilson natives, and we're not ashamed to say it".

Their mentor, the late Rev. Charlie Brown, a Gospel Hall of Fame inductee, formed the group in 2012 after years performing with them in the Fantastic Violinaires. His love for falsetto remains the group's sonic signature. "Rev. Brown taught us that the voice is an instrument of worship," Danny Boone reflected. "We carry that lesson every time we sing."

Their 2025 release, "Quartet Dayz 1," is a 12-track celebration of Gospel heritage and modern flair. The album debuted at No. 12 on the Gloryland Gospel Top 20 and quickly climbed to No. 8. The standout single *Right On Time* is featured on multiple national charts, including Gospel USA Magazine's Top Indie Song Chart and RadioAirplay.com.



What sets the group apart is their bold choice to swap traditional instruments for a DJ-led setup. "We love our live music but not having to play that bass guitar feels great," said Christopher Boone. "We're hoping that we can be trendsetters in that regard for a lot of quartets to see that there's other ways to bring the message."

Their mission is clear: to spread the Gospel through music that uplifts and inspires. "It's something that you work so hard for, and suddenly someone recognizes you for what you're doing," Tim Boone said. "Words can't describe how it feels to hear your material played on the radio".

The group has shared stages with Gospel legends like Lee Williams & The Spiritual QC's, The Sensational Nightingales, and Keith "Wonderboy" Johnson. Their performances are more than concerts, they're spiritual experiences.

Currently in production at Prosound Studio, "Quartet Dayz 2" promises to build on their momentum with a 2026 release. As they look ahead, they honor the memory of Rev. Charlie Brown, Fred Jones, and James McKrae - men whose voices and vision shaped their path.

With Danny, Tim, Christopher, and Bishop Saunders at the helm, The Fantastic Spiritual Voices continue to redefine Gospel quartet music for a new generation. Their message is timeless, their sound is fresh, and their journey is far from over.

Follow them wherever the Gospel leads - and let the music minister!



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
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From a Georgia patrol car to Nashville's indie charts, the singer-songwriter's journey is one of grit, grace, and God.

n a quiet stretch of farmland in Shiloh, Georgia population just over 400 - Adam Grant wakes up to the sound of birdsong and the rustle of deer in the brush. His 142-acre property isn't just home; it's the soul of his music. "This land grounds me," he says. "It's where I write, where I heal, and where I remember why I started all this."

Grant, a retired law enforcement officer and lifelong Country singer-songwriter, has lived a life that reads like a Southern ballad - equal parts heartbreak, hope, and hard-earned triumph. His latest single, *Even Though You're Gone*, currently sits at #71 on the Cashbox Independent Country Top 100, a testament to his staying power in an industry that often forgets its own.

But for Grant, music was never about fame. It was about fire.

"I believe it was 1997," he recalls. "I was at the Georgia Dome for the Richard Petty tribute. Joe Diffie sang *Ships That Don't Come In*, and man, it just did something to me. That performance lit a fire in me. I decided that night - singing Country music was what I wanted to do with my life."

A year later, he made his first pilgrimage to Nashville. At the Nashville Palace, he met Vern Gosdin. "I shook his hand, and he looked at me and said, 'How ya doin', son?' That moment only made my desire stronger."

Grant's path wasn't paved with record deals or radio payola. It was built on grit. In 2010, he formed Badhorse, a Country group that quickly made waves on the independent circuit. They scored three consecutive #1 hits on the New Music Weekly charts and were named 'Best New Group' that same year. Their song *Still Love Them* climbed to #2 on the Inspirational Country charts.

"We were just a bunch of guys with a dream," Grant says. "But we had heart. We had songs that meant something."

Badhorse's music caught the attention of filmmakers, landing them in two motion pictures - one with Travis Tritt, another with John Schneider. Their video for *It's All Good*, filmed with NFL legend Terry Bradshaw at the Titans stadium, became the theme song for the 2012 NFL Alumni Awards hosted by Alec Baldwin.

But just as the music was rising, life threw Grant a devastating curve ball.

"In 2014, my son was diagnosed with leukemia. He was five," Grant says. "It was the hardest time of our lives. But by the grace of God, he's now a senior in high school and completely healed."

Two years later, while conducting a traffic stop on the interstate, Grant's patrol car was hit from behind by a drunk driver going 80 miles per hour. The crash left him with severe injuries and forced him into medical retirement after three surgeries, including a major neck operation.

"I lost my career in law enforcement that day," he says. "But I didn't lose my music."

Instead, he doubled down. His recent singles *In America* (rose to #5 on Cashbox), *I Ain't Hurting Much* (a duet with Billy Payne at #28), and *Throw In The Towel* (with Gale Jenkins, went to #58) - are proof that Grant's voice still resonates.

"I do this organically," he says. "No big label, no machine behind me. Just me, my guitar, and a belief that these songs matter."

That belief is rooted in faith and patriotism, two pillars that define both the man and the music. "I love this Country, and I love God," Grant says. "You can hear it in every song I write. I'm not trying to be trendy. I'm trying to be true."

His songs are steeped in the traditions of the genre's golden age - storytelling, steel guitars, and a reverence for the everyday American experience. But there's also a modern

edge, a lived-in wisdom that comes from surviving what many wouldn't.

"I've been through enough to quit," he says. "But I couldn't stop even if I wanted to. Music is just in me, and it's not going away."


Back in Shiloh, Grant still writes daily. He's got a stack of unreleased songs ready for the studio and plans to keep releasing music to radio and streaming platforms. "I'm not chasing trends," he says. "I'm chasing truth."

And maybe that's why his music connects. Because it's not just about the notes, it's about the life behind them.

"Anyone who knows me knows I feel strongly about America and our freedoms," he says. "And I've learned that no matter what life throws at you - cancer, crashes, career changes - you never give up. You never lose focus on your goals."

Adam Grant isn't just a Country artist. He's a survivor, a storyteller, and a Southern son who turned pain into purpose. And as long as there's a song to sing, he'll be out there - on stage, on the radio, or under the Georgia stars - reminding us all that it's still all good.

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

A Life in Music,

Movement,

and Meaning

Elvira Kalnik is a Pop music artist whose journey has been anything but ordinary. From her earliest days in ballet shoes and piano lessons to international stages and film festival spotlights, she embodies the spirit of a true multidimensional performer.

Born into a creative family, Elvira Kalnik grew up surrounded by musicians, poets, and actors, laying the foundation for a career that fuses music, acting, and dance into a vibrant artistic identity. With her recent single and video *Water Knows* earning accolades and global recognition, She stands today as both a visionary artist and a testament to resilience, creativity, and boundless imagination.

Elvira's story begins with a declaration most five-yearolds might make: "I'll be a singer when I grow up." Unlike most, however, she meant it. At that tender age, she was already studying ballet, learning piano, and composing her first small musical pieces. By six, she was on stage for her first singing performance, an experience that revealed both the joy and humor of the stage - like the time she mixed up her lyrics and accidentally sang about bees sleeping in ponds and fish in gardens, sending her audience into stifled laughter. Even then, her determination shone through.

Born into a family of artists, poets, and musicians, Kalnik's environment nurtured every facet of her creativity. She wasn't confined to one discipline; instead, she explored all of them - singing, dancing, acting, and even drawing. At 17, she took her next bold step, enrolling in music college with a major in opera. It wasn't an easy path. She was the youngest and least experienced student, accepted only because a teacher saw untapped potential in her. She threw herself into the work with such intensity that other students were sent to watch her rehearsals as examples of discipline. Within half a year, she had advanced so quickly that she was invited to perform at a theater in front of thousands, a feat that became a turning point in her life.


Opera, though rigorous and rewarding, was never the final destination. While she graduated by performing the notoriously difficult aria *Casta Diva* from Bellini's Norma, her heart leaned toward Pop music, where she could combine her skills in dance, acting, and songwriting. For Elvira, Opera wasn't a detour - it was a foundation. It taught her discipline, artistry, and the courage to attempt what others deemed impossible.

Her career since then has been punctuated by highlights that most artists only dream of. At 14, she was already recording her first album in the studio, trading in math exams for melodies. Years later, she would grace international festivals with songs like *Star Dance, Blind Love, NORD DOLL*, and *Dreams Come True*, each piece earning awards and critical acclaim across New York, Los Angeles, Berlin, Florence, and Cannes. Perhaps her most touching achievement was performing *Dreams Come True* at the United Nations Humanitarian Gala, where she also received the Presidential Award for her contributions to community and culture.

Her latest single and video, *Water Knows*, continues this trajectory of growth and recognition. Inspired by the healing and teaching qualities of water, the song has resonated deeply with audiences worldwide, charting in the UK Dance charts on iTunes, gaining radio airplay across continents, and being considered for major awards. Kalnik describes water as both

a teacher and a healer - a metaphor for how she approaches life's challenges. By releasing emotions and letting them flow away, she finds transformation, much like her audience does through her music.


Beyond accolades, what makes Kalnik's artistry enduring is her philosophy. She views every moment, whether as grand as an international gala or as simple as a butterfly landing on her head, as inspiration. One such butterfly encounter directly sparked the creation of *Dreams Come True*, a song that has since brought her international honors. For her, these so-called "small moments" are the essence of life, proof that love and authenticity always lead to something greater.



Kalnik's outlook on cultural and social issues is equally thoughtful. She rejects judgment and comparison, believing instead that every life path carries value. For her, the mission isn't to declare the world broken and in need of fixing but to embody the change we wish to see. "If you want your world to be better," she says, "be better yourself."

On stage, fans can expect not just a concert but an experience. Tireless and endlessly creative, Elvira Kalnik thrives in front of an audience. She sees her listeners as friends, cherishing each performance as a unique and unrepeatable moment. Her mission is clear: to create, entertain, and deliver unforgettable memories through music.

With her latest work reaching new heights and her philosophy of life shining through every note, Elvira Kalnik stands as an artist who blends discipline with spontaneity, passion with purpose. She is a performer shaped by Opera but guided by Pop, grounded in hard work but lifted by imagination. And as her music continues to ripple across the globe, one thing is certain - Elvira Kalnik is here not just to entertain, but to inspire.



The Gospel Music Association hosted the biggest night of the year. The 56th Annual GMA Dove Awards were handed out Tuesday night, October 7th, 2025, to a live audience at Nashville's Bridgestone Arena.

Brandon Lake was most awarded with five wins including 'Songwriter of the Year (Artist)' and 'Song of the Year' for *Hard Fought Hallelujah*, honoring songwriters Lake, Jelly Roll, Steven Furtick, Chris Brown, and Benjamin William Hastings. 'Artist of the Year' went to Forrest Frank and 'New Artist of the Year' went to Leanna Crawford. CeCe Winans took home two awards including 'Gospel Worship Recorded Song of the Year' for *Come Jesus Come* with Shirley Caesar. 'Spanish Language Recorded Song of the Year' went to Israel & New Breed, Unified Sound (ft. Israel & New Breed, Unified Sound (ft. Adrienne Bailon-

Houghton, Nate Diaz, Aaron Moses, Lucia Parker) for *Coritos de Fuego*.

The broadcast aired exclusively on TBN and the TBN+ app and was simulcast on SiriusXM The Message. The broadcast re-aired on Friday, October 17th, 2025, on TBN, the TBN+ app, and TBN YouTube.





Unforgettable performances ruled the night as for KING + COUNTRY, with guest Taylor Hill, opened the show with a stunning performance of *World On Fire*. In a crowdpleasing surprise, Ben Fuller welcomed 8-time Grammy Award winner Carrie Underwood to the stage to sing their nominated song, *If It Was Up To Me*. Newly minted Opry

Member Steven Curtis Chapman was joined on stage for a special Opry 100 performance with fellow Opry members Lady A and Vince Gill. Israel & New Breed and Unified Sound welcomed friends Aaron Moses, Adrienne Bailon-Houghton, Alex Campos, Christine D'Clario, Josh and Waleska Morales, Ingrid Rosario, Janina Rosado, Lucia Parker, and Nate Diaz for a one-of-a-kind Latin performance. Tauren Wells with gio. brought the energy on *Let The Church Sing*. CeCe Winans led the arena in a poignant, acoustic version of *Come Jesus Come*, and Brandon Lake and Jelly Roll, with special guest Jon Batiste, closed out the night with a rain-soaked version of *Hard Fought Hallelujah*.

Host Tauren Wells brought out his pastor side in the opening monologue, encouraging the audience saying, "There is only one reason that we're here tonight, one common denominator between all of us and it's that without Jesus we recognize we have nothing. Without

Jesus we have no songs to sing, without Jesus we have no stories to tell, we have no scripts to write, no books, we have no platforms, we have no Instagram followers, we have no subscribers, we have nothing to celebrate if it had not been for the Lord who is on your side. Robby Turner April 7, 1962 - September 4, 2025

Robby Turner was born into Country music literally. Born in 1961 in Paragould, Arkansas, he was the son of Doyle and Bernice Turner, both members of Hank Williams' legendary Drifting Cowboys band from 1946 to 1948. Doyle played steel guitar, Bernice rhythm guitar, and together they passed down not just musical talent, but a sacred inheritance. Robby didn't just grow up around music, he was steeped in it, shaped by it, and destined to carry it forward.

By the age of nine, Robby was already touring with The Wilburn Brothers as a drummer, his first instrument in a long line of many. But even then, the steel guitar called to him. At eleven, he was working three nights a week in a local honky tonk to save up for his own rig. At twelve, Shot Jackson of Sho-Bud recognized the spark and sponsored Robby, making him the youngest endorsed steel guitar player in the company's history.

By fourteen, Robby was performing with saxophone legend Ace Cannon, and over the next fifteen years, he toured with The Singing Rambos and Charlie Rich, while becoming a sought-after studio player and producer. His Turner-Up Recording studio in Nashville would later become a sanctuary for some of Country music's most sacred sessions.

In 1990, Robby's path intersected with destiny. Producer Chips Moman was assembling a band for The Highwaymen - Willie Nelson, Waylon Jennings, Johnny Cash, and Kris Kristofferson - and offered Robby the steel guitar slot. It was

more than a gig; it was a gateway. Robby became a cornerstone of The Highwaymen's sound and forged a deep, enduring friendship with Waylon Jennings that lasted until Waylon's passing in 2002.

From that moment on, Robby was Waylon's right-hand man. He played on Waylon's final nine albums, toured alongside him, and became part of the sonic DNA that defined Waylon's later years. That same DNA would later echo through the work of Sturgill Simpson and Chris Stapleton, both of whom enlisted Robby's talents to shape their own groundbreaking records.

In 2012, Robby fulfilled a sacred trust. Years earlier, Waylon had recorded simple vocal and guitar tracks at Robby's Turner-Up studio, leaving them in Robby's care with the instruction to finish them someday. Robby did just that, producing "Goin' Down Rockin' – The Last Recordings," a final farewell from Waylon, lovingly completed by the man who knew him best.

Robby Turner was more than a sideman. He was a steward of tradition, a craftsman of tone, and a quiet legend whose steel guitar could make a song weep. He earned the nickname "Man of Steel," which he proudly wore on his 1996 solo album. But behind the steel was a heart of gold.

His contributions spanned generations and genres. He toured globally with the Dixie Chicks, played on "Wanted! The Outlaws," "Highwayman 2," and "The Road Goes on Forever," and worked with artists as varied as George Jones, Loretta Lynn, Travis Tritt, Paul Simon, Rodney Crowell, Marty Stuart, Jamey Johnson, Nikki Lane, Shooter Jennings, and Colter Wall. His steel guitar even found its way onto projects by B.B. King, Eric Clapton, Bob Dylan, Ray Charles, and Frank Sinatra - proof that Robby's sound transcended genre and era.

Through producer Dave Cobb, Robby's sound reached a new wave of Country fans, bridging the gap between tradition and innovation. His fingerprints are on some of the most influential records of the last decade, and his studio work - both as a player and producer - cemented his place as one of the most respected steel guitarists to ever take the stool.

Robby Turner passed away on Thursday, September 4th, at the age of 63. But his music lives on in the grooves of vinyl, the strings of steel, and the hearts of those who heard him play. He was never just a background player. He was a pillar, a poet of tone, and a keeper of the flame.



Brett James Cornelius June 5, 1968 – September 18, 2025

Born in Columbia, Missouri, James grew up in the Oklahoma City area. His early life was on a trajectory toward medicine, not music. He earned a Bachelor of Science degree from Baylor University in 1991. Following his father, who was a physician, James enrolled in medical school at the University of Oklahoma. After about a year, however, his intense passion for music led him to drop out and move to Nashville to pursue a career as a recording artist. Though he initially signed a record deal and released a self-titled debut album in 1995, he quickly realized his true calling was in the writer's room.

James accumulated more than 27 No. 1 Country singles and was named ASCAP 'Country Songwriter of the Year' in both 2006 and 2010. He was inducted into the Nashville Songwriters Hall of Fame in 2020.

Country music's most consistent and versatile hitmakers, penning an incredible 27 number-one singles throughout his career. His breakthrough began in 2000 when Jessica Andrews took his song Who I Am to the top of the charts, followed quickly by Martina McBride's inspirational hit Blessed. His career reached a major turning point with Carrie Underwood's debut single Jesus, Take the Wheel, which not only topped the Country charts but earned him the Grammy Award for 'Best Country Song' in 2006, and became a defining Christian crossover anthem.

James was a frequent and successful collaborator with Kenny Chesney, co-writing a string of No. 1 songs including the signature vacation tune When the Sun Goes Down (with Uncle Kracker), Out Last Night, and Reality. Other charttoppers that defined the sound of 21st-century Country music include Jason Aldean's emotional hit The Truth, Dierks Bentley's deeply personal *I Hold On*, Rodney Atkins' patriotic anthem It's America, and Scotty McCreery's debut single I Love You This Big. His versatility allowed his compositions to cross genres, landing major cuts with Pop artists like Kelly

Clarkson with Mr. Know It All and Bon Jovi with Till We Ain't Strangers Anymore.

In addition to songwriting, James worked as a respected record producer for artists including Josh Gracin and Kip Moore. He was also a passionate advocate for songwriters' rights, serving on the boards of organizations like the Country Music Association and The Recording Academy.

The Country music songwriter Brett James sadly passed away on September 18, 2025, at the age of 57, in a tragic plane crash. He was killed alongside his wife, Melody Carole Wilson, and her daughter, Meryl Maxwell Wilson, when the small aircraft went down near Franklin, North Carolina. He is survived by his adult children from his first marriage.



Paul Daniel "Ace" Frehley April 27, 1951 – October 16, 2025

Born Paul Daniel Frehley on April 27, 1951, in the Bronx, Brett James built an extraordinary legacy as one of New York City, Ace Frehley grew up in a working-class family where music was both escape and inspiration. A self-taught guitarist by his early teens, he played in local bands throughout high school, developing a style that was raw, melodic, and unmistakably his own. It wasn't until 1973, at the age of 21, that he answered a Village Voice ad seeking a guitarist with "flash and ability" - a moment that would change the course of Rock history.

> That audition led to the formation of Kiss, alongside Paul Stanley, Gene Simmons, and Peter Criss. Frehley adopted his childhood nickname, Ace, to avoid confusion with Stanley, and soon after, he created the persona that would define him: "The Spaceman," complete with silver stars and stylized black lipstick. His look was iconic, but it was his sound - fiery, inventive, and full of swagger - that helped launch Kiss into the stratosphere.

> From the band's self-titled debut in 1974, Frehley's fingerprints were all over the music. He wrote Cold Gin for that first album, though he handed off lead vocals to Simmons, still unsure of his own voice. By 1975, Kiss had broken through with the live album "Alive!" and the anthem

Rock and Roll All Nite. Frehley's guitar work - equal parts grit and grandeur - became a defining element of the band's sonic identity.

As Kiss evolved, so did Frehley's role. He co-wrote always Flaming Youth on 1976's "Destroyer" and stepped into the spotlight with his first lead vocal on Shock Me from 1977's "Love Gun." A year later, all four members released solo albums simultaneously; Frehley's outsold the others and featured the hit New York Groove, cementing his status as more than just a sideman.

By the late '70s, Frehley's voice and songwriting were more prominent than ever. On 1979's "Dynasty," he sang lead on three tracks, including the Stones cover *2,000 Man* and his own *Hard Times* and *Save Your Love*. But creative tensions and diverging visions for the band's future led to his departure in 1982, just before Kiss shed their makeup and entered a new era.

Frehley struck out on his own, forming Frehley's Comet and releasing a self-titled debut in 1987. The band's blend of Hard Rock and melodic hooks earned a loyal following, and Frehley continued to release solo albums over the decades, culminating in 2024's "10,000 Volts."

In 1995, he reunited with Kiss for an MTV Unplugged performance that sparked a full-scale reunion tour in 1996 with the original lineup. Though his contributions to 1998's "Psycho Circus" were limited, he toured with the band through 2001 before returning to solo work.

Frehley was candid about his Rock-and-Roll excesses and his sometimes laissez-faire approach to musicianship. In a 1994 interview with Marc Allen, he quipped, "A lotta people have come up to me and tell me, you know, if it wasn't for me they would have never picked up a guitar. If I knew that was gonna be the case I probably woulda practiced a little more."

Yet his influence was undeniable. His smoking Les Paul, his rocket-firing guitar solos, and his cosmic stage presence inspired generations. Rage Against the Machine's Tom Morello called him his "first guitar hero," adding, "The legendary Space Ace Frehley inspired generations to love Rock n Roll and love Rock'n'Roll guitar playing... His unforgettable crazy laugh will be missed but will never be forgotten."

Pearl Jam's Mike McCready said, "Just listen to "Alive" - I used his solo from *She* as a template. Ace jammed on *Black Diamond* with Pearl Jam at Madison Square Garden... a dream come true for me. I would not have picked up a guitar without Ace and KISS's influence." Anthrax remembered him as "a kid from the Bronx [who] became a worldwide guitar hero," and Extreme summed it up simply: "For so many of us, he was one of the first reasons we ever picked up a guitar."

Ace Frehley died on October 16, 2025, in Morristown, New Jersey, following a recent fall. He was 74. His former bandmates released a statement calling him "an essential and irreplaceable Rock soldier during some of the most formative

foundational chapters of the band and its history. He is and will always be a part of KISS's legacy."

D' Angelo February 11, 1974 - October 17, 2025

Born Michael Eugene Archer on February 11, 1974, in Richmond, Virginia, D'Angelo was raised in a deeply spiritual household. His father, Luther Archer, was a Pentecostal minister, and the church was where young Michael first encountered the transformative power of music. By the time he was a teenager, he was already a gifted pianist and vocalist, steeped in Gospel but drawn to the secular rhythms of Funk, Jazz, and Hip-Hop. His early promise was undeniable - he won three consecutive amateur nights at Harlem's Apollo Theater, a proving ground for Black musical excellence.

Back home in Richmond, he played in a series of local groups - Three of a Kind, Michael Archer and Precise, and Intelligent, Deadly But Unique (IDU) - before catching the attention of EMI as a songwriter in 1993. One of his earliest compositions, *U Will Know*, became a Top 30 hit in 1994 when recorded by the supergroup Black Men United, which included Lenny Kravitz, R. Kelly, and members of Boyz II Men. It was a powerful anthem addressing Black-on-Black violence, and it marked D'Angelo as a voice of both conscience and craft.

In 1995, he released his debut album, "Brown Sugar," under the name D'Angelo - a nod to the Renaissance artist Michelangelo. The album was a revelation. With its fusion of vintage Soul, Hip-Hop beats, and Jazz-inflected harmonies, it helped define a new genre: Neo-Soul. The title track, a sly ode to marijuana disguised as a love song, and the single *Lady* both cracked the U.S. Top 30. The album went platinum and positioned D'Angelo as a torchbearer for a new generation of Soul artists.

His reputation deepened in 1998 with a haunting duet on Lauryn Hill's "The Miseducation of Lauryn Hill," where he sang and played electric piano on *Nothing Even Matters*. But it was his second album, "Voodoo" (2000), that cemented his legend. A darker, more experimental work shaped in collaboration with the Soulquarians - a collective that included Questlove, Erykah Badu, and Mos Def—"Voodoo" was a masterclass in groove and vulnerability. The album debuted at No. 1 in the U.S. and won two Grammys, including 'Best R&B Album.'

Its most iconic single, *Untitled (How Does It Feel)*, became both a blessing and a burden. The video, which featured a shirtless D'Angelo in a single, intimate shot, turned him into a reluctant sex symbol. "I felt like I was being objectified," he later said, reflecting on the tension between his artistry and the public's gaze. The image stuck, even as the man behind it withdrew.

Following the "Voodoo" tour, D'Angelo entered a long period of personal struggle, battling alcohol and drug addiction. The years that followed were marked by silence, rumors, and false starts. But in 2014, after more than a decade, he returned with "Black Messiah" - a politically charged, sonically rich album that once again redefined the boundaries of Black music. Released in the wake of national protests over police violence, the album was both timely and timeless. It debuted at No. 5 in the U.S., earned him another Grammy for *Really Love*, and reminded the world of his singular voice.

Though fans hoped for more, D'Angelo remained elusive. Apart from the 2019 single *Unshaken*, featured in the video game Red Dead Redemption 2, and a guest appearance alongside Jay-Z on *I Want You Forever* from the 2023 film The Book of Clarence, he largely retreated from public life. He never released another album, and in his final years, became increasingly reclusive.


Throughout his career, D'Angelo resisted labels. "I never claimed I do Neo-Soul," he said in 2014. "When I first came out, I used to always say, 'I do Black music. I make Black music." That ethos - rooted in tradition but unbound by genre - defined his work and inspired a generation of artists, from Maxwell and Erykah Badu to Frank Ocean and Anderson. Paak.

D'Angelo died on October 17, 2025, at the age of 51, following a battle with pancreatic cancer. Though his discography was modest in volume, its impact was seismic. D'Angelo didn't just make records - he made moments, movements, and music that felt like prophecy. In his silence, he left space for others to rise. In his sound, he left a blueprint for Soul's future.









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
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ANDREW DEAN

ndrew Dean is redefining Country music with heart, hustle, and a voice that spans $4\frac{1}{2}$ octaves, earning him over 70 awards and the title "hardest working man in music." From the church pews of Gibsonburg, Ohio to the spotlight of Nashville's biggest stages, Dean has built a career on authenticity, versatility, and relentless dedication.

"I just give it my all," Dean says. "I love seeing the smiles on everyone's faces and knowing that I'm making them happy." That sincerity fuels his songwriting, blending introspective lyrics with catchy melodies and modern production. His style bridges traditional Country, Gospel, Americana, and Western swing, resonating with fans across generations and genres.

"I think people respond to sincere music that they can relate to," Dean adds. "For the first time, I was able to just be myself on these songs, making something I loved, and let people get to know me better."

Dean's accolades are staggering: 'Male Vocalist of the Year' from the Academy of Western Artists, 'Band of the Year' with Andrew Dean and The Farm Machine, and multiple honors from the Josie Music Awards, World Songwriting Awards, and NACMAI. His single *A Dozen Red Roses* hit #1 in Traditional Country, while *Home* topped the Australian Country charts.

His album "Wanted" was nominated for 'Album of the Year' in 2022, and his music video *If I Could* earned recognition from the International Singer-Songwriters Association in 2024. Dean's current singles - *Swingtown, Happy Hours, Ole Wagon Shed, Rain,* and *Home* - showcase his range, from tropical Americana to Outlaw Blues.

Dean's musical journey began with Beatles records as a toddler, guided by his mother Linda, a church organist and choir director. He played sousaphone in school, fronted Rock bands in his 20s, and found his true voice in Country music after hearing George Jones, Johnny Cash, Vince Gill, and Travis Tritt.



He's shared the stage with legends like Joanne Cash Yates, Terri Clark, Georgette Jones, Jack Greene, and Dottie Rambo, and performed with Gospel icons and Country royalty alike. His collaborations span decades and genres, but his message remains consistent: music is a gift from God, meant to uplift and unite.

Dean's philosophy is simple: "Love it, do it, and live it." He's a humanitarian at heart, honored in both 2007 and 2024 for his work supporting veterans, fighting hunger, and raising awareness for cancer research. His songs reflect those values, focusing on God, his wife, family, and the everyday struggles and joys of life.

With over 200 concerts a year, Dean brings his music to churches, festivals, corporate events, and tribute shows across North America. His label, NITE*SKY Records, and his promotional arm, Black Hat Promotions, help emerging artists find their voice - just as he found his own.

Andrew Dean isn't just keeping Country music alive, he's expanding its soul. And with every note, every lyric, and every standing ovation, he's proving that dreams do come true when you walk in the light and sing from the heart.

A Cowboy Hat, a Broken Heart, and a Voice That Won't Quit

In Pine Mountain, Georgia, where the roads are dusty and the dreams run deep, Traylee Oglesby is carving out a name for himself, one song at a time. At just 20 years old, the self-described "small town kid with big dreams" has already earned the title of RCM Gold Artist, released a string of soul-baring singles, and shared the stage with legends like John Schneider and T. Graham Brown.

But his journey hasn't been easy.

"My dad was my biggest supporter," Oglesby says quietly. "He passed away unexpectedly on June 9, 2024. That loss changed everything. I found peace in songwriting and singing. It's how I cope. It's how I heal."

That healing is evident in his latest releases, *Prayer* List (currently at #83 on the Cashbox Independent Country), *I'll Ease Your Pain*, and *Forgive My Shadows* - each a raw, spiritual plea for comfort and clarity. "These songs are all about losing someone you cherish deeply and wanting God's help finding your way out of that hurt," he explains.

Oglesby's voice is steeped in the traditions of Waylon Jennings, George Strait, and Johnny Cash - artists who shaped his sound and spirit. "I've been singing since I was about 7," he says. "But I knew I wanted a career in music around 13. I even auditioned for The Voice and American Idol when I was 14. Didn't make it far, but it lit a fire in me."

That fire has carried him through personal loss, industry challenges, and spiritual reckonings. "My biggest issue lately has been a separation from God," he admits. "I've always believed that instead of listening to the world, you should listen to the word. God will put you where you need to be and when. Stop relying on social media and get back to your morals."

It's this blend of faith and authenticity that makes Oglesby's music resonate. His lyrics aren't just catchy, they're confessional. His performances aren't just entertaining, they're cathartic.

Still, the road hasn't been without bumps. "My top challenge has been finding someone who truly sees the passion I have for my music and can produce what I hear in my head," he says. "It's tough, but I'm learning."

That learning is part of his ethos. "One of the most inspirational things I've ever been told is, 'No matter how much you know, be willing to learn more.' I think of that quote often. It keeps me grounded."

Grounded is a good word for Oglesby. When he's not writing or performing, he's cutting wood, climbing trees, riding dirt roads in old Jeeps, and wearing his cowboy hat like a badge of honor. "I'm just a small town kid trying to make something of himself," he says. "I was taught to work hard but follow my dreams, and that's what I'm doing."

His dream? To be one of the greats. "I want to help keep true Country music alive for as long as possible," he says. "And when people

come to my shows, they can always count on good music and hear the heart behind the voice, and for Traylee to keep doing a good time."

That promise was on full display recently at Cowboy Town in Warm Springs, Georgia, where Oglesby delivered a I think that's what Country music is all about." crowd-pleasing live performance. It was a chance for fans to

Now, seventy years later, three of today's most powerful female voices - each carrying the flame of musical legacy - breathe new life into the song for a new generation of listeners.

Legendary rockers Foghat are still receiving high honors and praise from their loyal fans, and there is no sign of them "slowing" down anytime soon!



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

To top off an incredible year, Foghat is heading back to where it all began - the U.K. This November, the band will return to their homeland for the first time since the early '70s. They went on to do very well in the U.S. but playing the U.K. again has always been on their wish list, and now it is happening.

They will perform November 15 at the HRH Prog Festival in Great Yarmouth and November 16 at O2 Shepherd's Bush Empire in London (both with Asia featuring John Payne), before closing out at Manchester's Band on the Wall on November 18.

and Captured performed by multi-talented bassist/producer Nick Jameson, the mastermind behind both "Fool for the City" and 1977's legendary "Foghat Live" - these raw, high-energy recordings have been resurrected 50 years later. Mixed and mastered by Jameson himself at a studio in Reykjavik, Iceland, the result is a time capsule of pure Rock fury. The CD edition also includes two bonus live tracks and an interview with founding drummer Roger Earl and Jameson, diving into the making of Slow Ride and the magic behind the "Fool for the City" sessions. In fact, Jameson not only played on the record but also was their touring bass player with the original members, Lonesome Dave Peverett, Rod Price and Roger Earl, in 1975.

Their most recent studio album, "Sonic Mojo," with the (lead/slied guitar), Scott Holt (lead vocals/guitar), and Rodney O'Quinn (bass), dropped in November 2023 and debuted at #1 on the Billboard Blues Album chart, holding steady in the Top 10 for an incredible 34 weeks. Proof that Foghat's blend of Blues, Boogie, and Rock still hits as hard as ever.

And the Slow Ride continues. The band is back in the studio recording their next studio album, due out in 2026. Their current "SLOW RIDE 50TH Anniversary" tour continues through 2025 with their 2026 'TWANG & BANG" Tour getting ready to



Their voices blend with effortless charm, adding new color to track where Thomas Rhett takes a "lighthearted look at aging, ego, and the cold, hard truth that time catches up with everyone"



"Niall and I have been buddies for six or seven years now. Anytime I'm over in the U.K. or he's in Nashville, we always try to link up. We'd talked about doing something together for a long time, but I never imagined it would be this song. I was at the Masters this year and went to hang out with Niall and Noah Kahan, and out of nowhere Niall goes, 'I'm so mad you didn't ask me to sing on Old Tricks.' I said, 'Man, you were the last person I would've thought would even like this one!' He kept texting me about it after and he knew all the words," Thomas

Rhett says. "With how fired up he was and his connection with Blake, it felt like a full-circle moment and turned into something really fun. I'm pumped it's finally out there and hope y'all love it as much as we loved making it."

"I've known Thomas Rhett for years now, and every time Lonesome Dave Peverett, "Gonna roll 'til I'm old, Gonna rock we're in the same city, we end up catching up like no time's passed. I actually heard Old Tricks by accident one day when I was in the studio with my friend and producer Julian Bunetta who was working on the song. It came on and I was instantly hooked. 



In October, musicians, industry executives and politicians packed into the open-air café at the brand new Museum of Christian & Gospel Music. They spilled onto the downtown Nashville sidewalk, mere blocks away from historic churches and Country stars' raucous tourist bars. It was a ceremony many years in the making.

There is an institution devoted to Black Gospel in St. Louis, one for white Southern Gospel in Pigeon Forge, and the Gospel Music Association (GMA) has been inducting originators from both those traditions, along with Christian Pop pioneers, into its Hall of Fame since 1972.

But for the entirety of those 50-plus years, the hall's been without a physical location. Past efforts to build one failed. But Jackie Patillo, the first woman and person of color to lead the GMA, pushed to create a comprehensive home for these musical histories once and for all.



"The word 'Gospel' music really encompasses a message with lots of different sounds, so it's been awesome to see how we've gone from the hymns to choruses to Rap music and the Contemporary Christian music industry," said Patillo.

The Curse of K.K. Hammond Raises the Dead this Halloween with Haunting New Single and Video 'Ain't No Grave'

This Halloween, the swamp comes alive once more as The Curse of K.K. Hammond channels the ghostly essence of Delta Blues in her chilling new release, *Ain't No Grave*. The single features fellow dark Americana artists David & the Devil and Kaspar "Berry" Rapkin, together crafting a spellbinding rendition of the traditional Gospel-Blues standard that blurs the line between the living and the dead.

Produced by David & the Devil and K.K. Hammond, and mixed and mastered by Kaspar "Berry" Rapkin, this version of the Brother Claude Ely classic is steeped in atmosphere, a fusion of swamp-born slide guitars, haunting harmonies, and brooding percussion. What emerges is a soundscape that feels both ancient and cinematic, drenched in the grit and mysticism of Southern gothic storytelling.

Ain't No Grave marks the trio's first full collaboration, following a string of individual successes. Hammond's duet with David & the Devil, Death Roll Blues, reached the top of the iTunes Blues charts in both the UK and the U.S., landing at #7



on the Billboard Blues Chart. Their follow-up, *The Ballad of Lampshade Ed*, has now surpassed 700,000 Spotify streams. Meanwhile, Hammond's work with Rapkin on *Walk With Me Through the Fire* and *Heart Shaped Box* both climbed to #1 on iTunes and earned recognition at multiple international film festivals.

Bringing their creative chemistry to one stage, the trio transforms *Ain't No Grave* into an otherworldly journey through shadow and soul. The accompanying video - filmed by Hammond, David Hick, Rapkin, and Jellybean Hammond, and edited by David & the Devil alongside Justin Ramell - visually captures that descent into the underworld, painting a vivid portrait of resurrection amid the ruins.

With her unmistakable blend of grit, vulnerability, and Blues sorcery, The Curse of K.K. Hammond continues to expand the reach of Gothic Blues far beyond tradition. *Ain't No Grave* isn't merely a cover; it's a cinematic rebirth - proof that some songs, and some spirits, simply won't stay buried.







OZARK GYPSY (Scott Lamb)

Country music whose life and lyrics are inseparable - each chord strummed from the soul of the Ozarks, each verse a testament to grit, grace, and God.

Born in Wichita, Kansas in 1974, Scott grew up in a trailer park with four brothers, a guitar, and a dream. His early years were steeped in hardship, but also in music - his grandfather Leon Lamb, a gifted dobro and guitar player, was his first mentor and hero. "He could've been a Country star," Scott says, "but he chose family." That legacy of sacrifice and song became the bedrock of Scott's identity.

At 18, the Lamb family moved to Arkansas, where Scott embraced the cowboy life - riding bulls, chasing rodeos, and eventually discovering his true calling as a songwriter. "The Ozarks taught me who I was," he reflects. "I lived the songs before I ever wrote them."

Scott's music is unapologetically authentic. He calls it True Gut Music - a style born from lived experience, not studio polish. Influenced by legends like Merle Haggard, Billy Joe Shaver, Guy Clark, and underground icons like Mickey Womack, Scott's songs are steeped in Outlaw Country tradition but carry a spiritual undertone that's uniquely his.

His most requested track, *Hard Times in Arkansas*, written two decades ago in Scotland, Arkansas, is a haunting ode to a town stripped of its timber industry and forced into survival. "I worked for a man with no electricity or plumbing," Scott recalls. "He paid me in vegetables and weed. That's when the song took shape." Today, it's a favorite on underground radio and social media.

Scott sharpened his storytelling at KHPQ 92 in Clinton, Arkansas, where he worked as an account executive, writing and producing radio ads. "It taught me how to grab attention," he says. "Every day was creative writing boot camp." He met celebrities, played in cover bands, and eventually rejected the rise of Pop-Country by penning his own songs, never looking back.



Whether jamming with beginners or legends, Scott's ethos is simple: music is for everyone. He's played Grandpa Jones' banjo in a cabin jam session with Mark Jones, nearly broke the Guinness record for longest guitar session, and still finds joy in hearing strangers sing his lyrics back to him. One of his most cherished memories? Meeting Johnnie and


One of his most cherished memories? Meeting Johnnie and Donnie Van Zant in Fort Worth, Texas in 2006. "They signed my guitar, invited me to their show, and planted the seed of Jesus Christ in me," he says. "That moment changed everything."

Scott's music is a ministry as much as it is art. "I'm bringing people to Christ in some bad places," he shared recently during his Outlaw Campfire Music Tour across Arkansas. His YouTube channel, Ozark Gypsy, features original songs, philosophical musings, and collaborations with local musicians.

He's a blue-collar, God-fearing country boy who lives by the creed: "I live the songs I write and write the songs I live." His mission? To inspire solo singers, believers and non-believers alike, and to challenge the rise of AI-generated music with something real, raw, and rooted.

Ozark Gypsy isn't chasing awards - he's chasing truth.

And in doing so, he's leading a revival. One song, one soul, one story at a time.

or a generation, the name Tiffany conjures images of denim jackets, mall tours, and the infectious, chart-topping chorus of I Think We're Alone Now. As a teenager, Tiffany Darwish was a global phenomenon, achieving what few artists ever do. But nearly four decades later, the artist once defined by 80s Pop is proving she's more than a nostalgic teen icon. She's a seasoned musician who has traded the bright lights of Pop for the rugged soul of Rock, the slow pace of Nashville, and an entirely new career path - as a chef.

The legendary Pop star earned two U.S. number one hit singles with I Think We're Alone Now and Could've Been and set a record as the youngest female artist to top the Billboard charts with her debut album. In 2000, Billboard ranked Tiffany's album "The Color of Silence" as one of the 'Top Ten Best Albums of the Year.' In 2011, she released her Country-Pop LP "Rose Tattoo," embracing the music she grew up on. Her 2016 critically acclaimed "A Million Miles" marked the first time Tiffany had been a co-producer on her own record. As a writer and co-producer on her 10th studio album, "Pieces of Me," Tiffany fused elements of Rock and Pop,

while still showcasing her trademark tendency for big radio In 2021, Tiffany headlined the North American Shadows tour friendly choruses. Now she's ready to bare her soul and invite listeners to walk with her into the light via her 11th studio album, "Shadows." She has sold more than 15 million albums to date.

Tiffany has obtained a long and storied career. She released the 2019 version of I Think We're Alone Now and the music video has more than two million views. She performed 55 shows in 53 cities for more than 600,000 fans on the North American Mixtape Tour with New Kids on the Block, Debbie Gibson, Salt-N-Pepa and Naughty By Nature. In the fall of 2019, Tiffany kicked off her 40-city, North American Pieces of Me Tour with rave reviews for her new Pop/Rock sound and live show.

She also digitally released her EP "Pieces of Me: Unplugged" and her first, original Christmas song, Angels.



While the Pop princess moniker has stuck, Tiffany's heart has always leaned toward a grittier sound. "When I was 14, I had this vision of me being Stevie Nicks or Janis Joplin," she said, adding that her latest work is the kind of music she always wanted to make.

Today, her sound is a vibrant mix of Rock and Countrytinged Pop. Her most recent albums, including 2022's "Shadows," showcase a powerful voice backed by electric guitars, drawing inspiration from bands like the Foo Fighters and Blondie.

Far from running from her past, Tiffany is re-embracing it on her own terms. She has been in the studio re-recording and reimagining her biggest hits, like I Think We're Alone



Now and Could've Been, to fit her mature Rock aesthetic. In 2025, Tiffany released her latest single, Feel My Love.

The biggest change in Tiffany's life, however, is her address. She left the hustle of Los Angeles decades ago for a quieter life outside of Nashville, Tennessee. The rural setting, she says, is where she truly feels at home and grounded.

She still maintains an active touring schedule - often alongside fellow 80s icons at nostalgia festivals - but when she's off the road, she's focused on her community, her son, and her second creative passion: cooking.

Tiffany has seamlessly blended her public life with her love for food. She founded the food community Let's Food With Tiffany and has appeared on several reality cooking programs. What started as a hobby and "therapy" has turned into a legitimate business venture.

Her future plans include publishing multiple cookbooks, such as Breakfast with Tiffany and a project called "Pop Life," which promises to "zhuzh up" nostalgic 80s-era comfort food and snacks.

Now in her 50s, Tiffany Darwish is an artist who has proven that reinvention is a continuous process. She has managed to navigate the notoriously fickle music industry by not only embracing the hit that made her famous, but by finally proving she's the Rock-and-Roll force she always dreamed of being.

Catch Tiffany on tour next year and look out for her new cookbook releases.

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

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

ew musical groups have managed to capture the spirit of Christmas quite like Pentatonix. The Grammy-winning American a cappella ensemble from Arlington, Texas, has become synonymous with holiday music, blending dazzling harmonies, inventive arrangements, and a sense of theatrical joy that has earned them global acclaim. Since their formation in 2011, Pentatonix has risen from reality television winners to international icons, collecting three Grammy Awards, multiple Billboard chart-topping albums, and even a star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame.

Their journey is remarkable not only for its longevity but also for the way they have carved out a unique niche in the music industry. In an era dominated by digital production and electronic beats, Pentatonix has proven that the human voice alone - layered, percussive, and harmonically complex - can command arenas, dominate streaming charts, and become a staple of holiday playlists worldwide.

A New Chapter: Christmas in the City

In October 2025, Pentatonix unveiled their latest holiday project, "Christmas in the City." Released under Republic Records, this 16-track album represents a bold new chapter in their career. While the group has long been celebrated for their purely vocal arrangements, this album marks the first time they have incorporated instruments into their holiday repertoire.

Scott Hoying, one of the founding members, explained the creative vision: the group leaned into a "big band orchestral sound that Dean Martin did back in the day," aiming for something whimsical, jazzy, cozy, and classy. The concept was to capture the magic and theatrical energy of the holiday season in New York City - a place where Christmas

lights, Broadway flair, and timeless standards converge.

The album features a mix of festive classics and fresh originals. Among the highlights are the witty single Bah Humbug and the romantic Snowing in Paris, a collaboration with vocalist JoJo. Perhaps most striking is their partnership with the Frank Sinatra estate, which allowed Pentatonix to feature a neverbefore-heard recording of Sinatra on I've Got My Love to Keep Me Warm. This blending of past and present underscores Pentatonix's ability to honor tradition while pushing creative boundaries.

Building a Holiday Legacy

Pentatonix's reputation as quintessential Christmas group" did not happen overnight. Their holiday journey began with the "PTXmas" EP in 2012, followed by the runaway success of

"That's Christmas to Me" in 2014, which became one of the Roots and Rise best-selling holiday albums of the decade. Two years later, "A Pentatonix Christmas" cemented their dominance, with Hoying, Mitch Grassi, and Kirstin Maldonado joined forces. tracks like Mary, Did You Know?, Hallelujah, and Carol of Later, Kevin Olusola brought his signature "celloboxing" (a the Bells becoming modern seasonal standards.

Their arrangements showcase not only vocal precision but also a mastery of vocal percussion and harmonic layering. Songs like Little Drummer Boy highlight their ability to transform familiar carols into dramatic, emotionally charged performances. For many fans, Pentatonix's versions of these classics have become definitive, rivaling the originals in popularity and cultural resonance.

The Christmas in the City Tour

To support the new album, Pentatonix launched their most ambitious holiday tour yet: Christmas in the City. Beginning November 8, 2025, in West Valley City, Utah, the 24-show arena tour runs through December 22, culminating in a two-night finale in their hometown of Fort Worth, Texas.

The tour has been described as their "boldest, brightest, and biggest" production to date. Audiences are treated to a blend of fan favorites, nostalgic classics, and theatrical flourishes designed to evoke the magic of Christmas. From dazzling stage design to carefully curated setlists, the group balances beloved staples like Little Drummer Boy with new material from "Christmas in the City."

Kirstin Maldonado, one of the founding members, explained the delicate balance: "We brought back some of our super classics - like Little Drummer Boy - while also adding new material." For Pentatonix, the challenge lies in honoring tradition while offering audiences something fresh each year.



Pentatonix's story began in Austin, Texas, when Scott blend of cello and beatboxing), and Avi Kaplan rounded out the quintet. Their big break came in 2011 when they won Season 3 of NBC's The Sing-Off.

From there, the group built a discography that includes "PTX, Vol. 1" (2012), their self-titled album "Pentatonix" (2015, which reached No. 1 on the Billboard charts), and a string of holiday releases that solidified their brand. Their YouTube channel, boasting over 20.5 million subscribers and more than 6.6 billion views, has been a crucial platform for their success, allowing them to reach audiences far beyond traditional radio and television.

Avi Kaplan departed in 2017, with Matt Sallee stepping in to continue the group's journey. Despite lineup changes, Pentatonix has maintained its signature sound and continued to evolve creatively.

Awards and Accolades

Pentatonix's influence is reflected in their accolades. In addition to three Grammy wins and five nominations, they have earned recognition from Billboard, Kids' Choice Awards, and countless industry outlets. Their star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame symbolizes not only their popularity but also their role in redefining contemporary a cappella.

Christmas as Creative Canvas

For Pentatonix, Christmas is more than a season - it is a creative canvas. The group often speaks about the joy, tradition, and musical magic that inspire their holiday projects. Kirstin Maldonado has shared her playful perspective on when to start listening to Christmas music: "You can start in the 'ber' months - September, October, November, December. A long time ago, I would have said, don't do it before Halloween... but now Christmas is so year-round that the 'ber' months feel appropriate."

Scott Hoying echoes this sentiment, noting that their Frank Sinatra. By blending reverence for tradition with modern arrangements, Pentatonix has created a holiday repertoire that feels both timeless and fresh.

Looking Ahead: Europe 2026

Pentatonix shows no signs of slowing down. In 2026, they will embark on a major European tour, their first in several years. Kicking off April 7 in Budapest at the MVM Dome, the tour will span cities including Prague, Warsaw, Hamburg, Berlin, Frankfurt, Cardiff, London, Amsterdam, and Oslo, before concluding May 3 in Stockholm at the Avicii Arena.

This tour promises a mix of fan-favorite hits and new arrangements, reaffirming Pentatonix's commitment to bringing their unique sound to audiences worldwide.

Icons of Vocal Artistry

Pentatonix has redefined what a cappella can be. Their ability to dominate mainstream charts with vocal-only music is unprecedented, and their collaborations - from Dolly Parton to Frank Sinatra's estate - demonstrate their versatility. With their Walk of Fame star, Grammy recognition, and continued innovation, Pentatonix has cemented their place as icons of vocal artistry.

As the holiday season unfolds, their music continues to sound draws inspiration from legends like Nat King Cole and serve as a soundtrack for joy, nostalgia, and celebration. For millions of fans, Christmas simply wouldn't sound the same without Pentatonix.






Artist Spotlight BOB AUGUSTINE

Music Famous" has presented a yearlong all-star celebration for the Opry's 100 Birthday by showcasing Country music's past, present and future. Over the last century, the Opry has introduced Country music to fans worldwide. Its stage has witnessed iconic moments between artists and celebrities and its broadcast has evolved from radio, to television, to digital. Throughout it all, the Opry has been a vehicle to bring people together through good times and bad. We join the celebration by honoring the history and special moments of the past 100 years of the Grand Ole Opry.

A radio-loving founder of National Life and Accident Insurance Company convinced the company to launch its own radio station: WSM – named after their slogan, "We Shield Millions." National Life built a small studio in its downtown Nashville office. WSM went live for the first time on October 5, 1925. On the night of November 28, 1925, announcer George D. Hayes introduced fiddle player Uncle Jimmy Thompson as the first performer on a new show called "The WSM Barn Dance."

In December of 1927, Hayes proclaimed on-air, "For the past hour we have been listening to the music taken largely from the Grand Opera, but from now on we will present the Grand Ole Opry." The new name for the WSM Barn Dance stuck. Now, 100 years later, the show Hayes started is still going strong. Along the way, the station moved to Opryland Hotel and is currently at the Acuff House. It has launched countless Country music careers and led the way for Nashville to become Music City.

Early Opry performers such as Roy Acuff, Minnie Pearl, Ernest Tubb, and Bill Monroe became musical foundations for the Opry during its years in residence at the historic Ryman Auditorium, later welcoming to the stage artists who would become entertainment icons including Johnny Cash, Loretta Lynn, Dolly Parton, and Bill Anderson. "The Grand Ole Opry, to a Country singer, is what Yankee Stadium is to a baseball player. Broadway to an actor. It's the top of the ladder, the top of the mountain. You don't just play the Opry; you live it," stated Bill Anderson who is the longest serving Opry member with 64 years.

Some of the Grand Ole Opry's most historic moments happened inside the Ryman Auditorium: Hank Williams made his debut. Patsy Cline, Loretta Lynn, Willie Nelson, Jeannie Seely, and Dolly Parton joined the Opry family. Elvis Presley made his only Opry appearance. Johnny Cash became a member and met his wife, June Carter at the Ryman Auditorium.

The Opry said goodbye to the Ryman Auditorium on Friday night, March 15, 1974. George Morgan closed out the show with *Candy Kisses*. After the Opry, Johnny and June Carter Cash sang *Will The Circle Be Unbroken* on the following Grand Ole Gospel Time to end the evening. The next night, President Richard Nixon joined Roy Acuff on stage at the Grand Ole Opry House. The night featured a packed lineup. They kept the traditions of the Ryman by bringing a 6-foot circle of hardwood that was






taken from the Ryman and placed center stage at the Opry House. The Opry returns to the Ryman each year for a wintertime run.

Many artists have stood in that historic circle from Connie Smith, The Oak Ridge Boys, Reba McEntire, Trace Adkins, Dolly Parton, Dierks Bentley, Vince Gill, Martina McBride, Brad Paisley, Ricky Skaggs, Marty Stuart, Mel Tillis, Garth Brooks, Carrie Underwood, Alan Jackson, The Gatlin Brothers, Randy Travis, Josh Turner, Jamey Johnson, T. Graham Brown, Scotty McCreery, Lainey Wilson, newest members Steve Earle and Kathy Mattea and many more artists that are a part of the Opry family. Opry member Garth Brooks says, "The Grand Ole Opry is the pinnacle of what I do. Nothing will ever match being a member of the Grand Ole Opry."

Over the decades, the Opry continued to grow and evolve. The Opry was televised live for the first time on March 4, 1978, as part of a PBS fundraising special, but the show wouldn't start regular television broadcasts until 1985. The 1990s brought some of the Opry's most monumental moments: Minnie Pearl and Jimmy Dickens celebrated their 50th anniversary with the show and Roy Acuff made his final Opry performance, one month before he passed. Throughout the 2000s, the show and its cast paid tribute to fallen members Hank Williams, Waylon Jennings, and Minnie Pearl. In 2002, the Opry celebrated its 4000th consecutive Saturday Night broadcast.

In May of 2010, the venue was ravaged by a historic flood that forced the Opry House to close its doors for five months for restoration. The show pressed on at other venues across Nashville, including two former homes: War Memorial Auditorium and the Ryman. The Opry House was beautifully restored, and the show made its triumphant return on September 28 of that same year. The Grand Ole Opry celebrated 40 years at the Opry House on March 16, 2014, and in 2015, the show celebrated its 90th anniversary with a star-studded weekend-long birthday bash.

In March of 2020, COVID-19 forced the Grand Ole Opry to make the hard decision to temporarily cancel live audience shows. In a historic moment for the Opry, the Saturday Night Grand Ole Opry broadcast live without an audience, via Livestream. The show continued to broadcast live on WSM Radio and Circle TV, keeping the music playing and the circle unbroken. After seven months of performing without a live audience, in October of 2020, the





Opry kicked off its 95th anniversary by welcoming back 500 guests to the Opry House – and so began a month-long celebration of the Opry, Country music, its artists, and its fans. Once reopened, the Opry resumed its tradition of drawing both locals and tourists alike through its doors. It remains one of the top attractions in Nashville.

The Opry 100 celebration honors the artists, songs, and moments on the iconic stage that have defined the genre. With bigger shows, surprise guests, thrilling debuts, and tributes to legends who paved the way, while ushering in the next era of Country music making the Opry's best year yet.

For any Country music artist, their dream is to perform on the Grand Ole Opry. The highlight is when you become a member. That is the goal for an artist that has the love and respect of the Opry and its history. Here are some quotes from some Opry members:

Alan Jackson, who has been an Opry member for over 34 years shared his thoughts. "You think about people like Hank Williams, who stood on that spot of wood, and Mr. Acuff, and, of course, George Jones. And just about anybody you can think of who has made Country music has been on that stage. That's what makes you so nervous — to think about the historical part of the Opry and how it's played such a part in Country music. The ultimate dream when you're in Country music is to be asked to join the Grand Ole Opry. It's the cornerstone of Country music. I don't know if Nashville or Country music would exist if it wasn't for this foundation, and I'm proud to be a part of it."

"Becoming a member of the Grand Ole Opry is something I've wanted since I was a little girl," said Martina McBride. Eddie Montgomery from Montgomery Gentry said, "My dad always said, 'you know, no matter what awards you win, you haven't made it until you get to play the Opry and you're a part of the Opry." A quote from Brad Paisley says, "Pilgrims travel to Jerusalem to see the Holy Land, and the foundations of their faith. People go to Washington, D.C. to see the workings of government, and the foundation of our country. And fans flock to Nashville to see the foundation of Country music, the Grand Ole Opry."

Mark Wills, who became an official member of the Opry on January 11, 2019, recalls. "Out of every accolade that I have, becoming a Grand Ole Opry member is the highlight to everything. People who want to become Country singers have a standard and that standard is singing on





Darius Rucker recalls, "When I was asked if I wanted to perform on the Grand Ole Opry, I yelled, 'Are you kidding me?' I've been waiting for that my whole life. To be invited where so many of the greatest Country artists have performed is an honor, and I still can't believe it has been bestowed on me. Just to stand in the circle where so many greats have stood - Hank Williams, Kitty Wells, I just couldn't believe it."

Many artists have referred to the Opry as a family and their home. Opry member Ronnie Milsap stated, "I feel this is a family here, so kinda regardless of whatever happens in your life, you always can come home to the Grand Ole Opry, thank God." Family group the Isaacs became members over four years ago, Ben Isaacs recalls. "One of the biggest highlights of my career was being asked to become members of the Grand Ole Opry! When we were asked, that was the 96th year of the Grand Ole Opry. It's a very elite group and it's a very cool house that we get to live in."

Artists from genres beyond Country - like Pop, Rock, Soul, and Folk - have graced the Grand Ole Opry stage over the years, including, Kevin Costner, The Beach Boys, Kevin Bacon, Kenny Loggins, Steve Martin. CeCe Winan, Keb' Mo', Jason Isbell, MercyMe, Ringo Starr, Post Malone, Brandon Lake, Train and most recently Pop artist Sabrina Carpenter and many more who have performed on the Opry stage. Music legend James Taylor will make his Grand Ole Opry debut on Tuesday, November 11, 2025, as part of the Opry's 100th anniversary celebration.

Here are a few of the highlights during the Opry 100th birthday celebration:

NBC's "Opry 100: A Live Celebration" honored the Grand Ole Opry's centennial with a star-studded, three-hour broadcast hosted by Blake Shelton which aired on March 19, 2025. The landmark special paid tribute to 100 years of the Grand Ole Opry, the show that helped define Country music. It was a night where history was made on Country music's biggest stage, as millions tuned in to celebrate a century of the icons, the songs, the stories, and the performances that have shaped the genre. The broadcast is still available to stream on demand on Peacock.

100 Years of Grand Ole Opry: A Celebration of the Artists, the Fans, and the Home of Country Music, was released on April 15, 2025. This commemorative hardcover book is a richly illustrated tribute to the Opry's





century-long legacy, offering fans a behind-thescenes look at the institution that shaped country music.

The Grand Ole Opry presented "Opry 100 Honors," a series commemorating the Opry's centennial milestone. This series paid homage to the trailblazing artists who defined the Opry's first century and continue to inspire generations of Country musicians. "Opry 100 Honors" features live performances by today's top Country stars, celebrating the legacies of icons such as Loretta Lynn, Johnny Cash, June Carter Cash, Charlie Daniels, Roy Acuff, Minnie Pearl, and Bill Monroe. It's a celebration of the voices, stories, and traditions that built the Grand Ole Opry into the world's longest-running radio show and a cornerstone of American music.

It was the Opry's Rhinestone Milestone Birthday during all October with birthday shows and surprises. and more. If you haven't experienced the Opry, now is the time. Because you only turn 100 once!

For the 100th celebration, the Opry released "Opry 100: Country's Greatest Songs." It's a one-of-a-kind album featuring never-before-released performances - LIVE from the iconic Opry stage. The 20 tracks were chosen from the fan-voted list of 100 Greatest Songs. Listeners will hear Country legends in rare archival recordings, and today's biggest stars paying tribute with brand-new covers of the songs that shaped a genre. "The Opry 100: Country's Greatest Songs" will be available November 7th.

The Grand Ole Opry will mark the 100th anniversary of its historic inaugural broadcast with two special all-star shows on Friday, November 28, 2025. The milestone event celebrates a century of Country music history, showcasing performances unprecedented lineup of Opry members and legends. November 28th marks exactly 100 years since the evening a single fiddle note launched a legacy, more than 200 members, over 15,000 broadcasts, countless stars, millions of fans, and one enduring unbroken circle: the Opry family. The centennial performances are part of a broader "Opry 100" celebration spanning the entire year. This included various special shows, numerous Opry debuts, and the Opry's first international broadcast from the Royal Albert Hall in London on September 26, 2025.

The celebration continues into 2026 as the Grand Ole Opry will hold a special concert at Carnegie Hall on March 20, 2026, as part of the "United in Sound: America at 250" festival.

Celebrating the Legends

Whitney Houston stands among the most celebrated and influential vocalists in modern music history. Known simply as "The Voice," her soaring soprano and seamless fusion of Pop, Soul, R&B, and Gospel set a new standard for vocal excellence. Her music didn't just dominate global charts - it broke racial and gender barriers, reshaped the industry, and continues to inspire artists across generations.

This year marks the 40th anniversary of her career. We pay tribute to the music, the legacy, and the woman whose voice became a cultural landmark



Born into a lineage of musical royalty - daughter of Gospel legend Cissy Houston and cousin to Dionne Warwick - Whitney's prodigious talent was evident from the start. Under the guidance of Arista Records chief Clive Davis, her career was meticulously shaped for global superstardom.

Her 1985 debut, "Whitney Houston," became the best-selling female debut album of all time, delivering timeless hits like *Saving All My Love for You, How Will I Know*, and *Greatest Love of All*. Her 1987 follow-up, "Whitney," solidified her place in history, making her the first artist to score seven consecutive No. 1 singles on the Billboard Hot 100 - including the jubilant anthem *I Wanna Dance with Somebody (Who Loves Me)*.

Her most monumental achievement came with her film debut in 1992's The Bodyguard. The soundtrack remains the best-selling movie soundtrack of all time, anchored by her soul-stirring rendition of Dolly Parton's *I Will Always Love You*. The single became the best-selling by a female solo artist in history, cementing Houston's status as a global icon. Other standout albums include "I'm Your Baby Tonight" (1990) and the R&B-infused "My Love Is Your Love" (1998), which showcased her artistic evolution.

Houston's three-octave range, crystalline tone, and Gospel-rooted delivery - marked by her signature vocal runs - set her apart. Her 1991 Super Bowl performance of *The Star-Spangled Banner* is widely regarded as the definitive rendition, becoming a patriotic benchmark and charting as a

Top 20 single. Her accolades are staggering: six Grammy Awards, 22 American Music Awards, and a Guinness World Record as the most awarded female artist of all time.

But Whitney's influence transcends statistics. She was instrumental in breaking the color barrier for Black women in mainstream Pop and music video culture, particularly on MTV. Alongside Michael Jackson, she helped integrate the network's playlist, paving the way for future generations of Black female artists. Her image - carefully cultivated for crossover appeal - bridged R&B and Pop audiences worldwide.

Her vocal style, infused with raw emotion and technical brilliance, became the blueprint for nearly every major female vocalist who followed, from Mariah Carey and Céline Dion to Beyoncé and Jennifer Hudson.

Houston also proved that a recording artist could become a cinematic star. The Bodyguard remains a cultural touchstone, but she also shone in Waiting to Exhale and The Preacher's Wife, whose Gospel soundtrack became the best-selling Gospel album of all time, a testament to her spiritual roots.

Despite personal struggles later in life, Whitney's legacy is defined by the magnitude of her talent. She remains a towering figure, a true cultural icon whose music continues to resonate with timeless grace and emotional power.

In the fall of 2011, Whitney fulfilled a lifelong dream by bringing a remake of Sparkle to the screen, playing the role of Emma and serving as Executive Producer. The film was released in August 2012. She had also been developing a remake of a Judy Garland film and a sequel to Waiting to Exhale.

Her tragic passing on February 11, 2012, is still deeply felt by family, friends, and millions of fans worldwide. Her estate remains committed to preserving her legacy. In partnership with Sony Music's Legacy Recordings, they've released "Whitney Houston Live: Her Greatest Performances" (2014), "I Wish You Love: More From The Bodyguard" (2017), and "Whitney Houston 35th Anniversary Edition" (2020).

The 2018 documentary Whitney, directed by Academy Award winner Kevin Macdonald, offered an intimate portrait of her life and artistry. It was nominated for 'Best Music Film' at the GRAMMY Awards and Outstanding Documentary at the NAACP Image Awards.

Whitney Houston gave the world her voice - and in doing so, she gave us something eternal.

On August 9, 2025 - what would have been Whitney Houston's 62nd birthday - family, friends, and fans gathered at the St. Regis Hotel in Atlanta, Georgia, for The Whitney E. Houston Legacy of Love Gala. The event marked the 40th anniversary of her historic career (February 14, 1985 – February 14, 2025) and served as a heartfelt celebration of the woman whose voice defined generations.

Hosted by Entertainment Tonight's Kevin Frazier and Pat Houston, president of The Whitney E. Houston Legacy Foundation and executor of her estate, the four-hour gala featured musical performances, video tributes, a silent auction, and the presentation of college scholarships and grant awards. "The Whitney Houston Legacy of Love Gala was epic," said Pat Houston. "I know Whitney would have been pleased with the year-long celebration thus far. Whitney was the best, and she deserved the best. Millions of fans celebrate her every day, and we do not take that for granted. We will continue to honor her legacy and support the causes closest to her heart - music, children, young adults, and the global community."



In partnership with Primary Wave Music, the estate launched a series of commemorative events, including The Voice of Whitney: A Symphonic Celebration - a North American concert tour that reimagines Whitney's iconic vocals through new orchestral arrangements. Featuring original and remastered recordings, never-before-seen footage, and historic performances, the tour offers a one-of-a-kind experience narrated by Whitney herself.

The tour began September 20–21, 2025, and will continue across performing arts centers throughout 2025 and 2026. Its premiere took place August 30, 2024, at The Ravinia Festival with the Chicago Philharmonic, conducted by Sean Mayes.

The Kennedy Center followed with the National Symphony Orchestra under Steven Reineke on November 8, 2024.

On February 15, 2025, during Whitney's 40th anniversary week, the tour reached New York City's Town Hall, commemorating the 47th anniversary of her debut whitne performance there in 1978. At just 14, Whitney joined her nonpro mother Cissy Houston and brother Gary to sing *Tomorrow* cancer from Annie. That same song was performed again during the Town Hall concert, conducted by Sean Mayes and featuring the Pops of Color Orchestra, a 35-piece ensemble composed entirely of musicians of color, representing a wide range of Africa.

"We're thrilled about The Voice of Whitney tour and the excitement surrounding Whitney's 40th anniversary," said Pat Houston. "There's strong international interest, and we're exploring plans to take the tour abroad, where Whitney performed much of her career. This is a unique concert experience, and Whitney narrates the entire show."

Whitney's accolades remain unmatched. Guinness World Records named her the "most awarded female artist of all time," with 411 awards as of 2006. Her honors include six GRAMMYs, 16 Billboard Music Awards, 22 American Music Awards, two Emmy nominations (and one win), MTV VMAs in the U.S. and Europe, NAACP Image Awards, BET Awards, Soul Train Music Awards, and more. She was inducted into the Nickelodeon Kids' Choice Hall of Fame in

1996, received the Dove Award from the Gospel Music Association, and earned the Soul Train Quincy Jones Career Achievement Award in 1998.

True to her church upbringing, Whitney founded the Whitney Houston Foundation for Children, Inc. in 1989. The nonprofit addressed issues like homelessness, childhood cancer and AIDS, and self-empowerment. In 1995, the foundation received a VH1 Honor for its charitable work. A 1997 HBO concert raised over \$300,000 for the Children's Defense Fund, with outreach spanning from Newark to South Africa.


In 2020, the Whitney E. Houston Legacy Foundation was established to continue her mission: to rebuild lives, restore self-esteem, and repair images through grassroots programs for youth.


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
That same year, Whitney was inducted into the Rock & Roll Hall of Fame, recognized for her genre-defying fusion of Pop, R&B, and Gospel - the very roots of Rock & Roll. She also became the first African-American recording artist (male or female, solo or group) to earn three Diamond-time," with 411 awards as of 2006. Her honors include six

In the foothills of Mount Baldy, where mountain air hums with its own kind of music, Martin Maudal has quietly been building instruments - and stories - that sing with the pulse of humanity. A renowned luthier, producer, and Berklee College of Music graduate, Maudal's creative path took a striking turn when a simple idea to showcase his handmade guitars evolved into a deeply expressive musical collective: Baldy Crawlers.

riginally conceived as a marketing project for Maudal's custom-built instruments, Baldy Crawlers soon transcended its original purpose. "What's really fun is that because it began as a marketing tool for my guitars, we didn't limit ourselves to any genre," says Maudal. "In fact, I've got killer LA Latin Jazz cats - who've recorded Grammy-nominated stuff with Poncho Sanchez - doing corrido Folk songs." The result is a sound that's both borderless and grounded an alchemy of Folk, Americana, Jazz, and social commentary that reflects the eclectic spirit of its founder.

From Berklee to Baldy: A Musical **Journey Forged in Fire and Freedom**

Maudal's musical story began at Boston's famed Berklee College of Music, where he absorbed resonating with the same care that goes into his instruments. the language of Jazz and improvisation even as the punk movement erupted just outside its doors. "I spent many nights at the Rat, deep at the height of the punk movement," he recalls with a grin. "Maybe that explains everything." That duality - discipline meeting rebellion - has followed him ever since.

After college, Maudal found himself rubbing shoulders with some of music's most adventurous figures. He even auditioned for Frank Zappa, playing drums for the legendary icon for half an hour. "No, I didn't get the gig. Vinnie did," he laughs, referencing Zappa's future drummer Vinnie Colaiuta. But the experience left an indelible mark: a belief in experimentation, precision, and creative fearlessness.

Endurance, Empathy, and "Bring Me a Flower"

The Baldy Crawlers' latest release, Bring Me a Flower, encapsulates everything Maudal stands for as both craftsman and songwriter. Released on MTS Records, the song is a haunting, poetic protest wrapped in the language of folklore. Rooted in the legend of the Vigilantes Oscuros the "dark watchers" said to haunt the ridges of California's Santa Lucia Mountains - it tells the story of those who cross borders seeking hope and dignity, only to be met with cruelty and fear.

"The moment I saw the words Vigilantes Oscuros, the words for Bring Me a Flower started dropping on my head," Maudal



explains. "Songs happen in all kinds of ways, but this one was fully written in ten minutes." The song's emotional core came from a story about a woman whose mother left candy as offerings for the mysterious watchers and later returned to find a single flower laid in their place. "It turned out to be about more than mere anger," Maudal says. "It's about endurance and hope, and a future that includes those who sing."

Musically, the track blends Roots Americana and atmospheric folk, with Norrell Thompson delivering an evocative lead vocal, Elizabeth Hangan providing harmony, Ross Schodek on bass, Carl Byron on accordion, and Maudal weaving it all together on his handcrafted guitars. The result is a cinematic soundscape steeped in empathy, every note

The Craft and the Calling

For Maudal, the boundary between instrument and song is nearly invisible. "Artists have endorsed guitars they never touched or designed for decades," he notes. "But what if the artist built the guitar - shaped the very sound the song would live in? That's the soul of this project." His guitars, which have been exhibited at some of the most prestigious shows in the U.S. and Europe, are not just tools, they're companions in storytelling.

That ethos extends beyond the studio. Maudal recently co-curated Sound Formations, an acclaimed Claremont exhibition showcasing handcrafted musical instruments as art. That same reverence for creation hums through Baldy Crawlers' music. "Our mission is to celebrate the world we


> want to create and live in," he says. "Fans can expect to feel that and celebrate with us, and maybe be inspired to go out and do that themselves."


A Protest of Hope























THE ANTHEM THAT NEVER FADES

From the smoky clubs of New Jersey to the world's biggest stadiums, Bon Jovi has never just played music - they've lived it, bled it, and turned it into a legacy that spans generations. With a triumphant return to the stage and a star-studded new album, the band proves once again: Rock isn't dead - it's legendary.

t all began in 1983, when a young janitor named John a Bad Name, and Wanted Dead or Alive, Bon Jovi didn't just Francis Bongiovi Jr. was sweeping floors at top charts, they defined a decade. Manhattan's Power Station recording studio. But Jon Bon Jovi wasn't just cleaning, he was dreaming. After recording a demo of Runaway with session musicians, his raspy vocals and magnetic charisma caught fire on local radio. That spark led to the formation of a band with keyboardist David Bryan, drummer Tico Torres, bassist Alec John Such, and guitarist Richie Sambora.

Their self-titled debut arrived in 1984, but it was royalty. With anthems like Livin' on a Prayer, You Give Love generation.

Their fourth album, "New Jersey" (1988), delivered five Top 10 hits and solidified their global appeal. But fame came with fatigue, and the band took a break in the early '90s. During that time, Jon released "Blaze of Glory," earning a Golden Globe and an Oscar nomination. When Bon Jovi returned with "Keep the Faith" (1992) and "These Days" (1995), their sound had matured - more introspective, more grounded. Then came "Crush" (2000), and with it, It's My "Slippery When Wet" (1986) that catapulted them into Rock Life, a defiant anthem that introduced Bon Jovi to a new

Their genre-bending single Who Says You Can't Go Home (2006) made history as the first Rock song to top the Country charts, earning them a Grammy and proving their versatility. Over the decades, Bon Jovi has sold more than 130 million records, performed over 3,000 concerts in 50 countries, and earned dozens of major awards. But their impact goes far beyond numbers.

underdog. From the blue-collar grit of Livin' on a Prayer to the rallying cry of We Weren't Born to Follow, their songs speak to perseverance, loyalty, and the fight to keep going

when the odds say quit. "We weren't just writing songs," Jon said in a 2024 interview. "We were writing survival guides."

The bond between Jon, David Bryan, and Tico Torres has endured decades of touring, personal loss, and reinvention. Though Richie Sambora left the band in 2013, Jon continues to speak of him with respect. "Richie's part of our story," he said. "We built this thing together." Their chemistry isn't just musical, it's spiritual. They've weathered storms and stayed true to their roots.

Bon Jovi's lyrics often echo biblical themes - redemption, sacrifice, hope. Keep the Faith could be a sermon. Dry County is a lament. Amen is practically a prayer. "I'm not a preacher," Jon

once said. "But I believe in the power of words to heal and to challenge."

After vocal cord surgery in 2022, Jon faced the possibility of never singing again. But in 2025, he emerged with "Forever (Legendary Edition)" - a reimagined version of their 2024 album featuring Bruce Springsteen, Jelly Roll, Avril Lavigne, Robbie Williams, and more. Springsteen lent harmonica to Hollow Man, a haunting meditation on identity and mortality. Jelly Roll's duet on Living Proof adds raw emotion, while Red, White and Jersev celebrates Bon Jovi's roots.

The Forever Tour kicks off in 2026, with stops at Madison Square Garden, Murrayfield Stadium, Croke Park, and Wembley. Jon's return to full-strength vocals marks a victory over adversity. "I'm not going out half-strength," he said. "I'm going out on top." Fans can expect a mix of classics, deep cuts, and new material, with over 40 songs reportedly in rotation.

The announcement of the tour sparked a wave of nostalgia and excitement across social media. Fans from Brazil to Belfast shared stories of first concerts, tattoo tributes, and how Bon Jovi's music helped them through heartbreak, loss, and triumph. "Bon Jovi raised me," one fan tweeted. "Now I get to raise my kids on them."

Beyond the music, Jon Bon Jovi's philanthropic work through the JBJ Soul Foundation has built homes, fed families, and restored dignity. The foundation's Soul Kitchens offer gourmet meals with no prices - guests pay what they can or volunteer. "We're not just giving people a bed," Jon said. "We're giving them dignity."

Though Bon Jovi rarely labels their music as Christian Bon Jovi's music has always been a soundtrack for the rock, their lyrics often reflect spiritual conviction. Jon has spoken openly about his Catholic upbringing and how faith informs his worldview. "I believe in God. I believe in grace. And I believe music can be a ministry."

Their concerts often feel like revival meetings - thousands of voices singing in unison, hands raised, hearts open. They've performed at benefit concerts around the world and earned humanitarian honors alongside their musical accolades.

Bon Jovi isn't just a band, they're a movement. From Sayreville to Wembley, their journey mirrors the hopes and heartbreaks of millions. They've evolved from glam rockers to cultural architects, and through it all, they've never lost their voice - even when Jon literally did.

"I had to relearn how to sing," he said. "But I never forgot why I sing."

With "Forever" and the Forever Tour, Bon Jovi isn't just returning, they're reigniting. Their legacy isn't about resting on laurels. It's about rising again. "I'm not chasing applause," Jon said. "I'm chasing truth."

And that truth is this: Bon Jovi's music will outlive the spotlight because it was never about fame, it was about fire. The fire to believe, to endure, to love, and to live.

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
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From Cullyhanna to Country Stages Worldwide, One Irish Voice Finds Her Way Back to the Song

In the quiet village of Cullyhanna, nestled in the rolling hills of Ireland, a little girl once sat behind a keyboard while her mother played bass and her father strummed guitar. A local drummer rounded out the rhythm section, and together, they became a family band that brought music to bars, weddings, funerals, and every celebration in between.

"I started singing when I was nine," says Mary Hoey, her voice warm with memory. "We went out gigging every weekend. I loved traveling around and singing, but when I turned seventeen, I gave it up. I just wanted to enjoy time with my friends."

That decision, though temporary, marked the first pause in a lifelong love affair with music. After marrying and starting a family, Mary felt the pull again. "Singing was always in my heart," she says. "I found myself longing to go back."

She returned to the stage with her parents for a time, but eventually stepped out on her own, performing with backing tracks. Then came COVID - and like so many artists, Mary's live performances came to a halt. But the music didn't stop.

"I took to posting videos on Facebook," she recalls. "It was a way to stay connected, to keep singing, even when the world went quiet."

Mary's musical compass has always pointed toward one name: Keith Whitley. "I remember sitting in the back of my parents' car coming home from a gig," she says. "This song about rain came on the radio - I'm No Stranger to the Rain and I was instantly mesmerized. The deep velvet tones in that TV, and in 2024, her original song What About You won voice were singing to me."

For weeks, she searched Country radio, waiting for the mystery voice to return. When the DJ finally named him -Keith Whitley - Mary's world shifted. "From then on, he's been my number one. I bought all his records. I learned all his songs. Even his unreleased music is incredible."

very honest and very true," she says. "You believed time I heard that song, it reminded me of her. I made a everything he sung. You believed he was singing to you, and promise to myself that someday I'd get to cover it."

That dream took on flesh in what Mary calls the highlight of her career: a duet with Keith Whitley himself.

Through Facebook, connected with Keith's brother, Bluegrass artist Dwight Whitley. "I asked him if he'd mind me recording When You Say Nothing At All as a duet with Keith," she says. "To my absolute delight, he said yes."

With the help of videographer Troy Elder, Mary filmed herself in front of a green screen, carefully studying Keith's original video to match his movements and mood. The result is a hauntingly beautiful blackand-white video where Mary and Keith appear to sing to each other across time.

"It's so magical," she says. "Maybe even a little haunting. But it's incredibly beautiful. I absolutely love it, and I can't see anything surpassing it. I'll be eternally grateful to Dwight and Troy for making that dream come true."

very difficult for people in the know to take you seriously that you can actually write a song," she admits. "And it's hard to get gigs in larger venues that book mainstream artists. It definitely takes a lot of luck to get ahead in this business."

But the moments of recognition make it all worthwhile. As a child, she won karaoke competitions and talent shows, once using her prize money to buy a full PA system. "That allowed me to go out gigging on my own," she says.

Her first major award came from across the Atlantic. "It was 'Artist of the Year,' mailed from the USA by a wonderful man named Tom Ousley," she says. "He became a fantastic friend. He passed away earlier this year, and I miss him

dearly. That was my first proper award, and I'll be forever grateful."

In recent years, Mary's accolades have grown. She received an Inspirational Award from Ireland's Hot Country 'Original Song of the Year' in Holland. During the pandemic, she reached the semi-finals of the Irish TV show Glór Tíre, performing her original Time Don't Change a Thing live on TV8.

Mary's latest single, a cover of Sherrie Austin's Streets of Heaven, carries a deeply personal weight. "It's very dear But it wasn't just the sound. It was the sincerity. "He was to me," she says quietly. "I lost a little girl myself. The first

> The song has resonated with listeners and found a home on radio playlists. "It's a heartwarming ballad with a touching story," she says. "And paired with the tenderness of my vocals, I hope it hits a nerve with people."

> Mary's talents extend beyond singing. Two years ago, she hosted a six-week segment on Ireland's Hot Country TV called The All American Country Music Show, broadcast around the world. 
> For Mary Hoey, music isn't about fame or fortune. It's about feeling. It's about faith. It's about the sacred space between singer and listener.

> And for Mary Hoey, that passion has never stopped flowing.




From Coal Oil Lamps to Country Gospel Lights

Born Peggy Cooper in the hills of Sandy Flat, Whitley County, Kentucky, her story begins in a humble two-room wooden house lit by coal oil lamps. "My daddy was milking a cow one morning when he heard a baby crying," she recalls with a chuckle. "I guess he ran to the house because he knew mother was expecting!"

The first girl among three older brothers and two younger sisters, Jane and Mary Jo, Peggy grew up surrounded by music

and faith. Her mother, Ethel Cooper, taught herself piano and encouraged the girls to sing. Together, they became The Cooper Sisters, harmonizing at church, school, and even on WNOX's Mid-Day Merry Go Round and Archie Campbell's TV and radio show.

After her sisters married and moved away, Peggy stepped into solo ministry in 1975, though she never imagined she'd be a soloist. Her voice, however, carried the conviction of someone who had walked with Jesus through every season. She balanced her music career with work as a lab and X-ray



technician, EMT, and devoted wife to Donald Inks, raising two daughters while singing the Gospel.

Her original songs - Just Over The Next Hill, What Kind Of Games Do Children Play In Heaven, Jesus Is My Best Friend, and Ain't No Denominations In Heaven - found radio success and resonated with audiences across the country. But it was I Ain't No Spring Chicken Anymore that became her most requested hit, opening the World Chicken Festival year after year.

Peggy's voice and style have drawn comparisons to Kitty Wells, Tammy Wynette, Dolly Parton, and especially Loretta

Lynn. "I've always been compared to Loretta," she says. "It was an honor to record my favorite Loretta Lynn songs." That Fayette, Alabama was a highlight for many. "Peggy has been tribute album cemented her nickname: The Loretta Lynn of Gospel Music.

Candlelight in a Dark World

Among her many accolades, one stands out: the Candlelight Award from Music City Christian Fellowship, presented at the Grand Ole Opry House during the 39th Annual Sunday Mornin' Country show. Engraved with Matthew 5:16, "For letting your light shine in a dark world," the award honored Peggy's life not just as a singer, but as a beacon of faith.

She shared the stage with legends like Jeanie Seely, LuLu Roman, and Cowboy Joe Babcock, and has served faithfully on the Fellowship's board alongside her husband Don.

A Marriage Built on Ministry

Peggy and Don Inks recently celebrated 61 years of marriage - indeed a testament to enduring love and shared purpose. "Don is my biggest fan," Peggy says. "I couldn't do this without his support." Though health challenges have slowed their travels, the couple still surprises friends by showing up at churches and conventions, offering encouragement and joy wherever they go.

Their appearance at this year's Gospel Music Fanfair in part of Fanfair since the beginning," one attendee said. "Seeing her again was like seeing family."


A Hall of Fame Moment



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The Christmas Quilt

There are certain sounds that mark the season: the crackle of wrapping paper, the faint hiss of tape pulled from its roll, the clatter of ornaments as they're carefully (or not so carefully) hung on the tree. But in our family, Christmas always began with the sound of Grandma's sewing machine.

It wasn't fancy - a sturdy Singer that had seen more decades than most of us had birthdays. Every December, she'd set it up in the corner of the living room, right beside the wood stove, and begin stitching together what she called "the Christmas quilt."

Now, this quilt wasn't meant to be slept under. It was too lumpy, too uneven, and frankly too colorful for that. It was a patchwork of memories: squares cut from old flannel shirts, faded aprons, worn-out choir robes, and even the occasional pair of jeans that had seen better days. Grandma said each piece carried a story, and when stitched together, those stories became a testimony of God's faithfulness through the years.

As children, we didn't fully understand. To us, it was just a funny-looking blanket that smelled faintly of cinnamon and cedar. But as we grew older, we realized that quilt was more than fabric - it was a family history, stitched with love and laughter.

The Year of the Lopsided Angel

One Christmas in particular stands out. It was 1987, the year Grandma decided to add a patch from the church's old Christmas pageant costumes. The angel robes had been retired after one too many mishaps - including the infamous "Lopsided Angel Incident."

My cousin Billy had been cast as Gabriel, a role he took very seriously until his halo slipped mid-performance and landed squarely over his nose. The congregation roared with laughter, and Billy, ever the showman, delivered his lines with the halo dangling like a golden mustache.

Grandma, never one to waste good fabric, snipped a piece from that robe and stitched it into the quilt. "Because even angels get a little crooked sometimes," she said with a wink. That patch became our favorite. Whenever the quilt was unfolded, someone would inevitably point to the angel square and retell the story, laughter echoing through the room.

The Quilt as a Gathering Place

By the time the quilt was ten years old, it had become a fixture of our Christmas celebrations. It wasn't draped over a bed or folded neatly in a closet. No, it was spread out on the living room floor, right in front of the tree.

That quilt was where cousins sprawled to play board games, where uncles napped after too much turkey, and where Grandma herself sat cross-legged, handing out gifts with a twinkle in her eye.

It was also where we prayed. Every Christmas Eve, before the stockings were hung and the cookies set out, Grandma would gather us on the quilt. She'd remind us that Christmas wasn't about presents or pageants, but about the greatest gift ever given - Christ Himself.

Her voice would tremble as she read from Luke 2, but her conviction never wavered. And though we sometimes squirmed or giggled, we knew those moments mattered. The quilt wasn't just fabric; it was holy ground.



The Year the Quilt Went Missing

Of course, no family tradition is without its drama. One year, the quilt disappeared.

It was 1999, and we arrived at Grandma's house to find the sewing machine humming but the quilt nowhere in sight. Panic set in. Had it been misplaced? Stolen? Accidentally donated to Goodwill?

Turns out, Uncle Ray had borrowed it to cover his pickup truck bed while hauling firewood. "It was the only thing big enough," he explained sheepishly, brushing sawdust from his coat.

Grandma was furious. "Raymond, that quilt is not a tarp!" she scolded, hands on her hips.

We all laughed - even Grandma eventually - but from then on, the quilt was guarded like treasure. Uncle Ray was

banned from borrowing it, and the story of "The Great Quilt Heist" became another patch in our family lore.

Passing the Needle

As the years rolled on, Grandma's hands grew slower, her stitches less precise. But she never stopped sewing. Each December, she'd add a new square, sometimes with our help.

One year, she let me choose the fabric. I picked a piece from my old marching band uniform - bright red with gold trim. "Because you always marched to your own beat," she said, smiling.

Another year, my sister contributed a square from her college sweatshirt. "Because even when you're far away, you're still part of the story."

By the time Grandma passed the needle to my mother, the quilt was nearly impossible to lift. It was heavy with fabric, yes, but also with memories. Every patch carried a laugh, a tear, a prayer.

The Quilt Today

Now, decades later, the quilt still comes out every Christmas. It's frayed at the edges, faded in places, and patched so many times it looks more like a mosaic than a blanket. But when we spread it out, the room feels warmer, brighter, holier.

giggling as they discover the crooked angel patch. Teenagers roll their eyes at the "pickup truck tarp" story, then secretly smile when they hear it again. Parents sit quietly, remembering the prayers whispered on that quilt, the faith remember the quilt. Remember the crooked angels, the that carried us through hard winters and joyful springs.

And every year, someone adds a new square. Last year, it was a piece from my niece's baby blanket. This year, it will be a patch from my father's flannel shirt, worn thin from years of chopping wood.

The quilt is no longer just Grandma's project. It's ours a living testimony stitched together by generations.

Why It Matters

In a world that often rushes past Christmas in a blur of shopping carts and shipping deadlines, the quilt slows us down. It reminds us that the season isn't about perfection, but about presence. Not about flawless stitches, but about faithful ones.

It teaches us that laughter belongs beside tears, that crooked angels can still proclaim good news, and that even a patchwork of worn-out fabric can become something beautiful when stitched with love.

Most of all, it reminds us of the story at the center of it all, the one Grandma never let us forget. The story of a Savior born in a manger, who came not for the perfect but for the patchwork, not for the polished but for the frayed.



Epilogue: A Touch of Humor

Last Christmas, as we gathered on the quilt, my nephew tugged at the crooked angel patch and asked, "Why didn't they just fix the halo?" We all laughed, because of course that was the logical solution. But Grandma's wisdom echoed in my mind: "Because even angels get a little crooked sometimes."

And maybe that's the point. Christmas isn't about fixing Children who never met Grandma crawl across it, every halo or straightening every stitch. It's about celebrating the crooked, the patched, the imperfect - because that's where grace shines brightest.

> So, this year, as you unwrap gifts and sip cocoa, borrowed blankets, the laughter and the prayers. And may you find, in your own patchwork of memories, the warmth of a Savior who stitches us all together.
