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

Needless to say, the costs have skyrocketed. Furthermore, the violence has spread.

"Here in Gonaives nothing is certain because each day at 16 miles from our city several people have died or kidnapped. I don't know when but I know that God will do something. The situation is really complicated and impossible for us, but with God all things is possible." Dr. Dan continues the medical mission work. He even conducted a remote clinic on August 19.





Domestic Trailer Update:

We've done a lot of work all over the world, and now we are embarking on a domestic component. This trailer was purchased to minister in underserved areas and to underserved people – those who don't have the capacity or the money to seek dental or medical care. We're going to do


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
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NACMAI North America Country Music Hall of Fame Class of 2024

SUSAN AGEE HICKS



Susan started in music ministry eighteen years ago but has been singing for the Lord for fifty-eight years. She shares her special blend of Country Gospel and Southern Gospel music throughout the south. She also delights audiences through comedy for special events.

Susan recalls her earliest memories of Gospel music were at the Wally Fowler All Night Singing Conventions the first Friday night of every month. "We were there for the first song and the last, even if it was 2:00AM in the morning. My dad did not sing or play any instruments, but he loved Gospel music with all his heart."

Susan's music heroes were Dottie Rambo, Vestal Goodman, and the Hinsons. She reflects back to meeting Ronny Hinson for the first time. "I got to meet Ronny Hinson at the last National Quartet Convention in Louisville, Kentucky. I couldn't talk, just cried! I used to sit and watch them singing and think, 'If I could just get to do that one day.' Every blessing I received while listening to their music was

rolling through my heart and mind and I simply couldn't speak, and for those that know me well, that don't happen often!"

She remembers a pivotal moment that changed her life forever. "It was homecoming Sunday at the little church we were attending. My daddy was in construction work, so we moved every year. He found a church for us to attend before he found a place to park our trailer. We got home from church, and I couldn't eat lunch and

when momma asked what was wrong, I didn't know exactly, I just kept crying. We got on our knees in our kitchen and I asked Jesus to be by Savior and I've never been sorry and never will!"

Susan is a Grace Records Nashville artist and has released her first professional project. The latest single is *Long Black Train*. She gives a new take on the classic Country song from Josh Turner. There is also a companion video to the song. *Long Black Train* is currently climbing the charts. "I never dreamed I would have this kind of opportunity. The message is strong, and I hope it makes a lot of people stop and think about the road they're traveling."

The Tennessee native shares what to expect when one comes to a church or venue for her concerts. "I do a lot of high energy songs but love the power songs as well. I mix it up - some Traditional, some Bluegrass, and Country Gospel. I don't want it to be a never-ending song. I sang for forty years scared to death and missed a lot of blessings by worrying that

I wasn't good enough or the song wasn't perfect. I've learned that I'll practice a song till I get as good as I can make it, then open my mouth and let God do the rest. It's working out pretty good so far!"

"My main goal is to spread the Gospel of Christ to a lost and dying world. It's not about my singing and never will be. It's about the message in the words. I get to sow seeds, but God reaps the harvest!

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The One and Only Little Miss Dynamite

*Excerpts from Brenda Lee's official biography, posted on her website, are included in this story.

Brenda Lee is an international icon. The petite singer known for her big voice and even bigger heart rose from poverty to become a child star and then continued to achieve success over the next six decades across multiple genres of music. Lee holds the distinction of being the only person to be inducted into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame, the Country Music Hall of Fame and the Rockabilly and Pop Music Halls as well. Lee is also a recipient of the esteemed Grammy Lifetime Achievement Award as well as countless other accolades during her stellar career.

Always a fighter since the day she was born, Brenda Mae Tarpley arrived in the charity ward of Grady Memorial Hospital in Atlanta, Georgia, weighing only 4 pounds 11 ounces. "I was little," she says with a laugh, and notes that at 4 feet nine inches, she still is. "Back then, they didn't have everything they have now. If a baby had breathing problems normally it didn't make it, but I was born in Grady Hospital and I'm here, so they did something right."

Lee's family battled poverty throughout her childhood, and her musical gift became the ticket to a better life for them all. "I knew we didn't have a lot and I knew my mom worked 14-16 hours a day sometimes in a cotton mill. My dad was a carpenter and we never owned a car," she recalls. "I didn't even know if my dad could drive because my mother's brother would pick him up for work. I knew we didn't have much, but nobody did. My dad did the best he could and my mom did too. When I did my first show date, I was paid \$20, which

back then was a lot of money. I saw that I could make money and help. I love to sing, but when that came into the picture I thought I could do something to help my family. That's how it pretty much started."

Lee had always loved music and sang along with the radio as soon as she could talk. Her mom would put her up on the counter at the local candy store when she was only three and the tiny tot would fascinate anyone within earshot. By age six, she won a talent contest and earned an appearance on a local radio station where she became a regular. Her father died when she was just seven and by the time she was ten, Lee had become the family's breadwinner as her music career began to soar.

Her big break came when local radio personality Charles "Peanut" Faircloth introduced her to Red Foley. "I was living in Augusta, Georgia and Peanut Faircloth would take me to meet anybody that came to the famous Bell Auditorium," Lee remembers. "He would say, 'Would you listen to this little girl sing? Would you let her sing a song on the show? The audience loves her. She's from here.' Red Foley let me sing that night and then he asked my mother if I'd be interested in doing the Junior Jubilee in Springfield, Missouri. So I went and did the Junior and then I did the Ozark Jubilee, which was for the adults. I was seen by a columnist in New York named Jack O'Brien and he wrote me up. From that write up, I was asked to do the Perry Como Show, The Steve

Allen Show and The Ed Sullivan show, so that was my break. Mr. Red was my breakthrough."

Foley said hearing Lee's voice for the first time gave him chills. No one could believe such a big voice could come from a tiny child. That amazing voice earned Lee a deal with Decca Records in 1956 and she began churning out hits such as *One Step at a Time*, which soared up both the Pop and Country charts, and *Dynamite*, which earned her the lifelong nickname Little Miss Dynamite. Lee scored nine consecutive top 10 Billboard Hot 100 hits from *That's All You Gotta Do* in 1960 through *All Alone Am I* in 1962 which set a record for a female solo artist that was not equaled until 1986 by Madonna.

"I've always been a lyric singer," she says with a big smile. "I love good lyrics and I was blessed to have some of the great songwriters write all those wonderful, wonderful songs that I had. My producer, Owen Bradley, had the knack of listening to an acetate tape that writers would bring in or

some would just sing their songs in person with a guitar, and he had the knack to hear where it could go and what it could be. I had the knack for the lyrics and how to express them. I don't know where that came from. It's a God given thing. Record companies don't want to sign a kid because your voices changes, but mine never did. You can tell I was younger, but as far as the growling and the way I phrased, that's always been the same since I started recording. It had to have come from a higher power than anybody here on earth."

Lee credits her early manager, Dub Albritton, with boosting her career and pushing her to success in multiple genres. "He broadened my spectrum of what I could see and he had such bigger plans for me than I ever dreamed of, and we had success overseas before we had any here. That was him," she says of Albritton, who also co-wrote some of her big hits, including I'm Sorry and Sweet Nothin's. "Colonel Tom Parker was his best friend and they were carnies. He knew how to promote and get the interest up. I remember before we went over to France to play, they kept writing back saying, 'Send more recent pictures.' We were sending pictures of how I looked but they thought my voice was so big I couldn't be a kid. Then my manager somehow started the rumor mill that I was really a 42-year-old midget, so we sold out because everybody was coming to see: 'Is she a kid or is she a midget or what is going on here?' That was Dub!"

In addition to her success at home, Lee also achieved fame in the UK early in her career with *Sweet Nothins*, which reached No. 4 on the UK singles chart in the spring of 1960. *Let's Jump The Broomstick, Speak To Me Pretty* and *Here Comes That Feeling* also became favorites with her supporters abroad. Lee became one of the biggest Pop stars on the planet with a global fan base. "My overseas success was a surprise to me and it still is, even after all these years. We were just told that I am still the third largest foreign seller on my label, still after all these years," says Lee.

Throughout her career she shared stages and earned the respect of the world's most revered performers. The Beatles opened for her and the lads from Liverpool became good friends with the Southern belle from Atlanta. Elvis Presley and Lee made their Grand Ole Opry debut on the same night. "I'll never forget, he came in and they sent him down to that men's shop in the arcade to get a tux. They said he wasn't dressed right, so here he comes back with a tux. He wowed the audience. He tore the house down and I'll never forget they told him to keep his day job," she says shaking her head. Incredible talent, hard work and a humble attitude are the cornerstones of Lee's impressive career.


Though she'd had success in Rockabilly, Pop and Rock, in the 70s she returned to her first love - Country music - and enjoyed another successful season of her career starting with *Nobody Wins*, which hit the top five on the Country chart and

also graced the Pop chart. Lee recalls Nashville publisher Bob Beckham asking her to come in and listen to a Kris Kristofferson song called *Jesus Was A Capricorn*, that he thought she should record. Instead, she gravitated to the Kristofferson-penned *Nobody Wins*. "That was my first legitimate Country hit," she says. "I told Kris, 'You started the walk for me to the Country Music Hall of Fame!" Lee churned out Country hits such as *Sunday Sunrise*, *Big Four Poster Bed* and continued to have Country hits into the 80s including *The Cowgirl and the Dandy, Broken Trust* and *Hallelujah*, *I Love Her So*, a duet with George Jones.

Even though she's had success in multiple genres, Lee feels her best-loved hit will always be *Rockin' Around the Christmas Tree*. "I always thought, *I'm Sorry* would be my signature song, but it seems like *Rockin' Around The Christmas Tree is*. So, I'll take it," she says with a grin. "We knew we had something special when we cut it. Johnny Marks, who wrote *Rudolph, Holly Jolly Christmas* and lots of Christmas songs, was the writer. I don't know why he chose me. I was only twelve, but he sent it to me and we just loved it. We knew we had something special, but we never dreamed it would be what it is."



Britt Gully and David Slater

nce upon a time, there was no "American Idol," or "The Voice," or "America's Got Talent," etc. Instead, over thirty years ago, a syndicated show named "Star Search" boasted of introducing "tomorrow's stars today." Johnny Carson's sidekick, Ed McMahon was the host. Every week, the competition would include juvenile dance teams, comedians, female model/spokespersons, bands, and male and female soloists.

Lots of performers introduced on Star Search later became successful entertainers. Norm MacDonald, Sawyer Brown, Rosie O'Donnell, Christina Aguilera, Britney Spears, the Backstreet Boys, and Justin Timberlake all appeared on Star Search.

In 1987, David Slater found himself in the finals for Male Vocalist with Phil Vassar. Phil, later on, went on to have an outstanding career with over twenty charted hits. David had to compete ten separate times. He sang an original song every time. He asked if he could sing a song more than once. There was no rule against it. Slater really believed strongly in one tune, in particular. So, he chose to sing Exchange of Hearts for the first matchup, the semifinals, and the finals. That song went on to become a massive international hit. David won the finals, the \$100,000 first prize, and signed a contract with Capitol Records. He briefly enjoyed single and album success. Then, like so many show business stories, life threw him some curve balls he couldn't hit. Both his personal life and professional life took some major setbacks. Gradually, he built himself back into a popular live performer in his native Dallas, Texas.

In 1989, Britt Gully was traveling the country playing guitar in a band for his longtime friend Scott McQuaig. Scott, like David Slater, recorded for Capitol Records. He charted three singles during this time, including *Honky Tonk Amnesia*. These guys opened for and met most of the major Country stars of the day. A young Garth Brooks made an indelible impression upon them both as an entertainer and genuinely good person.

After a pretty famous restructuring at Capitol, Scott, Britt, and several more artists had to find a new musical base. Both Scott and Britt were already individually popular in East Mississippi and West Alabama. They went back home, and haven't stopped gigging since. Interestingly, David Slater and Britt Gully are both enjoying a recording renaissance, and on the same label, Sucarnochee Records.

Noted radio executive Ken Rainey remembers both artists fondly. "First of all, I've known Britt since he was a teenager. I

knew and loved his momma and daddy. Nobody could be more real than the Gullys. They were just genuine, good folks. Those qualities come through in Britt's music, and more importantly, in his life.

Also, I booked David Slater all those years ago for shows in Meridian, Mississippi's Temple Theater. It was always a pleasant experience. I used to run into him when we'd come to Nashville for shows. He's always been considered at the top of the ladder as a singer/songwriter.

Britt Gully has released two original songs. *Davy Had the Difference*, and *Let it All Hank Out. Davy* is a narrative song set in the civil war about two soldiers who escaped a prisoner of war camp. *Hank* is a rocking, straight ahead Country song about an old boy who considers Hank Williams, Sr. a romantic role model.

David Slater's song, Crossing the Great Divide is an original classic Country power ballad which Slater has been known for even before Star Search.

Comebacks are always feel-good stories. These artists, and their songs oughta make a lot of Country music listeners mighty happy.

Gentry became one of the most in-demand singer/songwriters on the Vegas circuit. During the latter part of her nearly two decades in the public eye, Gentry spent a majority of it in Las Vegas exploring her own creativity. She crafted glamorous, glitzy, and fabulous stage shows that had critical acclaim for their striking set design. She was credited with designing a majority of the costumes and the impressive dance choreography used in these phenomenal Vegas shows. Along with the successful Las Vegas residency, she was the host of her own CBS variety show, The Bobbie Gentry Happiness Hour.

At the age of 22, the Mississippi native, Gentry recorded Mississippi Delta, a countryfried homage to her homeland. The b-side to the track was the Gentry-penned *Ode to Billie* Joe. The eerie song was an American and European smash hit. The track spent four weeks at number one. Gentry's album, "Ode to Billie Joe" was released by Capitol Records in 1967. She received Grammy awards for 'Best New Artist' and 'Best Female Pop Vocal Performance' in 1968.

But Gentry was no one-hit wonder, having garnered eleven chart topping singles. She was the Spooner Oldham as the 2021 class of inductees into the original "Fancy" twenty years before Reba McEntire had a Nashville Songwriter's Hall of Fame. It's a well-deserved Top 10 hit with it. Gentry recorded the song in 1969 about honor for the iconic songwriter. the southern courtesan who wooed her way to a "Georgia mansion and an elegant New York townhouse flat." "Fancy is my strongest statement for women's lib, if you really listen

During the height of success, Gentry stopped performing. No more interviews or recordings or television appearances. She never announced plans to retire but vanished from the spotlight. One of the last appearances was at the Academy of Country Music Awards in 1982. Gentry has led a private life away from the entertainment industry for nearly forty years, but she continues to inspire and captivate artists such as Lucinda Williams, Shelby Lynne and Sheryl Crow who have all cited Gentry as an inspiration.

In November 2021, Gentry joined folks like Steve Earle, Kent Blazy, Brett James, and



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harlie Worsham has the entire Music City creative community in his corner, and that's never been more apparent than with "Compadres." The five-cut project finds a handful of his friends and admirers working with one of Middle Tennessee's most accomplished collaborators and, in turn, putting their stamp of approval on an artist who makes high-value music with even higher-value intent.

Staff, Cashbox

Produced by The Cadillac Three's frontman, Jaren Johnston, "Compadres" features the Country Music Association's 'Entertainer of the Year' Luke Combs, 'Female Vocalist of the Year' Lainey Wilson, CMA Fest co-hosts Dierks Bentley and Elle King, plus raspy hit-making adventurer Kip Moore. That's an all-star lineup, and those artists' willingness to play supporting roles on "Compadres" is a sign of just how deeply Worsham is respected.

Deirks Bentley has called him "the next Stapleton" - that's Chris Stapleton, just to dot the i's and cross the t's - and it's a good comparison. Stapleton spent several years joining and leaving bands, writing hits for other artists and singing background vocals before he broke through as a perennial hitmaker and award-winner. Worsham's story isn't all that different.

"Around 2019, my phone started ringing, with my heroes calling from the other end of the line," he remembers. "I began to understand that I was headed for something much more gratifying than I could've anticipated. Those hit songs and sold-out shows were already a part of my life. I'm an award-winning and in-demand musician who has appeared on nearly a dozen No. 1 songs. I'm a respected artist who has the entire Country music industry pulling for me. The only thing that hasn't been revealed yet is just how high and far this thing is gonna go."

The communal support was apparent almost from the day Worsham moved to Nashville in 2007. He joined a band - Kingbilly, where one of his bandmates was Brothers Osborne

guitarist John Osborne - and became enmeshed in Nashville's underground. When that group bit the dust, Worsham secured a solo recording deal with Warner Music Nashville that led to a series of some of the deepest and best acclaimed 21st century albums in Country music. He landed songs on albums by Bentley, King and Vince Gill. And, much like Gill, Worsham extended his artistry by playing on albums by a bundle of acts, including Combs, Wilson, Eric Church, Brandy Clark, Vince Gill, Kacey Musgraves, Hailey Whitters, Marty Stuart, Carrie Underwood and Keith Urban. He spent a year or two as an informal extra member of rough-cut Bluegrass ensemble Old Crow Medicine Show, and he hit the road as a much-publicized member of Bentley's band. The Academy of Country Music named him its 'Guitarist of the Year.'


Those developments underscored for Worsham that the fandom isn't a one-way street; he's in a mutual admiration society with all those acts and more.

"Compadres" broadcasts to the rest of the world what Music City already knows. It's an eclectic project, touching on his influences from Bluegrass to Mainstream Country to Classic Rock, and the songs are multi-layered - winners on first exposure, but best understood through repeated listens.

Handful Of Dust explores the tenuousness of life with Wilson's burning harmonies supporting Worsham's vocal conviction and a fiery solo. How I Learned To Pray casts Worsham as a Glen Campbell type, between his easy-going voice and baritone guitar, with Combs adding to the sense of

wisdom in the text's spiritual embrace of a soulmate. King brings a craggy realism to *Creekwater Clear*, a thoughtful, tactile appreciation for the Mississippi land that birthed him. "Compadres" closes with *Things I Can't Control*, a five-minute jam band journey with Bentley that manifests a zen-like acceptance of the road not guaranteed.

Worsham's delta upbringing introduced plenty of musical flavors to the start of his path. Hailing from a region that spawned everyone from B.B. King to Marty Stuart to HARDY, he was exposed to nearly everything – Blues, Soul, Gospel, Country, Rock. All of those influences come to play in his Apple Music show, Pickers Radio, where his guests have included obvious headliners such as Bentley and Gill, acoustic artists like Alison Brown and Molly Tuttle and insider musicians such as Richard Bennett (Neil Diamond, Waylon Jennings) and Bryan Sutton (Taylor Swift, George Strait).




"Compadres," a versatile celebration of musicianship and camaraderie, is an introduction into the next chapter of Worsham's story. It's a confirmation of the mutual admiration society he's created, and a musical statement from his supporters that Charlie Worsham will have his moment. But it's also a reminder that he's been having moments for years, simply by exercising his talent in numerous ways at each step in a relentless journey.

"I've reached this beautiful place in my life where I'm loosening up my grip, worrying less, and laughing more," he says. "I'll be a part of Country music 'til I die. Deep down, that's what I wanted all along."



THE SCOTTS

After their first performance at Healing Waters Church, word of mouth would begin to spread very quickly. They were invited to multiple churches and events. Along with their vocal gifts for The Kingdom of God, five of the eleven children could play instruments. Joyce, Mazina, Clinton, Jeannie, Tim, Randolph, Herbert, Evelyn, Ginger along with twins Jerry and Terry would go on to proudly become Southern Gospel Music's First Black Family.

In 1986, The Scotts had the wonderful opportunity to meet Tim Greene of The Greenes, working with Glory Land Records. They released their first hit single, *Praise Your Name*, which hit the national Southern Gospel music charts. Very soon thereafter, while at the Praise the Lord Club (featuring Jim Baker), they had the opportunity to meet Brian Hudson and they would produce another hit single that vastly gained popularity entitled, *In It For the Love*.

The Scotts were blessed and were able to take a worldwide tour, traveling all over America and were even invited to travel overseas to sing in Poland. At the time, Poland was still considered a communist country. The people of Poland were hungry for the Lord and even though there was a language barrier, the people of Poland felt a movement of the Holy Spirit in the words and music of The Scotts. In fact, the last night of the show, The Scotts were given four encores. All in all, The Scotts were booking between 140-175 shows per year during this time.



After their world tour, The Scotts we inspired to release another album and they quickly went back into the studio. They created the album entitled, "Love Is," which is a mesh of many genres of music including Southern Gospel, Black Gospel, and Contemporary. They also were invited to sing on the Taking America Back Tour that featured many wonderful and talented Southern Gospel artists.

In 2013, The Scotts won the AMG Heritage Award as 'Retro Artist of the Year.' Since The Scotts' return, they have been honored with several AMG and fan award nominations. The Scotts charted their first number one song on Christian Voice Magazine's Top 100 Southern Gospel in June 2020, *Greatest Gift*, and five months later in November 2020, God allowed the Scotts to chart their second number one song, *Hear My Voice*, on the Cashbox Southern Gospel Top 100.

The belated and beloved patriarch and matriarch of the Scott Family, Bishop C.L. and Mrs. Bernice Scott, instilled into their children not only a love for the Lord but also to remain dedicated to His purpose and His calling in their lives to spread the love of Jesus everywhere that they sing. Mrs. Bernice Scott once said, "Before my children were born I prayed and I said, 'Lord, I want a band for You' and one day, I looked and I had a band for Him." Just as their parents instilled in them to remain humble and dedicated, the Scotts have kept their hearts, minds, and eyes on Him over a calling that has expended over six decades. And it all started in the Scots' living room in 1952. Now over seventy years later, The Scotts are still recording and sending music out to major radio stations, as well as continuing to travel across the country spreading God's message through their music.

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


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teenage Daniel began playing guitar and singing Bluegrass Gospel in the local Baptist church, inspired by his neighbor, Lester Armistead of the famous Tennessee Mafia Jug Band, playing in his backyard with friends and family. Crabtree's guitar lessons were of the private nature. "A winter ice storm left me trapped in a house with no electricity and bored for about nine days. Daddy always had an old guitar sitting around the house, so I picked it up and learned to play it. Once freed from the storm, I honed my picking skills practicing on square dance songs. I also learned to sing Jimmie Rodgers' greatest hits." From this eclectic hobby, Daniel formed a church Bluegrass Gospel band called The Lights Chapel Boys. Since he was a teenager, Daniel has served as the music director for this same local Baptist church.

Sharing part of his testimony, Daniel says, "Fourteen or fifteen years old, there was a little Baptist church just down the road from where I lived. There was a large family of children who started a church softball team. This was about the extent of my attending church (to play on the team, you had to attend church on a regular basis). Thus, my three to have a spring and fall revival. At a 1975 revival with experiment with writing my own songs until I was in my

Kentucky Evangelist, Joe Adams, fifteen teenagers committed themselves to the Lord. I was one of the fifteen. Ever since the people of that little church introduced me to the Lord some fifty years ago, my life has never been the same. I still attend that little church. I still lead the singing portion of the worship every Sunday morning. Without a doubt, church has helped to make me who I am today. The experiences of worshipping and praising God at this little church have been some of the best parts of my life, and of my good years." Daniel would go on to having an active role in the Billy Graham crusades in 1979, and again in 2000.

As far as influences go, Merle Haggard was one of the first for Crabtree. "I saw Merle in concert anytime I could. He was a one-of-a-kind songwriter and entertainer. His music resonated with me." Another influence had to be Tracy Dartt (writer of the Gospel song, God On The Mountain). Crabtree and Dartt became friends while attending the same little church. "Brother Dartt invited me to some of the Dartt's recording sessions. What an experience to carry forward in recording my own music."

Playing covers of well-known Gospel songs for decades, brothers and I started going to church. It was also common Crabtree decided to take a stab at songwriting, "I didn't fifties, and I later decided to record some of the songs to disseminate my message and see whether, or not other singers would be interested in recording the songs."

When Daniel took his first written song to church, music industry friends with lots of experience responded very positively. This gave him the encouragement to write more, as well as attend a Nashville Acoustic Camp led by Adam Chowning and Megan Lynch. The songwriting camp was instrumental in fostering his interest and in making good friends who have become collaborators.

Music was not Daniel's initial career path; it was more of a hobby and secondary pursuit. Graduating high school, going to technical school, and becoming an electrician, Daniel has been a small business owner since 1990, owning and operating a HVAC company in Nashville. Also, out of high school, Daniel married his high school sweetheart (another good year), and they have two daughters and three grandsons.

More good years came in the form of recording five albums comprised entirely of self-written material. The recordings are a mixture of Gospel and Bluegrass music: "The Gospel Road." 2016, "In The Shadow Of His Wings," 2017, "The Storyteller In Me," 2019, "The Way I See It," 2021, and "Closer Than I've Ever Been," 2022. The albums were recorded, engineered, and mastered by Scott Vestal at Digital Underground Recording Studio and featured the singles *Sally Sunday, Isaac Woodard, Cold Harbor, Piedmont Train*, and *He Has Risen From The Dead*.

Crabtree has had several chart-topping songs, including Take Me Back To West Virginia, John The Baptist, Would You Be A Soldier, Knock On Heaven's Door, Don't Take Your Eyes Off Jesus, All Over Me, God Has A Plan, and The Scarlet Red Lines. The Independent Music Awards named the single, Piedmont Train as the 'Best Bluegrass Song' of 2019. Sally Sunday earned a nomination from the International Acoustic Music Awards for 'Best Bluegrass Song.'

Larry Sparks' rendition of *The Scarlet Red Lines* won 'Gospel Recording of the Year' at the 2023 IBMA (Independent Bluegrass Music Association), as well Larry's version of *Don't Take Your Eyes Off Jesus* and *All Over Me* reached #1 on the Bluegrass Today chart. As Crabtree thanked Sparks for recording his songs, Larry said to Daniel, "Maybe we can be a blessing to some people." A simple, but powerful concept for Crabtree, "This is the most rewarding aspect of songwriting for me, to hear someone say that a song changed their life. There is also so much joy in having created a legacy that will go on when I leave this world."

Crabtree attended the Rodney Crowell's Songwriting Workshop, Nashville 2022. There he had the opportunity to perform *Isaac Woodard* for fellow attendees. Rodney, Tony Brown, and Paul Worley complimented it as the best song presented at the event.


Daniel likes to read and write about things that happened in years past, history that stands out and events that need to be remembered, and the lessons learned from those who have preceded us. However, he has no intention of dwelling too long in the past, "I hear a lot of folks talking about how bad everything is in our time. I am a firm believer that our time in this world is some of the best times that mankind has ever experienced. There have always been bad times and bad things that have happened in the world. At some points in our history, it has been much worse than it is now. Isaac Woodard (the song) is a good example of what I am talking about here. It is about something that happened in this country nearly eight years ago. It is something that needs to be remembered. When asked, most don't even know the name Isaac Woodard (the man). Then, when they hear the song, they wonder why they have never heard of him."

With that, Daniel Crabtree is anticipating another good year with a new album releasing this month. The album "Storms On The Ocean" will feature the single, *Eye Of The Hurricane*. Recorded at Digital Underground Recording Studio, the Crabtree self-written, twelve-set album features Cody Kilby (guitar), Scott Vestal (banjo), Jason Carter and Patrick McAvinue (fiddle), Jesse Brock and Harry Clark (mandolin), Jeff Partin and Gaven Largent (dobro), Mike Bub and Evan Winsor (bass), Patrick D'Arcy (pennywhistle), along with Scott, Don Rigsby, Donna Ulisse, Rick Stanley, and Aaron McCune (background vocals).

"More good years for me are to write more heart-touching songs. To find the perfect singer(s) to pair with my works. To see my music reach new audiences, in a new way. I believe that God has given me an opportunity to carry his message through my songs. So, yeah, anytime that I can do such, it will always be another good year."

Taylor Swift Continues To Give Back

Taylor Swift is giving back to Tennessee to aid those impacted by the deadly tornadoes that ripped through communities in the Middle Tennessee area December 9. The singer made a \$1 million donation to the Community Foundation of Middle Tennessee.

The storms left at least six people dead and dozens hurt, with hundreds of buildings damaged. The National Weather Service reported that the tornado that impacted Montgomery County's



Clarksville covered an 11-mile trek, with winds peaking at 150 mph. The storms also ripped through Madison, Gallatin, and Hendersonville. When Swift and her family first began pursuing her music career in Nashville more than two decades ago, she attended Hendersonville High School.

Hal Cato, CEO of the Community Foundation of Middle Tennessee, also offered a statement about Swift's donation. "The Swifts found their original Tennessee home in Hendersonville and Sumner County and remain deeply committed to its continued well-being," he said. "Taylor's incredibly generous gift sends a message to her hometown - and the communities around it - that she has their backs during the long road to recovery following this devastating event."

This isn't the first time Swift has made a significant donation to the organization. In March 2020, Swift donated \$1 million to the Middle Tennessee Emergency Response Fund after areas in that region were struck by devastating tornadoes.

Swift is known for her philanthropic ways. During The Eras she's played.

In August, Swift gave \$100,000 bonuses to The Eras Tour truck drivers before the July 29 Santa Clara show and gave bonuses to other members of her touring entourage, including band members, dancers and sound technicians.

Smokey Robinson was once pronounced by Bob Dylan as America's "greatest living poet." The legendary artist continues to have an extraordinary career spanning over five decades of hits.

obinson has received numerous awards including the Grammy Living Legend Award, NARAS Lifetime Achievement Award, Honorary Doctorate (Howard University), Kennedy Center Honors and the National Medal of Arts Award from the President of the United States. He has also been inducted into the Rock 'n' Roll Hall of Fame and the Songwriters Hall of Fame. He was awarded the 2016 Library of Congress Gershwin Prize for his lifetime contributions to popular music. In 2022, he was inducted into the Black Music & Entertainment Walk of Fame.

William Robinson Jr. was born into a poor family in the North End area of Detroit, Michigan. His uncle Claude gave him the nickname "Smokey Joe" when he was a child. In 2012, Robinson explained "My Uncle Claude was my favorite uncle, he was also my godfather. He and I were really, really close. He used to take me to see cowboy movies all the time when I was a little boy because I loved cowboy movies. He got a cowboy name for me, which was Smokey Joe. So, from the time I was three years old if people asked me what my name was I didn't tell them my name was William, I told them my name was Smokey Joe. That's what everyone called me until I was about twelve and then I dropped the Joe part."

Robinson founded The Miracles while still in high school. The group was Berry Gordy's first vocal group, and it was at Robinson's suggestion that Gordy started the Motown Record dynasty. Their single of Robinson's Shop Around became Motown's first #1 hit on the R&B singles chart. In the years following, Robinson continued to pen hits for the group including You've Really Got a Hold on Me, Ooo Baby Baby, The Tracks of My Tears, Going to a Go-Go, More Love, Tears of a Clown (co-written with Stevie Wonder), and I Second That Emotion. The Miracles dominated the R&B scene and mentor Berry Gordy. Following his tenure at Motown,



throughout the 1960s and early '70s and Robinson became Vice President of Motown Records serving as in-house producer, talent scout and songwriter.

In addition to writing hits for the Miracles, Robinson wrote and produced hits for other Motown greats including The Temptations, Mary Wells, Brenda Holloway, Marvin Gaye and others. The Way You Do the Things You Do, My Girl, Get Ready, You Beat Me to the Punch, Don't Mess with Bill, Ain't That Peculiar, and My Guy, are just a few of his songwriting triumphs during those years.

John Lennon of The Beatles made countless remarks regarding Robinson's influence on his music. The Beatles had recorded Robinson and The Miracles' You've Really Got A Hold On Me in 1963 and in 1982 another popular British group, The Rolling Stones covered the Robinson and the Miracles' hit Going To A Go-Go. He later turned to a solo career where he continued his tradition of hitmaking with Just to See Her, Quiet Storm, Cruisin', and Being with You among others.

He remained Vice President of Motown records until the sale of the company, shaping the label's success with friend

he continued his impressive touring career and released several successful solo albums. From Robinson's website Berry Gordy shared about their special bond. "The characters of my life, my best friend Smokey Robinson. I mean the fact that we're still best friends after all that we went through. It's amazing. It's a testament to great love."

Many more artists have shared tributes to this Motown Legend such as Diana Ross. "I witnessed marvelous music in the making. And I was quickened to a dream. Smokey Robinson was always a miracle to me. Smokey was a powerful inspiration and encouragement."

Lionel Richie shares, "Smokey is my hero. When we met, he didn't realize he was my hero. I had never met anyone up close and famous... had never in my life met a black poet. He talked to us and encouraged us. What you feel about Berry, Smokey, I feel about you. I love you man, and thank you for being exactly who you are in my life"

In 2023, Robinson released his first album in almost a decade. The nine-track album called "Gasms" features entirely new music. The Motown legend also has his own channel on SiriusXM, where fans can hear the best in Classic Soul, R&B, Motown from the 60s and 70s and hits from Smokey himself.

During the course of his 50+ year career in music, Robinson has accumulated more than 4,000 songs to his credit and continues to thrill sold-out audiences around the world with his high tenor voice, impeccable timing, and profound sense of lyric. Never resting on his laurels, Smokey Robinson remains a beloved icon in our musical heritage.

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Johnathan Bond

For over two decades Buddy Jewell has been a fan favorite across America and abroad. Using his God given talent he has been an encouragement to many, wherever the road leads him.

rowing up in Arkansas, he attended Arkansas State University. It was in college where Buddy's road to music began. He remembers, "I entered a campus talent search and came in second. I thought everyone was being nice and telling me I sounded great. It was after that, I decided maybe there is something I could do with this. I always loved music. I remember singing and listening to music my entire life, especially Country music. That is how it all started."

After Buddy got married, he moved to Dallas for five years. He entered another talent contest that the group Alabama sponsored for their June Jam talent search. He won the Dallas regional talent search and went to Fort Payne, Alabama to perform at the June Jam Talent Search and came in second. Buddy shares that, even though he came in second place, God's favor was on his career from the beginning. "The

Yrowing up in Arkansas, he attended Arkansas people that ran the contest for them really believed in me and restate University. It was in college where Buddy's talked me into moving to Nashville. I've been here since road to music began. He remembers, "I entered January of 1993 and they haven't run me off yet!"

It was over a year after moving to Nashville that Buddy would become a demo singer. He recalls how a career of singing demos transpired. "I was singing in the church choir doing a solo. A guy walked up and asked me, 'this is probably a weird place to ask this but have you sang any demos.' I wanted to start singing on demos, but I hadn't yet. I lied to him in church and said I had! That guy was Country Music Hall of Fame songwriter Don Schlitz, who wrote *The Gambler* for Kenny Rogers, many hits for Randy Travis, and many other Country legends." Laughing, Buddy adds, "I told Don a few years back that I lied about singing demos and asked God to forgive me!"

Don Schlitz was Buddy's first demo along with a gentleman named Richard Ross who wrote for BMG music, one of the biggest publishing companies in town. Richard heard him sing demos for some of his songwriting friends and was impressed with his singing. Ross had songs that were album cuts on many of Conway Twitty's records. "I started singing demos for Richard in the early 90s. He would make his songwriter friends listen to the songs that I had recorded on cassette." Buddy's phone started ringing and during that time he became the most in demand male demo singer, recording over 4000 demos.

Some of the songs Buddy recorded for other artists included *Write This Down* for George Strait, Lee Ann Womack's *Little Past Little Rock*, Gary Allen's *The One*, Clay Walker's *You're Beginning To Get To Me*, along with songs for Trace Adkins, George Jones, Montgomery Gentry and many others. He says, "It was an interesting part of the business I didn't know existed until I got to town in '93."

A friend of Buddy's approached him at church. It's not a coincidence that two important factors of his career happened in church. God had a hand on his career from the beginning. "A friend at church, Richard Johnson, would come out to hear me play from time to time around Nashville. He told me about the singer/songwriter show and I should get involved. I was on Star Search as a male vocalist champion in the early 90s and nothing ever came from that. My wife called and told me if I wasn't going to turn over every stone we might as well go back to Texas, so I went and auditioned. Thank God she called and talked me into it."

Buddy Jewell became the very first winner of the USA Network's hit reality show, "Nashville Star." Buddy was the true viewer favorite from the very beginning, capturing 65% of the nationwide voting and beating out eleven other contestants, most notably, Miranda Lambert, by over 2 million votes on the final episode. Buddy shares his experience on the singing competition. "It was like Survivor and Big Brother meet the Voice! We all lived in a house with one another, but we all liked each other and got along."


"Winning Nashville Star was an amazing feeling,' he continues. "At the time, I had been in Nashville for ten years. I had been passed over by about ten record labels at least twice and I got to the point that I wasn't getting a record deal. I would just be the best demo singer I could be and provide for my family. I tell people all the time I serve a God that is big enough and loves me enough that if He wanted me to have a record deal, He created a TV show to get me one if someone didn't offer it to me. That is what happened with the TV show."

He says it was a phenomenal feeling when the host of show, Nancy O'Dell, announced his name. "It was like an outer body experience, like I was watching it all happen. It was a blur! I had this experience two or three times. It was the same way when I debuted at the Grand Ole Opry because it meant so much to play there. It's the greatest feeling you could ever have. It's a God thing all the way through."

His self-titled Columbia Records debut release landed at #1 on the Billboard Top Country Album charts, was certified Gold later that same year and garnered two back-to-back top five hits with *Sweet Southern Comfort* and *Help Pour Out the Rain (Lacey's Song)*. Both tunes are RIAA certified 1 million radio air plays.



Buddy performed his single, Help Pour Out The Rain the night he won Nashville Star. Buddy mentions how the song took on a life of its own. "It was something sweet and innocent that my daughter Lacy asked me when she was three years old. She asked if she could help pour out the rain when she went to Heaven. I didn't even think about writing a song about it, to be honest, for several months, until one night I couldn't sleep. That moment came back to me, and I started getting this melody in my head. I learned by then to get up no matter what time of night it was because you wake up in the morning, you will have forgotten it. I got up and wrote the majority of the song in 45 minutes. What a blessing it has been to me and my family. I talk to people all over the world saying this song has been a part of the healing process for them when they lose a loved one, especially children. I got an email from a father that lost his daughter in 2004 and how that song meant so much to him and got him through those darker moments. I heard hundreds of stories and thousands of emails and messages from people about what the song has meant to them. I had no idea it would connect with them like that."



earlier, Buddy shares, "She was in her car seat in the back seat, and we were having a Jesus conversation. She said, 'Daddy, I don't think I want to go to Heaven' I laughed and said 'Well, I think you should reconsider because I hear the other place don't have air conditioning!' She got real quiet and said 'Well, if I go to Heaven, daddy, will God let me pour blessing to us all."

Sweet Southern Comfort, the top five single from his debut album recently reached its 20th anniversary landmark. To celebrate the occasion, friend and manager, Brandyn Steen came up with the idea of a collaboration. Buddy says, "Sweet Southern Comfort would be the best one to bring artists to sing. I called Clint Black first because he helped make the song a hit the first time. Clint produced my debut album. I wish they would have let him produce all my other albums as well. We are still close friends to this day, and I think the world of him. Then Marty Raybon, I seen him at many events and television shows we worked on. Marty agreed to sing on it with me. Marty said, 'I am an Alabama guy, so I love that roll tide roll line in the song, so he was in! The Bellamy Brothers, I opened for them and hung out with them on the bus. Great guys and they are legends. I sat and watched their show that night as they sang two hours of hits. They agreed to sing on it." A new music video of the song featured Buddy, Clint Black, Marty Raybon and The Bellamy Brothers.

Sweet Southern Comfort reached the #1 position in August 2023 on Cashbox Independent Country Charts. Buddy shares when he received the news. "It was a total surprise to me. I was in Denmark or Sweden when I got the email and a screenshot of the song reaching number one."

Buddy recorded a Gospel "I Surrender primarily for his mother. He explains, "She gave me a list of songs she wanted sung at her funeral. I remember telling her, 'Mom I don't think I am gonna be able to sing if it happens like that. I will record those songs for you.' After I recorded them, I realized I didn't record any of the songs my mom requested on that record! She passed away in 2018 and we did play a couple of the songs at her funeral. The Gospel record features nine great Gospel songs and then there is Jesus Elvis and Me! That song was written by

Going back to the conversation he'd had with his daughter Chris Stapleton and Tim James. I found that song when I was making my second record, but I couldn't record it at the time. Brad Paisley had a hold on it. He called two weeks later and said that he passed on the song. But I had turned in my album with Sony Records. So, years later I put it on the Gospel album."

His talents as a songwriter have garnered him an ICMA out the rain?' I thought 'Wow, how sweet!' It has been a #1 for When Mama Prayed. Buddy's touching ode to this father, When I'm Good and Gone received Grammy consideration for Ricky Skaggs and Sharon White, and in May 2019, Buddy's song, One in a Row, co-written with Thom McHugh, was released by Randy Travis as his first new song in over six years.

> Buddy's newest album release (2020), "Bluebonnet Highway" has received much critical acclaim from the likes of Robert K. Oermann, Marty Raybon of Shenandoah, and Patty Loveless. Most notably, the first single, *Teardrop in the* Gulf of Mexico debuted at #19 on the Bluegrass Today Top 20 Singles Chart while the album, "Bluebonnet Highway" reached #20 on RMR's Americana Chart.

> Buddy has been recognized by the Grammy's, ACM, CMA, ABC Radio Networks, ICMA, ICGMA and CMT with multiple awards and nominations. In 2011, he won the International Country Gospel Music Association's 'Entertainer of the Year' and 'Crossover Artist of the Year'

awards. In 2015, he was inducted into the Arkansas Entertainers Hall of Fame. In 2018, his #1 Christian Country hit, *I'm There*, won the ICMA 'Song of the Year' and in April 2019, Buddy won ICMA 'Male Vocalist of the Year.' Buddy has been a mainstay on social media and Facebook by hosting Tuesday Tunes for the past six years with thousands of followers.

In 2023, Buddy toured overseas to the music fans there. "They love Traditional Country music. The closer you are to 60s and 70s music the better off they are. They don't listen to the newer stuff. They show up with their cowboy hats and boots on. Spain was phenomenal, I was playing the festival several years ago and they invited me back for the 10th Anniversary."

Another highlight for Buddy was when his song called *The Southern Side of Heaven* was choreographed by a friend from France. "When I played in Spain, many of the people from France were there. I looked out and there is 1200 people on this huge dance floor all dancing to my song."

Jewell traveled all over the world in 2023, performing in Spain, Ireland, Denmark, Germany, and Austria. Plans are being made for another European tour in 2024.

Buddy continues to give back to his community and beyond on many levels, serving as past spokesperson for The Minnie Pearl Cancer Foundation and Compassion International. He ministers to inmates at nearby facilities on a regular basis as well. Buddy especially has a heart for children and actively supports several worthy causes including St. Jude Children's Research Hospital.

Buddy has served our nation throughout his career, supporting and entertaining our troops at home and abroad. He traveled with Sergeant Major Kenneth O. Preston on an extensive USO tour to remote forward operating bases on the front lines in Iraq, Kuwait and Afghanistan. He is a proud American patriot, a devoted father and husband, and an outspoken follower of Jesus Christ.

He has continued to share his faith in God all throughout his career. He says, "I am far from perfect and I had my fair share of regrets. God loves me and forgives me. You just dust yourself off and get back up again. The devil will beat you up over the past. I wouldn't be here doing what I love to do if it wasn't for God. Some people that don't have a relationship with Jesus, I don't know how they make it. I've just seen the difference that Jesus has made in my life with answered prayers and miracles. There is no denying Him. I had people fuss at me for talking about Him so much but that is a big part of who I am."

He adds, "My wife Tene' has been rock solid. She is the most wonderful woman I could ever imagine who has put up with me for 35 years. If you keep God at the center of your relationship you can work through anything." God has blessed Buddy with a beautiful family of three kids, their families, and they are grandparents to three beautiful grandchildren.

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

George "Funky" BrownJanuary 15, 1949 – November 16, 2023

George "Funky" Brown was born on January 15, 1949, in Jersey City, New Jersey. He is best known as a co-founder of the band, Kool &The Gang, and was the group's drummer and songwriter.

In 1964, Brown and Ricky Westfield joined a young Ronald Bell and his brother, Robert "Kool" Bell, and neighborhood friends Spike Mickens, Dennis Thomas, and Charles Smith to create a unique musical blend of Jazz, Soul, and Funk.

At first calling themselves the Jazziacs, the band went through various name changes - The New Dimensions, The Soul Town Band, Kool & the Flames - before settling on their famous moniker Kool & the Gang. The band officially launched in 1969 and 54 years later the band has become true Funk, Soul, and R&B legends.

Brown co-wrote many of the band's iconic songs including *Ladies Night, Too Hot, Jungle Boogie, Summer Madness, Open Sesame, Celebration, Cherish*, and others. The band has earned two Grammy Awards, seven American Music Awards, 25 Top Ten R&B hits, nine Top Ten Pop hits and 31 gold and platinum albums to date. When asked to describe his music, Brown always replied with "The sound of happiness."

Brown's signature drumming on the early Kool & The Gang recordings has been heavily sampled years later by countless artists across all genres ranging from the Beastie Boys, Jay-Z, Madonna, Janet Jackson, Cypress Hill, P. Diddy, DJ Kool, Mase, Too Short, DJ Jazzy Jeff and the Fresh Prince, Boogie Down Productions, and others.

After a decade long hiatus from making new music, the band released "People Just Want To Have Fun," which Brown produced. Brown also released his memoir in 2023, "Too Hot: Kool & The Gang And Me."

On November 16, 2023, Brown died of lung cancer. He was 74 years old.


Brown's family said, in a statement, "We lost our beloved husband and father, Kool & The Gang founding member George Brown last night. He passed away peacefully at Long Beach Memorial Hospital surrounded by family. His incredible talent and presence will be greatly missed and never forgotten."

After graduating as Valedictorian of Leakesville High School class of 1975, Guynn went on to obtain a BS degree in petroleum engineering from Mississippi State University in Starkville. Guynn was employed by UNOCAL for 25 years and finished his career with SAMPSON, Inc. in 2013.

As a country boy growing up in South Mississippi, Guynn learned to work hard by watching his dad do the same. He loved his mama's cooking, especially her homemade biscuits. Guynn loved the simple life and never wanted the spotlight on him. He was a follower of Jesus Christ and a servant at heart because of the example of his Lord and Savior.

Guynn loved his family and served and sacrificed unselfishly as a demonstration of the love shown to him. He was a Godly man of his word, and his loyalty was immeasurable. His devotion and commitment to his family was evident to all wherever he went whether across the states or overseas. He was the proud and supportive father of The Family Sowell, a faith-based sibling band from Knoxville, Tennessee with driving instrumentation, tight family harmony, and original songs written straight from the heart.

Guynn Sowell, age 66, passed away peacefully on Tuesday, November 21 at Park West Hospital in Knoxville, Tennessee surrounded by his wife, Cindy, and their six children, Jacob, Joshua, Naomi, Abby, John-Mark and Justus.

His faith was made sight, and he heard the words, "Well done, good and faithful servant" and we rejoice together knowing his body is fully healed and has been made whole. Guynn ran his race, he fought the good fight, and he finished STRONG!

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




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DANNY WOODS Borrowed Friend

each Music is defined by whomever you ask. On the West Coast, it is usually associated with The Beach Boys. However, on the East Coast it is absolutely associated with the likes of The Tams, The Clovers, The Embers, The Drifters, The Catalinas, The Fantastic Shakers, and even The Temptations. The list of Beach Music bands is extensive as the groups moved up and down the East Coast, thrilling audiences to music of summer sun, sand, and shaggin'. Along with other music genres, Beach Music was regularly played and blaring over the intercom systems of grocery stores, malls, and outlets in and around Myrtle Beach, appropriately called Carolina Beach Music.

Nonetheless, one of the best Beach Music bands to ever hit a stage had to be none other than General Norman Johnson and Chairmen of the Board. From Detroit, Michigan, this original Soul music group made the smoothest glide ever into Beach Music, having much success beginning in the early 1970s and dominating the East Coast over the next decades. Somewhere in there was a guest appearance on Soul Train, and oh, also a tour in Europe.

Members of the band were General Norman Johnson, Danny Woods, and Ken Knox. Before every concert began, the musicians, consisting of a keyboard, bass guitar, and drums, would ignite the stage. Then, when these three amazing voices (adding a saxophone and tambourine) walked onto the stage, they would light it up far brighter than the bouncing stage lights. They became legends by doing what came naturally for them, thus putting their faces, their story, and their music on the pages of Rolling Stone and Billboard.

From The Double Door to The House of Blues, from universities to coliseums, and all in between, that electrifying performance energy radiated throughout the audiences. Just a couple of songs in and the dance floor would be filled with "shaggers." A gracious plenty of these shaggers came straight from their cooperate worlds to wind down, loosen the ties and lose the heels, letting themselves be young and free until tomorrow's nine to five. What was happening on stage, and on the dance floor, was nothing but a day at the beach for college kids, middle agers, and seniors. It was truly one size fits all.

Breaking it down further, Danny Woods. Danny could belt out a song, all the while never missing a beat as he would dance across the stage. Night after night, he would mesmerize an audience with his smile and *Pay To The Piper*. Danny followed no rules when it came to performing; he sang and danced his feelings in his own way, making his personality and charm magnetic. Danny's passion for what he did was so instilled, music being the only thing he had ever known; he did it effortlessly to perfection.

This is where the story becomes personal to the writer. Perhaps not the normal feature of a musical artist, but one of a borrowed friend.

Borrowed friends are those that God allows to come into your life, change your life, and sadly (or not so sadly) move on. Whether they move onward or upward, these borrowed friends leave such a heart tattoo that they are never forgotten.

On May 10, 2001, one such borrowed friend walked through the door of my life, literally. The downtown summer street concerts had just begun for the season and the first group was setting up for the sundown concert. The concert would begin as the Main Street businesses were closing. The office where I worked was one of those Main Street businesses; the concert was going to be right outside my door.

Almost time for me to turn out the lights and lock the door, black clouds, lightning, and thunder instantly rolled in, scattering everyone who was outside. In that scattering, my office door burst open as three men in dress array and soaking wet ran in the building. Sitting behind my desk was awkwardly amazing. In the two chairs directly in front of my desk (in a very tiny office space) sat Danny Woods and General Norman Johnson. On the small lamp table sat Ken Knox. Here I am with the members of the Beach music band, Chairmen of the Board. What do I do with them now? Welcoming them to make themselves at home, there was very little small talk, as they contemplated if/when the concert would convene.

Honestly, I do not remember too much about General and Ken, as my attention was pulling, without any effort of my own, to Danny. It was so strangely comfortable. Yet, I could tell that Danny was carrying the weight of his world on his shoulders, immediately recognizing the pain behind the smile. His eyes said it all. I have been there so many times. The storm cleared as General and Ken exited out the back door to continue the evening's event. Danny lagged behind. Shaking in my shoes, I did what I always do when someone crosses my path out of pain and hurt. I put a Gospel CD in an envelope, sealed it, handed it to Danny, telling him, "Take this out when you are alone and in your quiet place." I will never forget that smile of gratitude that just maybe a little peace and comfort were wrapped up in that brown mailing envelope. Oh, my God, how many are the times that I have been there? Looking for something, anything to assure that God had not completely abandoned me. And you, the reader?

I thought my smallest of doing something heart-tugging was done, as I remembered my daughter saying several years before at a Chairmen concert at The House of Blues in Myrtle Beach. She said, "What are you going to do if you have to give a CD to Chairmen of the Board?" My response, "Yeah, right."

A couple of weeks passed and I heard someone knocking on my locked, office door. As I opened the door, there stood Danny Woods, still smiling, still somewhat hurting. He came in, sat down in the same chair as if he had known me all my life. I had no clue what he was about to say, or why he showed up at my door. But it went something like this, "Please tell me what was in that envelope that you gave me. I gave it to my son to hold, and he lost it." At that point, I realized that he knew nothing about me, not even music or singing. So, his next words were even more undeniably God sent, "I had a vision of you and I singing. I have prayed all the way down the interstate that I could find your office again. Tell me about yourself." With another CD in his hand, this was just the beginning beyond either of us. Even more so, neither of us had



a way of knowing that our country would start falling apart and studio sessions were times spent as if, subconsciously just four months later, on September 11, 2001.

A few weeks after that May 10th, having never sang together, we went into the studio to record an album. Again, we had no way of knowing that copies of that CD would go to some of the guys being deployed to the Middle East. There were two albums actually; the albums were a little of me, a little of Danny, a little together. Until one has heard Danny's version of one of my original songs, Lord, Have Mercy, and his smooth, scratchy, and beautiful version of *Amazing Grace*; one has yet to hear one of the greatest, natural voices that God ever gifted.

My district superintendent, at the time, was also a minister and one who loved photography. As well, he was battling terminal cancer. Danny and I went to the parsonage to do a photo for the album cover. No one could have imagined that a revival for three would break out that day, just from conversations around a photo session. Guess there is something to that "where two or three are gathered". Merely weeks later, Jesus would gather my boss and take him to his heavenly home.

For a short fifteen years or so, Danny Woods was one of my best friends. We talked about any and every thing, often in the middle of the night when both needed something to pass the long, dark night on into the morning light. (Count yourself abundantly blessed if you have never faced Satan head-on in the middle of the night. Trust me, he does his best work in the dark of night.) Attending Chairmen concerts, Danny's occasional visit back to the office, going to dinner,

and of absolute necessity, packing as much as possible in the so few years.

Folks who only saw Danny Woods, the amazing singer, dancer, and performer missed out on the most genuine of hearts. What he did on stage was his job; it was all that he knew how to do. But hitting the floor from the stage, his love for Christ was as real as real can be. Suppose we were such friends in that we shared a passion for music, and an even deeper passion for Christ. Furthermore, we respected our individual gifts, graces, and calling.

I moved to the mountains, and Danny made the move to the beach. Contact was dwindling as his health was failing; the dance was no more, but the voice was still strong and holding on. Still, we managed to talk on the phone until one day, the conversations started to fade away. His last telephone call was every indication that he was so tired, and soon the struggle would all be over. Danny went home in January 2018.

These are the things that I remember most. I remember the package in the mail sometime earlier, having a couple of gifts and a demo recording of a song that he had just written, "Tell me what you think of this." Unfortunately, and what a loss, the Beach Music world would never get to hear his beautiful song.

I can hear him belting out, Where No One Wants To Be, Lord Send Me in a crowded restaurant. I can hear him laughing at me for running on fumes, "Please stop and get I remember nights of him finding me in dark, standing room only venues, head down, walking through the elbowto-elbow crowd looking for my feet (with stage lights it is impossible to see faces in the audience and somewhat blinding leaving the stage). Aw, Danny's hat. Danny always wore a hat offstage. Sometimes he would forget to take it off before entering the venue. With so many folks wanting to shake his hand or give him a hug, the hat in his hand got in the way. I remember the night that he walked to the back of the room, parting the crowd, and handing me his hat. Danny left the concert that night without retrieving the hat. Later, I would give that hat to one of his most enduring fans. I did not need the hat; I had the friend.

I remember him when I see a vintage Cadillac, a bar-beque restaurant, the beach, beach clubs, Beach Music, a home studio, a fishing boat, a fedora; you know, the little things.

Anytime or anywhere that I sing, I cannot help but feel Danny standing in the dark background, singing along. God is like that. He recreates those feelings of things that make the heart leap for joy. If not on this earthly stage, for sure Danny is singing and dancing on Heaven's floors. My mind's eye will never lose that image of his now being in perfect health, perfect peace, perfect happiness, perfect smile. An even more perfect image would be that of my big sister playing a grand piano as Danny, once more with voice strength as never before, sings *Amazing Grace*. With God all things are possible.

"Dan, you done good." This was the signature saying at the ending of every Chairmen of the Board concert. When one heard this, you knew the evening had come to a close. Oh, to imagine how it must have been to hear Jesus say, "Dan, you done good. All of your struggles have come to a close. Welcome home."


Nevertheless, in a little while, a brand-new album is awaiting, bringing back that beautiful voice on previously recorded music, along with recording two of Danny and I (co-written) original songs. Danny's memory, nor the music, will ever go away.

Borrowed earthly friends will one day be eternal friends. But for now, do not be grieved over those that rolled into your life, tattooed all over it, and rolled out as swiftly as the ocean's tide. There is absolutely nothing wrong with letting borrowed friends leave your life once their earthly purpose has been fulfilled. If the memories be good, wear them about the neck like a precious, pure gold pendent. If the memories be not so good, let them fly away like a feather in the wind. Let go in peace, both you and them.

Revel in the new and different tides as they roll in and out from day-to-day, until all are rolled back together again on that bright and peaceful shore. With General Norman Johnson and Danny Woods paired up again, one can only imagine just how amazing that reunion must be.

The Chairmen of the Board band continues on with new members and featuring Ken Knox.

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
