The author, the singer Rebecca Mae Bagwell is a national and international, multi-award winning vocalist and entertainer based in Nashville. She is a New Hampshire native who chased her music dream to Nashville in 2011.

With the exception of a few hymns that Rebecca heard and sang, her life was almost "musicless" until the age of fifteen. Sent to a boarding school at the age of six would stop the music, as well most all of a natural life a child needs to grow up happy and healthy. She was living in a real-life cult. Nonetheless, she found the grace to leave it behind, penning her life story in a published book, "Finding My Voice."

Though music may have been sporadic, Rebecca managed to fall under the influence of some pretty distinguished voices - Dolly Parton, Reba McEntire, Linda Ronstadt, The Beatles, and John Fogarty.

In 2005, Rebecca began competing in Karaoke, going on to win titles for the State of New Hampshire with NHCMA (New Hampshire County Music Association). She was their 'Vocalist of the Year' (2007) and 'Entertainer of the Year' (2008). Those same years, she was the NACMAI (North America Country Music Associations International) 'Vocalist of the Year' (2007) and 'Entertainer of the Year' (2008). She is an inductee in the New Hampshire Country Music Hall of Fame (2018). While still in New Hampshire, she formed a band that played on weekends throughout New Hampshire

and Vermont, before the move to Nashville to pursue her dream.

Rebecca would find even more grace to chase music full-time. Leaving behind career and comfort, with no job and no place to live, all she carried with her was her dream. In her words, "If you dare to dream, then dare to chase that dream." There have been many heartaches and tears on the journey, but the joys have been the greater. A much happier life continues.

A classical trained vocalist with powerful, warm, and rich vocals captivating audiences, Rebecca's dream was about to soar. Her stage presence and warm personality brings an audience right into the show with her. Rebecca had found a new home, "Welcome to Nashville."

Touring has taken this remarkable performer to the stages of Dollywood Celebrity Theater and Country Tonite Theater in Pigeon Forge, Silver Dollar City in Branson, and to the Orange Blossom Opry in Florida. She can be found at countless other theaters, fairs, festivals, resorts, private events, campgrounds, and even at the American Lawn Mower Racing Festival. She has opened for Jimmy Fortune (The Statler Brothers), Suzy Bogguss, Sawyer Brown, Ronnie McDowell, Highway 101, and others.

In her down time, one may find Rebecca (and husband, James) at a senior living location, bringing music and joy to America's senior community. Even COVID-19 had to step

aside as she would sing outside their windows, a reassuring comfort to the quarantined. FOX News in Nashville picked up this selfless kind-heartedness, airing it on the evening news.

The recipient of multiple JMA (Josie Music Awards), 'Fans Choice' (2017), 'Modern Country Duo of the Year' (2018), 'Entertainer of the Year' (2019), 'Female Vocalist of the Year' (2021), and nominated for 'EP of the Year' (2022), Rebecca also appeared on the ABC hit show, *Nashville* (appearing as herself), and was a guest on WSM, twice.

The country girl at heart who takes pleasure in horseback riding, roller blading, biking, hiking, and working out, the published author, the television host, and fairly newlywed is certainly daring to dream.

While a simple "Thank you for your service" seems somewhat

Chief Master Sergeant Bagwell received an acknowledgement from President Trump for his long military service. A retirement celebration was held October 16, 2022 in Nashville, with Leona Williams and other Nashville performing artists.

performing with his wife, sharing her dream. Rebecca and Jamey are truly in this together. "Meeting, marrying, and now performing with Jamey is extraordinary, and a miracle," Rebecca mentions. Even Jamey's hobbies (fishing, hiking, biking, and working out) are in sync with Rebecca's.






Chambers came to Nashville from Columbus, Georgia in 1976 as a member of a band. His career soon evolved into songwriting, with cuts including Ricky Van Shelton's charttopping 1987 single, Somebody Lied and the title track for Randy Travis' 1988 album, Old 8x10. Conway Twitty, George Jones, Tammy Wynette, Joe Diffie, Johnny Paycheck, and others recorded his songs. He opened Chambers Guitars

"He always talked about how much he learned from his own mentor, Billy Sherrill. I'm proud to say that my mentor was Joe Chambers, and just as Billy lives on through the music, Joe will live on forever through The Musicians Hall of Fame & Museum."

Joe Chambers passed away September 28, 2022 in Nashville, Tennessee at the age of 68.

RANDALL FRANKS

Appalachian Mountain Treasure

From the beginning of time, folks have searched the world over to find its treasure(s). Amont the greatest of these are the Godgiven treasure falling from the lips or at the end of the fingertips, the voice and the music.

Actor, author, vocalist, and musician Randall Franks in his words, "It is in those unexpected moments when you realize that what you have done with your life is more than the music, more than a scene in a movie. For another spirit on this earth, if it has touched them and made their lives better in some way, that is truly the greatest reward this side of Heaven."

andall Franks is a native of Georgia who resides in the Appalachian Mountains. He is related to, or descended from, several notable figures in American and world history including America's George Washington, Thomas Jefferson, Davey Crockett, Sergeant Alvin C. York, as well as Scotland's Robert the Bruce, and England's King Henry VII. The B.B.A. graduate from Georgia State University, with studies in Municipal Government at the University of Georgia, Randall Franks is the author of nine books, non-fiction and fiction.

Franks is an Appalachian entertainer who plays fiddle, guitar, and dulcimer. He is also an American actor in television and film, recognized for his unique country comedy that he has employed in his stage appearances, and his syndicated newspaper column, *Southern Style*.

With over thirty career albums in Americana, Bluegrass, Folk, Southern Gospel, and Country, he focuses on creating new uplifting music that encourages. Franks learned an artist's greatest lesson from Country's Ramblin' "Doc" Tommy Scott, "Presenting an entertaining show night after night is a true art form, but an artist must constantly be creating anew to keep one's presentation fresh. Remaining relevant throughout one's career is the greatest challenge for any artist. I believe as time passes, while you should never

forget what brought you to the dance, an artist must revamp what he is doing to broaden his talents and his audiences."

Randall Franks has certainly taken this wisdom to heart, applying it to his own unweathering career. Franks' music career began at the age of eight, when he first sat down at a piano. "I wanted to play piano like Hovie Lister of the Statesmen Quartet and Eva Mae LeFevre of The LeFevres, but soon realized that was not going to be my forte. My interest moved to the violin, because I really wanted to fiddle." It would be the fiddling of Great Uncle Tom Franks who would bring out the fiddling desire in Randall Franks, "But ultimately two TV acts really motivated my desire, Flatt and Scruggs on The Beverly Hillbillies, and The Dillards on The Andy Griffith Show. Although neither of these had a fiddle, it set my childhood goal of playing Appalachian music in character on television."

A childhood music desire helped Franks bring together likeminded youth from area schools to jam sessions, thereby forming The Peachtree Pickers. The jammers began appearing in concerts, churches, flea markets, restaurants, and festivals. Within a few years, Franks was invited to bring his group to the Grand Ole Opry, marking the beginning of a long-term relationship and many guest appearances at the Opry. "It was the encouragement of Grand Ole Opry stars such as Bill

Monroe, Jim and Jesse McReynolds, and Roy Acuff who opened the many doors for me in my early career. I will never forget the first time that Bill Monroe called me up on stage, at the Dahlonega Bluegrass Festival, to fiddle with him. That changed my life, as I went from just another teenage fiddler with a band to someone that every musician and every audience member witnessed; the Father of Bluegrass acknowledged me as talented enough to stand on stage beside him. When he later brought my band to the Grand Ole Opry, the climb up the ladder of success became more like a ride on an escalator."

From his earliest fiddling performances at church to eventually standing in front of tens of thousands at the National Folk Festival, Franks sees his journey as simply following the path which God has mapped out for his life, "Without God interesting renowned artists in what I was doing, all that has come since would not have occurred." Stepping on stage at the National Folk Festival in Ohio was the biggest audience for which Franks had performed. "I looked out on the sea of what I was told was sixty-thousand, waiting anxiously for me to hit the first fiddle notes as we went broadcast live. I was just out of my teens appearing with Folk artists, Doodle Thrower and Golden River Grass. I never imagined feeling the warmth of so many people emanating towards me on a stage." Franks' next biggest audience of thirty-thousand would be appearing on Hollywood Hillbilly Jamboree. Both shows own a page in Franks' life story.

amazing Bluegrass to be the recordings and performances of Jim and Jesse McReynolds. "When Jim and Jesse became an

integral part of my life and career, I could never have imagined the experiences that we would share on the road, on stage, on TV, and in the recording studio. Whether I was supporting them as a Virginia Boy, they were backing performances on TV or the Grand Ole Opry, I was never more privileged than when standing on stage with Jim and Jesse and The Virginia Boys. Among my hundreds of recordings, Mean Joe Blake and Christmas Time's A Comin' are among my favorites, on which they both appear."

Franks performed live Georgia's World Congress Center where his music stood out in a good way from the others. "I was booked to appear on the Georgia Music Hall of Fame PBS broadcast to represent Appalachian music, appearing alongside Third Day, Collective Soul, and Chuck Leavell of The Rolling Stones. Appearing with

several Atlanta Country Music Hall of Fame performers, making up the Georgia Mafia Bluegrass Band, I performed The Old Black Fiddle, my preguel to Charlie Daniels' The Devil Went Down To Georgia." Receiving rave reviews, Franks' band went on to win 'Bluegrass Band of the Year' in his home state several times thereafter. Franks was also 'Male Vocalist of the Year' (1992), and 'Songwriter of the Year' (2009) for The Old Black Fiddle.

"Being from Georgia, two major influences were the Georgia fiddle bands and the performers who starred on the WSB Barn Dance in Atlanta, When I came along after their heydays, receiving the 'Fiddlin' John Carson Award' and the 'Cotton Carrier Award' meant so much to me. Joseph "Cotton" Carrier, the host of WSB Barn Dance and his wife, Jane sat in the living room playing and teaching me/my fellow youth on many Friday nights, forming who I have become today."


The International Bluegrass Hall of Fame and Museum honored Franks as 'Bluegrass Legend' in 2011. He stood among a host of stars, including two of his greatest mentors, Ramblin' "Doc" Tommy Scott and Curly Seckler, "The stage was filled with honorees that I had admired all my life. As the youngest among the honorees, I knew my presence was an anomaly in time and talent, all because I did not see myself at their level. It was a privilege to be honored and to share it with so many who invested in me along the way."

While Franks was seeing his second career rise in Country From childhood, Franks considered the pinnacle of music in the 1990s, he hosted numerous events at the Ryman in Nashville. At a star-filled concert with Ronna Reeves, Rhett Akins, and The Kentucky Headhunters, "In contrast to the

> full-band performances, I was doing my Country comedy, while singing with just my fiddle, backed by my guitarist, Bill Everett. I remember singing Charlie Poole's, Rebel Soldier as the audience rose to their feet, applauded and applauded. I looked back towards the door to see my late mother sticking her head in, prompted by the reaction from where she was listening at the record table in the lobby. I believe it went on for five minutes; I had never had an ovation like that - right song, right venue, right audience. I am very thankful to have that special Ryman moment." Franks is also an inductee into America's Old Time Country Music Hall of Fame, Independent Country Music Hall of Fame, the Atlanta Country Music Hall of Fame, and Tri-State Gospel Music Hall of Fame.



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Though Franks had huge performance successes rising to the appearances on the Grand Ole Opry, The Country Kids TV Series, and being featured in Country music publications, on to six Bluegrass albums; it was the shift back to his Christian roots that would yield his first chart album (1990). He became the first sole Bluegrass artist to reach the Top 20 Christian Music Sales Chart with "Handshakes and Smiles." The album featured *You Better Get Ready*, *He's Never Gonna Fool Me Again*, *Pass Me Not*, and *Rock Of Ages*. "The album solidified me in both County and Christian music. It was possible through the support of Jeff & Sheri Easter, The Marksmen Quartet, Lewis Family members, and Jesse McReynolds, all helping me create the music that touched so many hearts."

Randall is a firm believer that God is with us when we are the least aware, and perhaps do not even realize his presence. Two pivotal experiences reinforced this in Randall's life. "I was doing a concert with The Marksmen Quartet in Dahlonega, Georgia. I stayed back to hear The Florida Boys sing. This was back before cell phones were common place. I quickly became very sick with a migraine, excusing myself to make the roughly two-hour drive home. When I arrived home, the lights were all on, my mother and father were gone. I found a message to come to the hospital. I arrived to find my very lucid father in his last couple of hours on earth. Because of that migraine, I was able to share a bit more time with him, and be there for my mother. The migraine amazingly disappeared as I pulled into my driveway. I always will believe that God was sending me a message that I would respond to."

Additionally, Franks had the honor to visit and share a meal with General Robert Scott, the author of *God Is My Co-Pilot*. The author knew exactly what he was writing about, "Returning from a concert, around two in the morning on a lonely stretch of mountain road, I audibly hear

within my blue S-10 Pickup, 'Slow down.' I looked around to see who said this to me while hitting the brakes. The windows were shut, there was no one in sight, and obviously I was alone in the truck. I rounded the curve to see a herd of deer in the road. I had slowed down enough to easily stop, otherwise at the seventy-mile-an-hour speed would have, in all likelihood, resulted in the death of the herd, perhaps myself as well. I believe that God sent his angel to give me that unquestionable warning. When I listen and heed, I have found life to be so much better."

Seeking God's purpose for one's life is a constant endeavor; reflecting upon the opportunities in which he has allowed you to make a difference for him, will set your walk in order. "One of the greatest opportunities He afforded me, was bringing me to TV's, *In the Heat of the Night*. He set the stage for the creation of the character, Officer Randy Goode.

A character made for me, that allowed me to work for five years on NBC and CBS. When at the height of my visibility, I asked God, 'What am I to do for you here Lord?' Within weeks, I was called to the set. This usually meant that Carroll O'Connor had added me to a scene. Instead, when I was approached, he asked me about a scripture to use in the scene, I Corinthians 13:13; *And the greatest of these was charity*. Emanated from Chief Gillespie's lips, these inspired words were the first of many to reach twenty-five million Americans and viewers around the world, and in many languages. God allowed me to plant a seed that blossomed, making our show one of God's lights within the network lineup. It continues blessing hearts to this day. Working with the amazing TV

icon, Carroll O'Connor, day after day, allowed me to learn so much about acting, about life. Through our work together, I reached my childhood goal of being a Bluegrass artist who appeared in character on a network TV drama."

Franks has been a mainstay in Christian films such as Broken with Soren Fulton, Lukewarm with John Schneider, and Decision with Natalie Grant. Most recent film works are, The Cricket's Dance, and his film, The American's Creed which he portrays Revolutionary War Captain Robert B. Shields. Franks is directing the film, and its accompanying documentary focusing on the inspiration project, the The American's Creed, written by William Tyler Page.

Franks released one of his biggest career albums with, "Christmas Time's A Comin'," featuring the cast of *In the Heat of the Night* and friends. The album was produced with co-star Alan Autry who performed on most of the recordings, along with stars from Country, Bluegrass, and Gospel music. "Bringing Alan Autry and David Hart (along with my mentors Jim and Jesse and The Virginia Boys) to appear with me on the Grand Ole Opry, then doing a signing at the Ernest Tubb Record Shop, guest starring on The Nashville Network for Crook and Chase, and being on Video Morning; well, those are just a few more pages in my life story."

Randall Franks wants nothing more than to have his career blessings spill over onto the youth of our nation. Encouraging youth through scholarships is a major focus of

his life, as he shares his time with the non-profit, Share America Foundation, Inc. With over thirty scholars receiving the Pearl and Floyd Hanks Scholarship, Randall mentors a variety of youth in Appalachian music. In 2019, that dedication yielded a new music project, Americana Youth of Southern Appalachia, teaching youth about songwriting, arranging, recording, and offering the experience of releasing an album. One month from its release, the CD topped the AirPlay Direct Global Americana Albums Chart, June 2019. The youth supported Franks in his chart songs, What About All These American Flags and Filling The River With Tears. Every recording on the album would chart individually, and the album itself would go on to #1 in 2020, again in 2021. "While I have been blessed with many of my own releases through the years, never before have I experienced a project that received such a response from radio presenters, or support from music buyers supporting our scholarships. Its success is due to the talents of all the youth, as well as, our friends at AirPlay Direct who truly supported the effort."

Franks' two recent releases include the Christian music comedy album, "Keep 'Em Smilin" and "Faith Will See Us Through", a collection of video Gospel performances recorded during the pandemic. Franks formally served for twelve years as a Council member, Vice Mayor, and on numerous non-profit boards. "Whether elected or philanthropic, God has blessed me to be an actor and entertainer, using platforms to reach millions around the world. Work together as Christians and Americans to ensure that our republic sustains for many generations to come." All of us have a treasure within to make the world around us just a little better.

"What's next?" is a question that is ever present on Randall Franks' lips. "I have always been very task-oriented, and I have applied that approach in all aspects of my career. Forging ahead with what's next has always steered my forward motivation. I only know for sure that I want to uplift and encourage on stage, and in my life's walk. I want to bring that smile to surface while folks listen to the music and comedy performed; performed by someone they feel they know, like home folks."

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

The Masters

In 1965 young Corky stumbled unknowingly into the hangout of the Chicago Blues masters, and before he can say "one four five" (classical 12-bar Blues changes) he and his guitar partner, Jim Schwall, are hired to front the house band every Thursday night at Pepper's Show Lounge. There, they welcomed the very Blues deities they've been idolizing on their hallowed recordings to join them on stage. Among the legion of masters were Howlin' Wolf, Muddy Waters, Willie Dixon, Little Walter, and the young Jr. Wells and Buddy Guy. From under the wings of these music mentors Siegel and Schwall formed the Siegel-Schwall Band and within a year they were whisked up for another residency in 1966 at Big Johns (known as ground zero of the American Blues Rock explosion) immediately following the Paul Butterfield Band.

A blues musician and a classical conductor walk into a bar

As Corky tells it; "It was at Big Johns in 1966. One fellow kept coming in night after night and staying all night long. One night he comes up to me and says, 'Corky, I'd like your band to jam with my band.' I'm thinking who is this guy and what's his band. It was Maestro Seiji Ozawa and his band at the time was the Chicago Symphony Orchestra.

Turning point

Through Maestro Seiji Ozawa, Corky Siegel's world took a major turn from smokey Blues clubs to ornate orchestra halls on invitations from major symphonies as guest Blues harmonica and piano soloist.

The historic performances began with his 1968 debut with the Chicago Symphony at Ravinia.

He continued to bring blues and classical audiences together collaborating with the New York Philharmonic at Lincoln Center, National Symphony at Kennedy Center, Boston, Philadelphia, Suisse Romande, NHK Japan, San Francisco symphonies (38 orchestras and counting), including a "Great Performances" on PBS and two historic "American Classic" albums on Deutsche Grammophon.

Siegel did all this while road-tripping with Siegel-Schwall, his solo singer-songwriter performances, and later with his Chamber Blues ensemble. At the same time, he was composing works that weave Blues and classical flavors together, taking everyone to places they've never been before.

Ground cracking

The important ground cracking, genre busting, history making nature of Corky's Blues/Classical work can be defined by looking at these wild and fun contrasts. Two of Corky's Blues/Classical recordings appear on the strictly Classical giant Deutsche Grammophon, while two are found on the exclusively Blues giant Alligator Records. The Blues/Classical concerts at diverse venues, from the strictly Classical Aspen Music Festival, Interlochen, Khoday, to Blues venues such as Blues Sur Seine, and even John Lee Hooker's Boom Boom Room also illustrate this joyful diversity. While winning the national award for chamber music composition from the Lila Wallace foundation, he was also inducted into the Chicago Blues Hall of Fame.

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

ctor, comedian, writer, and singer Leslie Jordan was born April 29, 1955, in Chattanooga, Tennessee to a loving family. His mother, Peggy Ann Jordan, was supportive and accepting. Jordan's father, Allen Bernard Jordan, was a major in the United States Army Reserve and died, along with two others, in the airplane crash at Camp Shelby, Mississippi, when Jordan was eleven years old.

Leslie moved to Los Angeles, California in 1982 and soon became involved with drugs and alcohol and was arrested several times. When Jordan was 27 years old, he began to journal daily, which helped him recover from drug and alcohol abuse. He continued his sobriety for over 25 years. He was a part of the LGBTQ+ community. Early in the AIDS crisis, Jordan became involved in AIDS Project Los Angeles (APLA) as a buddy and as a food delivery person for Project Angel Food.

Jordan began his career in 1986, appearing as Malone in the adventure series The Fall Guy. He quickly became recognizable in the industry for his diminutive size and Southern drawl. He appeared as newspaper editor Mr. Blackly in the movie The Help. He carved out a thriving career on the small screen with many guest appearances on Murphy Brown, Lois & Clark: The New Adventures of Superman, Star Trek: Voyager, Caroline in the City, Pee-Wee's Playhouse, Reba, Boston Public, Boston Legal, Nash Bridges, American Horror Story, Hearts Afire, Ski Patrol, Ugly Betty, and many more. On stage he played Earl "Brother Boy" Ingram in the 1996 play Sordid Lives, later portraying the character in the 2000 film of the same name.

But he was best known to television audiences for his character on Will & Grace as Beverley Leslie, the nemesis of the Karen Walker character played by Megan Mullally. Leslie won the Primetime Emmy Award for 'Outstanding Guest Actor in a Comedy Series' in 2006.

Recently, Jordan played the role of Phil in the FOX sitcom Call Me Kat. In 2021, He was a guest panelist on season six of The Masked Singer during week five where he also did a performance of *This Little Light of Mine* as "Soft Serve." He later returned as a guest panelist in season seven. In April 2021, he published his autobiography, "How Y'all Doing? Misadventures and Mischief from a Life Well Lived."

During the pandemic, Jordan's Instagram videos made him famous to a new generation of fans. Greeting his followers with his iconic southern drawl sign-on, "Well, s**t, what are y'all doin'?" and posting twice a day for 80 days, Jordan would quip about day-to-day life during the pandemic. He gave colorful reactions to new music and created dance montages to Pop music from his backyard to his living room. And while on walks, he humorously recalled moments from his acting career. Jordan appeared to be as surprised as anyone that a big chunk of America was following him. "I didn't realize it had blown up until everybody started calling me telling me you've gone viral," Jordan told NBC's TODAY show in March 2020. "I don't really even know what that means!" He had reached almost six million Instagram followers.

Since going viral, Leslie wanted to release a Gospel album, "Company's Comin'." The album of classic hymns features duets with some of the biggest names in Country

music: Dolly Parton, Chris Stapleton, Tanya Tucker, Brandi Carlisle and more. Leslie hoped that no matter how you were raised, you can listen and enjoy "Company's Comin'." He recalls, "I grew up in the Southern Baptist church. When you grow up in the church, everything that we did, even socially, was around the church. It was just such a big part of our lives, and I loved that music. This is the music of my childhood."

In May of 2021, Jordan made his Grand Ole Opry debut with a rousing performance of Will the Circle Be *Unbroken*, among other classic hymns. The entertainment icon was joined by Vince Gill, Charlie Worsham, and TJ Osborne, all lending their voices and musicianship for the very special moment.

On October 24th, at age 67, Leslie Jordan passed away after crashing his car into the side of a building in Los Angeles. His agent said it is suspected that Jordan suffered "some sort of medical emergency" that caused him to lose control of the vehicle. At press time, the Los Angeles coroner's office listed his death as "deferred pending additional investigation" on their website.

Just two weeks before his death, Leslie Jordan was looking forward to the next chapter in his career. In one of his final interviews, the entertainer opened up about becoming a music star in his sixties after releasing his album last year.

"So unexpected just to happen in my sixties," he told CBS News. "I love Nashville and the way that Nashville embraced me, and to be taken kind of serious. Then to have made an album with Dolly Parton, Chris Stapleton, Brandi Carlile! That's something!"

In an interview with the Los Angeles Times last year, Jordan stated, "So I had a list of what I wanted to achieve. I wanted to be in movies and TV, but this [album] was so far off the radar. It's not like I sit and think, 'What's the next big challenge?' It has just always happened for me. I've had a really blessed career. I'm just along for the ride."

Many of his closest friends and music artists paid special tribute to the comedic actor.

"The world is definitely a much darker place today without the love and light of Leslie Jordan," Jordan's agent David Shaul said. "Not only was he a mega talent and joy to work with, but he provided an emotional sanctuary to the nation at one of its most difficult times."

Jordan had shared a special Instagram post a day before his untimely passing. His attorney, Eric Feig, issued a statement: "Leslie posted himself singing the hymn, When the Roll is Called Up Yonder. Today, Leslie was called way too soon, and the world is a little bit darker without him."

He was the kindest person you could ever imagine who simply lit up a room and brought pure joy and huge smiles to millions of people around the world. The truest of Southern Gentlemen, Leslie carried an infectious exuberance, indelible sense of humor and, throughout, gifted us with countless fond memories that will last forever."

"Leslie was flawlessly funny, a virtuoso of comedy. His timing, his delivery, all apparently effortless. you can't get any better than that," wrote Megan Mullally, who played Karen Walker, Jordan's arch rival on Will & Grace.

Wonder Woman actress Lynda Carter shared, "Leslie Jordan put

a smile on the faces of so many, especially with his pandemic videos. What a feat to keep us all laughing and connected in such difficult times. It feels so cruel that this could happen to such a beautiful soul."

Dolly Parton shared, "Well I am as hurt and shocked as if I have lost a family member. Leslie and I had a special bond. I think the world felt they had a special bond with him. I know people always say 'Oh, they will be missed,' but in this case that could not be more true. He will be missed by everyone who knew him personally and by everyone who was entertained by him. Rest in peace, lil' brother."


DAVID ARN


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




my's love for music started at age three, playing piano and vocal lessons, while always being a part of the church choir and school music ensembles. My love for Country music came about from my father. He always had Country music playing in the car and while we did chores together. I used to say that I was going to be Barbara Mandrell when I grow up."

Life would take a momentary detour for Amy. In 1990, at seventeen-years-old, her journey started in a planned parenthood clinic in Riverside, California. Her story, told her way, "My wonderful well-meaning parents felt that the horrible abuse I had been through with my boyfriend, keeping the baby would not be the best plan for my future. It was better to sweep this under the rug, and then go off to college. As I sat in the small waiting room to go into the procedure, wearing the assigned gown, and having already completed the paperwork, I knew this would soon be over. I remember every conversation, every face of the others in the room, and then I heard my name called out. I was then told that the test showed I was not pregnant, 'You can go home now.' That day my destiny changed. So did Ryan's. My son is now thirty-one-years-old, experiencing all the joys and sharing all the struggles, together. He is big brother to three more siblings, my lead guitar player, and writer for our original music. The past thirty-two years are what I like to call "recalculating route."

Just because a route is recalculated, doesn't necessarily the piano and singing. "I spent my childhood in mean everything is a smooth travel. Losing the family home and everything they owned, followed by the sudden death of her bass player, Amy made the decision to leave behind full-time touring, re-enter the corporate world and rebuild. "I felt God telling me to use the same passion for this new beginning as I had put into performing, and to watch and see what He does with it." "With a grateful heart and an open mind, the past eleven years have provided incredible growth in my life, in my career. First and foremost, that grateful heart holds my eight-year marriage to my wonderful husband."

> Since no one can be another, the Barbara Mandrell fantasy gave way to the very real, very successful Amy Scruggs. As the three-year spokesperson for the American Veterans of California (AMVETS), she had the honor of performing at military and veteran events throughout the state. Her lifechanging work led to being chosen to sing the national anthem at Dodger Stadium, on behalf of the Los Angeles Army Recruiting Battalion, for the ten-year anniversary of 9/11. "Along with the amazing moments with my heroes, for more than fifteen years, I have had the opportunity to open shows for some of music's most renowned artists, including Clint Black, Trace Adkins, Phil Vassar, Charlie Daniels, Chubby Checker, Frankie Avalon, Tony Orlando, and more. The special added part to each of these shows is that my oldest son, Ryan is my lead guitar player. We have shared theses stages in the passionate work we do with the military and

veteran communities. Ryan is a great talent all his own and we share a bond in music that is felt by each audience, in a special way. These tremendous experiences I will forever treasure."

Amy went on to start her own non-profit. Out of her desire to continue creating opportunities to serve the veteran community, and to reach out, as well, to organizations that need support creating media and visibility to grow their reach, Voice For Heroes was formed. For her work, Amy received the honor of Woman of Impact Award by the California State Assembly in 2021. Amy and her husband are Rotarians who would love to continue the outreach, the speaking

at engagements clubs and leadership conferences for Rotary International.

New connections led to the past five years of hosting a national TV show, The American Dream TV on CNBC for entrepreneurs creating skill sets in communication and on-camera confidence. In addition, Amy launched a thriving media coaching business (for professionals of all industries), and wrote a bestselling book on Amazon/Barnes and Noble, Lights Camera Action. "Through these platforms, I can share my testimony of keeping faith through pain and loss, while allowing purpose and passion to continue its daily pursuit. In September 2022, I was called to appear on the Dr. Phil show, as an entrepreneur discussing work ethics. It was a joy to bring my heart, encouraging others not to quit, to do the best every day, and to watch life bring beautiful moments of new beginnings when you least expect it. I truly believe that there are more moments ahead, helping others find hope and light in this world."

Amy concludes her testimony with this: "Anyone, at any age, should not give up or think

that their story is over. God has only begun to complete my heartache were protecting me and promoting me to the place where I can live with peace, joy, and abundant faith in knowing that He who began a good work in me is faithful to complete it until the day of Christ Jesus. (Philippians 1:6) The age limits, the ability limits, the love limits, and the faith limits; I have taken the limits off. I am now allowing God to carry me through everything, and lead me in this life of empowering and inspiring others."

Scruggs released the music project of her dreams in 2022, "Love Another Day." The EP's first single, What If It All Goes Right achieved Top 10 status in countries around the world, with thanks to the visibility from the AirPlay Direct platform. The song went to #66 on the MusicRow charts (August 2022), and was picked up by the New York Times for its summer playlist (September 2022). Watch for the Amy Scruggs next single release, scheduled for early 2023.

Amy knows all too well the struggles of not being taken seriously as a woman, especially her years as a single mother. "I have always had a passion for serving others. Unfortunately, in this world we come across judgement from others, facing the decision to try and not defend ourselves, but rather allow God to do the work for us. I have learned to allow God to be my public relations manager, letting him reveal my true mission, purpose, and how the world views it. If only one person is inspired or changed by my story, then it was worth it. Judgment from others will always be there, but the past thirty years have taught me to stay on my path. I do not ever want to be discouraged or lose my love for serving."




For over forty years, Anne Murray's unique voice and heartwarming style have made her a household name. She led the way for a generation of Canadian divas, who have also conquered the world - Celine Dion, Shania Twain, K.D. Lang, Alanis Morissette and Sarah McLachlan. They all followed in her footsteps



Over the years, Anne's recordings have seldom been off the charts. She has sold close to 50 million albums and has won countless awards. However, Anne Murray is more than just a Canadian icon. Her warm voice and well-loved songs have become woven into the fabric of our lives. Anne's songs celebrate our important milestones - childhood, a first love, the wedding day, parenthood, and loss. They comfort us and

inspire us; they bring joy and uplift us. Anne's songs are forever in our hearts.

Murray was signed to Capitol Records in 1969 to record "This Way Is My Way," which was released in the fall of 1969. It featured the single that launched her career, Snowbird, which became a No. 1 hit in Canada and on the U.S. charts as well, reaching No. 8 on the Billboard Hot 100 in 1970. It was also the first of her eight No. 1 Adult Contemporary hits. Snowbird was the first Gold record ever given to a Canadian artist in the United States. As one



After the success of Snowbird, she had a number of subsequent singles that charted both Pop and Country simultaneously. During the 1970s and 1980s, her hits included Kenny Loggins's Danny's Song that peaked at No. 7, A Love Song, He Thinks I Still Care, her all-time biggest Hot 100 hit You Needed Me (1978), I Just Fall in Love Again, Shadows in the Moonlight, Broken Hearted Me, The Monkees' 1967 No. 1 hit, Daydream Believer, Could I Have This Dance from the Urban Cowboy motion picture soundtrack, Blessed Are the Believers, Another Sleepless Night, The Grammy award winning hit, A Little Good News, along with Anne's other hits, Just Another Woman in Love, Nobody Loves Me Like You Do, and Time, Don't Run Out on Me.

During the 1990s-2000s Anne recorded many albums including a live album in 1997, and in 1999 she released "What a Wonderful World," a platinum inspirational album, which went to No. 1 Contemporary Christian, No. 4 Country and No. 38 Pop. She released "Country Croonin" in 2002, the follow-up to her successful 1993 album, "Croonin'." In 2004, she released "I'll Be Seeing You" in Canada only, which features a collection of songs from the early 20th century to the mid-1940s. The 2005 American version, titled "All of Me," features a bonus disc containing many of her hit singles.

On October 10, 2007, Murray announced that she would embark on her final major tour. Murray's final public concert

was held at the Sony Centre in Toronto on May 23, 2008. After being on tour for most of her adult life, Anne knew that 2009 was the right time to "stop and reflect." In typical Anne style, she and journalist, author and writing partner Michael Posner immersed themselves in researching and writing "All of Me," the story of Anne Murray's extraordinary 40-year career.

Murray has always kept ties with her hometown, Springhill, Nova Scotia. The Anne Murray Centre, located in Springhill, opened on July 28, 1989 and houses a collection of memorabilia from both her



personal life and professional career in a series of displays. A registered Canadian charity, the Centre aims to foster tourism in the area and promote awareness of the music of Nova Scotia and Canada. All the revenue generated from its operation is used to provide employment for local people and for its ongoing maintenance.

Murray was involved in the construction of the Dr. Carson and Marion Murray Community Centre in Springhill, Nova Scotia. She served as the honorary chair of the fundraising campaign to replace the town arena that collapsed after a peewee hockey game in 2002. Named for her parents, the Dr. Carson and Marion Murray Community Centre sports an NHL-size ice sheet with seating for 800 people, a walking track, multi-purpose room, community room with seating for up to 300, and a gym. The Dr. Carson and Marion Murray Community Centre has become an integral part of the Springhill community since opening on September 15, 2004.

Murray has also been involved in a variety of charitable organizations. In addition to being the Honorary National Chairperson of the Canadian Save The Children Fund, she has served as a spokeswoman for many charities throughout her career - most recently Colon Cancer Canada. On May 20, 2009, Colon Cancer Canada launched the inaugural Anne Murray Charity Golf Classic. Over \$150,000 was raised through the event.

Air Supply

Graham Russell and Russell Hitchcock met on May 12, 1975, during rehearsals for the Australian production of "Jesus Christ Superstar" in Sydney. They became instant friends who shared much in common, including their love of The Beatles whom they'd both seen in 1964 in England and Australia.





After the evening performance of "Jesus Christ Superstar" they would play anywhere they could to hone their vocal skills and harmonies. Graham wrote constantly and they recorded a few songs on cassette, one of which was *Love and Other Bruises*. After much rejection, Russell and Hitchcock signed a record deal with CBS Records.

Their album was recorded in a week and *Love and Other Bruises* was released as the first single and immediately shot to the top of the charts. The name of the group came from a dream Graham had. He saw a billboard with flashing lights all around it and the words "AIR SUPPLY" in the center.

"Jesus Christ Superstar" ended in October 1976 and after only a couple of months, they were invited to open for Rod Stewart in Australia and Rod's North American tour in 1977 in the biggest venues, including Madison Square Garden in New York and The "Fabulous" Forum in Los Angeles.

Graham wrote several songs, including *Lost in Love* and *All Out of Love. Lost in Love* was released in Australia in 1978 and again soared to the top of the charts. It found its way to Clive Davis, founder and president of Arista Records, who immediately offered Air Supply a record deal. The song was released in 1980 and became the fastest selling in the world, topping the charts in a multitude of countries. *All Out of Love* was the second single released and topped the worldwide charts once again.

With seven consecutive top five singles, the albums "Lost in Love," "The One That You Love," "Now and Forever" and "The Greatest Hits" sold in excess of 20 million copies. *Lost in Love* was named 'Song of the Year' in 1980 and, along with the other singles, sold more than 10 million copies.

The trademark sound of Russell Hitchcock's soaring tenor voice and Graham Russell's simple but majestic compositions created a unique sound that would be forever known as Air Supply. The live shows always held audiences captive around the world. In 1983, they recorded *Making Love Out of Nothing At All*, which solidified the group as a permanent force in modern music. The song was included on the "Greatest Hits" album, which sold 7 million copies in the United States alone. *Lost in Love, All Out of Love, The One That You Love, Sweet Dreams*, and *Making Love Out of Nothing at All* each achieved multi-million plays on the radio.

Air Supply toured with lavish production in places very few acts had performed. In 1988 they were invited to participate in Australia's Bi-Centennial celebrations and perform for HRH Prince Charles and HRH Princess Diana, who they learned were ardent fans. This engagement would be one of the most treasured in their career.

In July 2005, their live DVD "It Was Thirty Years Ago Today" celebrated 30 years of recording and touring and in the same month smashed attendance records by performing in Havana, Cuba, to 175,000 fans. 2005 also saw the release of "The Singer and The Song," an acoustic album of their hits featuring Graham on acoustic guitar and just their two voices. It received much critical acclaim.

After a five-year break from recording but still touring constantly, they released "The Mumbo Jumbo." Recorded in Graham's studio in Utah and in Las Vegas, the album was produced by Graham and engineered by Sean O'Dwyer, whose credits included Pink Floyd, Randy Newman and Blink-182. The first single released, *Dance With Me*, earned a prominent feature article in Billboard Magazine titled "Still Supplying The Hits After 35 Years." Just weeks after, the composer and vocalist were honored with a BMI Million-Air Certificate recognizing over 3 million plays of *All Out Of Love*.



The band then released "Live in Jerusalem" on DVD with two new songs, *Sanctuary* and *Everywhere*. Their latest release, "The Lost In Love Experience" recorded with the Prague Symphony, features the fan-favorite *I Adore You* along with beautiful instrumental versions of some of Graham and Russell's favorite compositions.

In January 2020, Australian newspaper, the Herald Sun, proclaimed Air Supply in the top five of "Greatest Aussie Bands" of all time in the company of AC/DC, The Bee Gees and INXS.

In this 45th anniversary year, the duo continues to tour the world, having performed in England, Ireland, Israel, the Philippines, Korea, Taiwan, Japan, Canada and many other countries, of course including their home, the United States.

A true testament to the respect, passion and love fans have for Air Supply and the deep friendship they share with delighted fans both new and old, the journey continues.

The most-awarded artist in Christian music history shares, "It's a two-edged sword. At some point, you walk in with a bunch of new songs hoping people are ready to hear something new. The hard part is people don't always want that. They want to hear the hits."

Yet he found he still had stories left to tell. He adds, "I finally gave myself permission to say, don't question if this is relevant or where it's gonna fit or will it work in the current landscape of Christian music. I had to silence the voices, sit down with my guitar, and write whatever was stirring in me, let it come out however it came out."

Chapman's latest single, *Don't Lose Heart*, was inspired by Chapman's own journey through the shallowed valley of grief and loss that he and his family have traveled. The song's upbeat honesty and truth have quickly connected with listeners - it was the most-added song at radio for three weeks in a row.





social media again. Once again, Ye proves that he is one step ahead of the legacy media narrative. Parlement will be honored to help him achieve his goals."





onnie grew up in Ohio surrounded by music. Her stepfather played mandolin, while her brothers played fiddle and guitar. On Saturday nights she would listen to the Grand Ole Opry radio broadcast.

Connie entered a talent contest in 1964 at the Frontier Ranch Country Music Park near Columbus, Ohio. She won the contest with her performance of Jean Shepard's *I Thought of You*. That day at the park, Country artist Bill Anderson heard Smith perform and was impressed by her voice. He invited her to perform with him on Ernest Tubb's Midnite Jamboree program in Nashville, Tennessee. Smith recorded demos for Anderson, and it caught the attention of Chet Atkins at RCA Victor Records. Atkins offered Smith a recording contract, and she eventually signed with the label on June 24, 1964.

One of the four songs recorded during the session entitled *Once a Day* was chosen to be Smith's debut single. The song reached number one and rested there for eight weeks. It became the first debut single by a female Country artist to reach number one. Smith's follow up singles were *Then and Only Then, Tiny Blue Transistor Radio* and *I Can't Remember* all penned by Bill Anderson.

During the 60s Smith released many more albums including, "Cute n Country," "Miss Smith Goes to Nashville," "Born to Sing," "Connie in the Country," and "Connie Smith Sings Bill Anderson." Smith later commented that "it was an honor, not a favor to record an album of all Bill Anderson tunes." Connie had many singles on the Country music charts including *I'll Come Running* (which Smith wrote herself), *Cincinnati, Ohio, Burning a Hole in My Mind, Baby's Back Again*, and *Run Away Little Tears*.

In the early 1970s, Smith began recording Gospel music more frequently as she became more serious in her Christianity. She focused more heavily on her faith and testimony during her concerts and recorded several Gospel albums. During this time Connie semi-retired and took time off the road to raise her children and spend more time at home.

By the mid-90s Connie decided that it was time to return to her career. She worked with Marty Stuart as her producer and released her second self-titled studio album. It consisted of ten tracks, nine of them co-written by both Smith and Stuart.

Connie Smith and Marty Stuart married in 1997 and have enjoyed 25 years of marriage. Stuart describes his first encounter with Smith after attending one of her concerts as a young boy. "I met Connie when I was twelve years old. She came to the Indian reservation in my hometown of Philadelphia, Mississippi to work at a fair. She hasn't changed a bit. She looked great then and she looks great now." Stuart said he told his mother then that he was going to marry Connie Smith. Smith explains how they have sustained their marriage. "Make the Lord the center... and commit." Connie and Marty are one of the most loved Country music couples by the fans and their peers.

Smith recorded a collaboration album in 2003 with Country artists Barbara Fairchild and Sharon White called "Love Never Fails" on Daywind Records. Produced by Country and Bluegrass performer Ricky Skaggs, the album received a nomination from the Dove Awards. In November 2008, Smith joined the cast of Marty Stuart's television series, The Marty Stuart Show, which aired on the RFD-TV network every Saturday night. The thirty-minute program featured traditional Country music performed by Marty, Connie, the

Fabulous Superlatives, as well as radio personality Eddie Stubbs. The show stopped airing on RFD-TV in 2014 but continues airing The Best of The Marty Stuart Show.

Connie released her highly anticipated 54th album, "The Cry of the Heart," in August 2021, via Fat Possum. This marked Connie's first release in a decade. Known for the pain and heartache in her timeless Country sound, "The Cry of the Heart" had Connie collaborating on production for the third time with her husband and fellow Hall of Famer, Marty Stuart.

Smith and Stuart contributed two original tracks written together as well, including *Here Comes My Baby Back Again* and *Spare Me No Truth Tonight*. Additional songs on the project are the sterling-voiced Smith's versions of Merle Haggard's *Jesus, Take a Hold*, Dallas Frazier's *I Don't Believe Me Anymore*, and Carl Jackson's *I'm Not*

Over You. "People ask me, 'What is Country music,'" says Smith. "I say, 'To me, Country music is the cry of the heart.' We all have these experiences in our hearts and I'm trying to identify and communicate with people so they know they're not alone."


"I may have put off making a new record for quite a while," Connie says, "but I still love to sing just as much as I ever did. I really feel that it's my destiny; I heard the saying, one time, 'Do what God tells you 'til He tells you something else,' and He hasn't told me anything else yet. So, I think I'll still be singing till I hear different!"

Smith has been a member of the Grand Ole Opry for 56 years. It had been a dream of hers to become a member since childhood. She remembers saying at the age of five, "Someday I'm gonna sing on the Grand Ole Opry." She was

honored in June of last year at the Grand Ole Opry. The celebration for Connie Smith aired on Circle Network and featured wonderful performances by Mandy Barnett, Lee Ann Womack, Marty Stuart and The Tennessee Mafia Jug Band. Each artist paid tribute to Connie, making the evening extra special.

Connie's signature 1964 hit, *Once a Day* was among the 25 selected by the National Recording Preservation Board and preserved in The Library of Congress. Connie was among grand company as the only Country artist in this year's class which included recordings by Thomas Edison, Louis Armstrong, Franklin Roosevelt with Winston Churchill, and Kermit the Frog! It was very fitting and appropriate that Connie was able to receive the official certificate from husband Marty Stuart at the Grand Ole Opry.

Smith has been nominated for eleven Grammy Awards, including eight nominations for 'Best Female Country Vocal Performance' with nominations from the Country Music Association and Academy of Country Music as well. In 2012, Smith was inducted into the Country Music Hall of Fame. "Just to be in the company of the great Kitty Wells is enough," she commented after hearing the news.

Many artists in the Country music industry have cited Smith as a significant musical influence or one of their favorite musical artists. George Jones cited Smith as his favorite female singer in his 1995 autobiography. Elvis Presley had many of Smith's albums in his record collection. Roy Acuff called her the 'Sweetheart of the Grand Ole Opry' and Eddie Stubbs called her 'The Rolls Royce of Country Singers."

Dolly Parton famously said, "You know, there's really only three female singers in the world: Barbra Streisand, Linda Ronstadt, and Connie Smith. The rest of us are only pretending."

Larry Cordle was born and raised on a small family farm in eastern Kentucky. While a young child, he was introduced to Bluegrass, Country, and Gospel music by his great grandfather, Harry Bryant, an old-time claw hammer banjo stylist, fiddle player, and dancer. After graduating from high school, Cordle spent four years in the Navy. After being honorably discharged, he attended Morehead State, receiving a bachelor's degree in accounting.

Eastern Kentucky was home for Cordle and his childhood friend Ricky Skaggs. In 1983, Skaggs recorded *Highway 40 Blues* which became the number one song in the nation, helping to launch Larry's songwriting career.

In 1985, Cordle was out of the accounting business and back to playing night clubs. At Ricky's urging, Cordle moved to Nashville to become a staff songwriter for Ricky's new company, Amanda-Lin Music.

At last count, Cordle's songs had appeared on projects that have sold a combined total of more than 55 million records. Artists such as Ricky Skaggs, Alison Krauss, Garth Brooks, George Strait, Trisha Yearwood, Reba McEntire, Diamond Rio, Alan Jackson, and many others have recorded Cordle's songs.

In 1993, Larry Cordle & Lonesome Standard Time won the IBMA 'Song of the Year' Award for *Lonesome Standard Time*, written by Larry Cordle and Jim Rushing. In 2000, they took home the IBMA 'Song of the Year' Award for one of Cordle's most popular songs of his career, *Murder On Music Row*, written by Larry Cordle and Larry Shell. In the same year, he received the IBMA 'Song of the Year' nomination for *Black Diamond Strings*, another co-write with Cordle and Shell. Those two songs were part of two Grammy-nominated albums. In 1992, Larry, Glen Duncan, and Lonesome Standard Time received a 35th Annual GRAMMY Award Nomination for 'Best Bluegrass Album' for "Lonesome Standard Time." In 2000, Cordle and the band received a 43rd Annual Grammy Award Nomination for 'Best Bluegrass Album' for *Murder On Music Row*.

Cordle is often featured as a lead and background vocalist on some of Nashville's most awarded and popular music. In addition, he's provided harmony vocals for artists such as Garth Brooks, Blake Shelton, Jerry Salley, and more.

Cordle is also featured on "Livin, Lovin, Losin: A Tribute to the Louvin Brothers," which won a GRAMMY for 'Best Country Album' in 2003 and received the IBMA 'Recorded Event of the Year' Award in 2004. Cordle is featured on two tracks of "Moody Bluegrass," released in 2004, alongside Tim O'Brien, Alison Krauss, John Cowan, Harley Allen, et al., and again as lead vocalist on "Moody Bluegrass II."

In 2006, "Celebration of Life: Musicians Against Childhood Cancer" won the IBMA 'Album of the Year'

Award. The album features Larry Cordle, Tony Rice, Marty Raybon, The Seldom Scene, and many others. In 2011, Cordle released his Americana album, "Pud Marcum's Hangin." In 2012, he co-produced the IBMA 'Recorded Event of the Year' Award-winning album "Life Goes On." The album includes the talents of Larry Cordle, Carl Jackson, Ronnie Bowman, Jerry Salley, and more.

In April 2015, Larry was inducted into the Kentucky Music Hall of Fame, celebrating his impressive career in music. The same year he received a Nomination for IBMA 'Recorded Event of the Year' Award for the song *Against the Grain* by Larry Cordle & Lonesome Standard Time featuring Garth Brooks, produced by Cordle on Mighty Cord Records.

In 2016, Cord had to put a hold on his all-Gospel album while undergoing chemo for leukemia but was able to release "Give Me Jesus" in March 2017. This powerful album received a 2018 Grammy Nomination for 'Best Roots Gospel Album' and a 2017 IBMA 'Gospel Recorded Event of the Year' nomination for the title track, a traditional tune arranged by Cord, who is now in remission.

In 2018, he released another album on his Mighty Cord Records label titled "Tales From East Kentucky." Cordle released one of his best albums, titled "Where The Trees Know My Name," in February 2021.

Cordle regularly records and performs. He is still, first and foremost, a songwriter, now writing independently for his own company, Wandachord Music, BMI. He is a longtime resident of the Nashville suburb of Hendersonville, Tennessee, where he lives with his wife, Wanda.

Country music runs so deep in her DNA with her parents as well as with her grandmother Dottie West, and uncles Lefty Frizzell and David Frizzell. Both Dottie and Lefty have been inducted into the Country Music Hall of Fame. Shelly and David became an award-winning duo in recording the Country classic, *You're The Reason God Made Oklahoma*. Shelly and David each have enjoyed successful solo careers with many classic hits.

aturally, with all her family's talent, it's not surprising that she was born to sing. Tess says, "There really was no moment in time when I decided I wanted to do music. I really was born into it, and it was born in me, I suppose. I have done some other things along the way, studied creative writing in college to becoming accomplished in portrait paintings. But there was never a time I didn't want to sing – never even a moment!"

For Tess, growing up in the Frizzell and West family, she's had a front row seat to hear all the stories and special memories that her family has shared. Tess mentions, "There are truly so many great stories along the way on both sides of my family. I always find it funny to share how the Frizzells and Wests really got together in the first place. My grandmother, Dottie West was on tour, and my mother was coming out of high school and wanted to be a singer. My grandmother told her she could come on the road and sing backup, as long as she never dated anyone in the band. My dad, Allen Frizzell was the lead guitar player, he and my mom ran off together! They joined up with his older brother David in California, and after a few years, he and mom became a duet together, joining two legendary Country names."

Anytime a baby's birth is announced, it's special. But in Tess Frizzell's case it happened on national television. "As far as special highlights in my life I've experienced related to the music world, my birth announced on the Academy of Country Music Awards was very special. My mother Shelly was nominated for 'Duet of the Year' with Uncle David, but she was in Nashville giving birth to me and missed the awards. Grandmother Dottie was hosting the awards show so she missed my birth. They surprised her on national television with a video showing me to her. She was so incredibly proud watching it, and how special for the entire world to see that! Frizzell and West did win 'Duet of the Year,' with grandmother accepting the award on my mother's behalf. It's such a treasure for me to still have that video footage!"

Tess is carrying on the family tradition, writing songs with hit writers including Bill Anderson, Michael Farren, and Bobby Tomberlin. Tess tours the country singing her own music and some of the hits made famous by her family, sharing the stories behind the songs. Tess has shared the stage with many of Country music's legends in addition to appearing on numerous television shows.

Tess has released her latest single, The Wrong One. The song was written by Tess Frizzell, Bobby Tomberlin, Billy Lawson, and Dottie West. Tess shares how special it was to share co-writing credits on a song with her grandmother. "It came about from some old notebooks of my grandmother's."

"A few years back our dear friend, Ron Harman (who works at the Country Music Hall of Fame) came across these notebooks. Ron helps us care for her things in storage. He had the idea to have a song come out of them, then had hit songwriter, Bobby Tomberlin read through the books. Bobby joined Steve Wariner in writing a first song from those notebooks. My grandmother got Steve started in the business when he was just seventeen; he was so close to her. Jeannie Seely cut the song, If You Could Call It That on her new album, which was pretty amazing."

"That was such a magical experience for everyone involved, Bobby suggested doing it again and having me write. He found some lines and a title, and I loved it. We went down to Muscle Shoals, Alabama where there is such a rich history of music, and met up with hit songwriter, Billy Lawson. The three of us finished writing the song, and once it was done, I realized it was the date she had passed away, exactly thirty years before. I was totally covered in goosebumps that after thirty years gone; she had a brand-new song that I actually co-wrote with her! Billy Lawson produced the song in the historic Wishbone Studios in Muscle Shoals, where Roy Orbison cut songs and even Hank Jr. cut Family Tradition there. One of the most special things I've been a part of is releasing this song that grandmother started on paper in the 1960s. Music is so magical in that way; it really never dies. Even though she's no longer here with us, she's very much alive through her music." The Wrong One is available on all streaming outlets.

Another special moment for Tess and her family was the Dottie West induction into The Country Music Hall of Fame paint brush and canvas. These beautiful paintings include

in 2018. Tess reflects, "Even through the long process, everything happens in God's timing. I've learned so many times along the way in life about God's timing, and not our own. It's so easy to want to force things, but God's timing is always better, always more beautiful. He is the ultimate story writer."

"One such time, grandmother finally being inducted. She had passed away twenty-seven years prior, and so many had wanted her in the hall of fame many, many years sooner. As time passed, many speculated she would never get in. Statistically, having already passed away, and being a female, she was much less likely to be inducted. Many wanted to see her rightfully integrated into this prestigious place, along with so many

of her peers. After having decades of success and even being the first female in Country music to win a Grammy Award, the petitions started. An annual Dottie West Birthday Bash concert was being held in Nashville in her memory, and every time you heard Jeannie Seely, Larry Gatlin, or Steve Wariner give an interview, they mentioned how she needed to be inducted. Once it happened, it was so incredibly emotional because there had been such an outpouring from people all over the world, pushing to see her get in. If she had simply been inducted in those first years when she passed, we would not have gotten to truly witness how much she was dearly loved and missed. It was so much more of a rich experience having waited twenty-seven years. So much richer in God's timing."

Tess is a talented artist, not only as a singer but with a

iconic images and special memories of Dottie West, Lefty Frizzell, Elvis Pressley with Dottie, Linda Ronstadt, and most recently, Willie Nelson.

Tess has been traveling across the country doing shows from Tennessee to California. She says, "I love getting to do music that I actually write, but of course there is something special about doing some of the family hits. At my shows, I can't tell you how cool it is to see so many people sing along with all of the words to, You're The Reason God Made Oklahoma!"

Celebrating the Legends

This Edition JERRY LEE LEWIS

EDITOR'S NOTE: At press time, we are saddened to learn that Jerry Lee Lewis has passed away. In his honor, we have chosen to publish this column, although written before his death. In the next issue, we will feature a proper memorial tribute to this beloved Rock & Roll icon.

Terry Lee Lewis is one of the first true Rock 'n' Roll musicians. He catapulted to fame with his 1957 hit, Whole Lotta Shakin' Goin' On, and proved to the world that a piano man could play front and center on the world's biggest stages. Lewis' dynamic stage presence has made him a hard act to follow. Other Rock legends have said that they never wanted to follow a Jerry Lee Lewis performance.

Jerry Lee began playing the piano at age nine, copying the styles of preachers and black musicians that traveled through the area. He signed with Sun Records in 1956 and quickly became a star. He was the first person inducted into the first class of the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame in 1986.

With his innovative and flamboyant piano playing style, Jerry Lee emerged as one of Rock music's early showmen in the 1950s. His musical talents became apparent early on in life. He taught himself to play piano, and sang in church growing up. Lewis listened to such radio shows as the Grand Ole Opry and Louisiana Hayride. Jimmie Rodgers, Hank Williams, and Al Jolson were some of his early influences.

When he was ten, Lewis' father mortgaged the family farm to buy Jerry Lee his first piano. At the grand opening of a local car dealership, he gave his first public performance at the age of fourteen, wowing the crowd with his piano prowess. With little formal education, he basically gave up on school around this time to focus on his music.

Lewis eventually ended up in Memphis, Tennessee, where he found work as a studio musician for Sun Studios. In 1956, he recorded his first single, a cover of Ray Price's *Crazy Arms*, which did well locally. Lewis also worked on some recording sessions with Carl Perkins. While working at Sun, he and Perkins jammed with Elvis Presley and Johnny Cash. This session by the "Million Dollar Quartet" was recorded at the time, but it was not released until much later.



In 1957, Lewis became a star with his unique pianodriven sound. Whole Lotta Shakin' Goin' On became a hit on the Pop, Country, and R&B charts. By this time, Lewis had also developed some of his famous stage antics, such as playing standing up, and even lighting the occasional piano on fire. He had such energy and enthusiasm in his performances that he earned the nickname, "The Killer" for the way he knocked out his audiences.

Lewis was on a roll with his next single. *Great Balls Of Fire* proved to be another big hit in December 1957. The following March, Lewis struck again with, *Breathless* which made its way into the Top 10 of the Pop charts.

In the 1960s, Lewis returned to the music of his youth. He found a new career as a Country artist, scoring a 1968 hit with *Another Place, Another Time*. Lewis recorded several Country albums over the next few years, including 1970's "Olde Tyme Country Music" and 1975's "Boogie Woogie Country Man."

Lewis never left the Rock world completely. In 1973, he did well on the album charts with "The Session." He revisited some of his older songs on this popular recording as well as the works of Chuck Berry and John Fogerty. When he was inducted into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame's first class in

1986, there was a strong resurgence in his Rock & Roll career and music. A new generation of listeners got introduced to Lewis through the 1989 biopic, Great Balls of Fire, when Lewis was played by actor Dennis Quaid.

This nearly lifelong musician and singer continued to record new music and perform around the world. From the 2006, Last Man Standing, Lewis sang a number of Rock, Blues, and Country classics with some help from such famous admirers as Mick Jagger, Keith Richards, Kris Kristofferson, Willie Nelson, and Buddy Guy. Collaborator Kristofferson described Lewis as "one of the few who can do Rock 'n' Roll, Country or Soul, and every song is authentic." He told USA Today that Lewis is "one of the best Pictured left to right: Jimmy Swaggart, Jerry Lee Lewis, and Mickey Gilley American voices ever." Lewis and Kristofferson worked together again on Lewis' next effort,

and John Fogerty, among others.

2014 kicked off Jerry Lee's "80th Birthday Tour" with shows across the country, from California to Tennessee to New York. The Killer also traveled to Europe. Lewis released his first ever biography with Pulitzer Prize winning author, Rick Bragg. "Jerry Lee Lewis - His Own Story" came out to critical acclaim, along with his new CD, "Rock & Roll Time." As he looked back on six decades of music and what the future holds, Lewis says he's grateful. "I just think it's a blessing from God that I'm still living; and I'm still rocking at the age of eighty."

When Jerry Lee Lewis turned 85, The Killer celebrated the milestone birthday with his millions of fans around the world through a giant virtual live stream event, "Whole Lotta Celebratin' Goin' On: 85 Years of The Killer." The birthday celebration was hosted by actor John Stamos, the special featured performances and well wishes from friends and fans

2010's "Mean Old Man." The all-star guests on this release including Elton John, President Bill Clinton, Willie Nelson, included Eric Clapton, Tim McGraw, Sheryl Crow, Kid Rock, Lee Ann Womack, and Joe Walsh, among many others. The event was shared on Jerry Lee Lewis' official Facebook and YouTube channels, and on jerryleelewis.com. The celebration also marked the first time in forty years that Lewis had been in the same room with his famous cousins, Country legend Mickey Gilley, and televangelist Jimmy Swaggart.


> Jerry Lee recently became the newest inductee into the Country Music Hall of Fame in the Veteran's Era category. The announcement came in May at a press conference in the Hall of Fame rotunda in Nashville. Many of his fans lobbied many years, wanting to see the American music legend honored while he is still with us. Jerry Lee Lewis was inducted with Keith Whitley (Modern Era category), and RCA Records Executive, Joe Galante (Non-Performer Rotating category). "It's always great to be recognized," said Lewis in his brief remarks. "I'm here, I love you, I couldn't have done it without you."

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TERRY SWILLEY

About 46 years ago, I bought a scratched Harmony guitar on clearance at the Sears outlet store. I could sound out melodies on a harmonica, but I knew nothing about a guitar. A few "Top Hits" books later that had lyrics and guitar chords and I was strumming out a few songs. I could play enough to use the guitar as a tool to write songs and did. It just so happened that my sister was living near Nashville at the time and was involved in the music industry. I was married and teaching and would visit her during the summers. After a couple of visits, I decided that I would take some of the songs that I had written to "Music Row" to see if I could talk to people in the different publishing companies. Nashville was a completely different place in the 1970s and everywhere I went, the people were super nice and would listen to two or three songs. They were encouraging.

A few years passed, our children were born, I got a couple more degrees while I was working, became a school administrator and didn't have time for writing. My music didn't die but it did lie dormant. Then unexpectedly through luck, I started playing harmonica with Jed Clampit at The River in Monticello, Arkansas which led by chance happenings to my playing with Ben Coulter's band, The Delta Outlaws, for a couple of years. That was enough to get me writing again.

I built up my portfolio and started making rough demos of my songs. I wrote several different types of music, but I wanted to do a Christian CD with influences of Southern Gospel, Country music, the Blues, and Contemporary Christian music. In the meantime, my old friend and band mate Ben Coulter had given up the Nashville music scene and had become the pastor of a church in Magnolia, Arkansas. He was a perfect fit to sing my songs.

I released my first song by Ben Coulter "Take my Hand" at the end of May 2021 and Jamie Coulter released "I Never Said Goodbye" on a CD he released with him singing. We later released Ben's version of "He Will Give You Rest" from the album TESTIMONY. These songs charted for over a year. We just released Ben singing "One Day I'm Going To Rise" and will continue to release songs from this album. We recently finished the album EVERYTHING HAS A REASON sung by Ben Coulter. We also have released a single performed by John Dumas called "He's Everywhere", an early song from 1978. Others will follow.

Thanks DJs for continuing to play and chart my songs and thank you Ben Coulter, Jamie Coulter and John Dumas for singing my songs!

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

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

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undisputed Queen of Country Music, with more than sixty years of recording and touring to her name. A self-taught guitarist and songwriter, Lynn was one of the most distinctive performers in Nashville in the 1960s and 1970s. She shook up Nashville by writing her own songs, many of which tackled boundary-pushing topics drawn from her own life experiences as a wife and mother. Coal Miner's Daughter, Fist City, and Don't Come Home A' Drinkin' are just three of her sixteen Country #1 singles. "To make it in this business, you either have to be first, great or different, and I was the first to ever go into Nashville, singin' it like the women lived it." Loretta shared the quote from her website.

Loretta was a coal miner's daughter, raised in dire poverty in a remote Appalachian Kentucky hamlet. Living in a mountain cabin with seven brothers and sisters, she was surrounded by music as a child. "I thought everybody sang, because everybody up there in Butcher Holler did," she recalls in an earlier interview. "Everybody in my family sang. So, I really didn't understand until I left Butcher Holler that there were some people who couldn't. And it was kind of a shock."

She famously married Oliver "Doolittle" Lynn at thirteen years old. "Doo" was a twenty-one-year-old war veteran with a bad reputation. When she was seven months pregnant with her first child, they moved far away from Appalachia to Custer, Washington. By age twenty, she had four children

oretta Lynn has long been established as the (two more, twins, came along in 1964). Isolated from her native culture and burdened with domestic work, she turned to music for solace. "Before I was singing, I cleaned house; I took in laundry; I picked berries. I worked seven days a week. I was a housewife and mother for fifteen years before I was an entertainer. And it wasn't like being a housewife today. It was doing hand laundry on a board, and cooking on an old coal stove. I grew a garden and canned what I grew. That's what's real. I know how to survive."

> Doo heard her singing at her chores and declared that she sounded just as good as anyone he heard on the radio. He bought her a guitar and told her to learn how to play it, and write songs with it. Loretta says her songs were so forthright because she didn't know any better. "I just wrote about things that happened. I was writing about things that nobody talked about in public, and I didn't realize that they didn't. I was having babies and staying at home. I was writing about life."

> Doo began pushing her to perform in area nightclubs. Executives from Zero Records heard her in a nightspot. She soon recorded her debut single, I'm a Honky Tonk Girl, for the little label. Loretta made herself a fringed cowgirl outfit, and she and Doo drove across the country in his old Mercury sedan promoting the single at station after station.

> Astonishingly, it worked. The song hit the charts in the summer of 1960 and brought the couple to Music City. She began singing regularly on the Grand Ole Opry, after her

debut on October 15, 1960. The Wilburn Brothers took her under their wings. They took a tape to producer Owen Bradley at Decca Records. Loretta got a Decca Records contract. Owen Bradley was smitten with Loretta's innocence, individualism, infectious wit, independent spirit, humorous candor, refreshing frankness, and immense talent.

Loretta's Decca chart debut came in 1962 with *Success*. It became the first of over fifty Top 10 hits and led to an invitation to join the Grand Ole Opry cast later that year. Her fellow Opry cast member, Patsy Cline taught her how to dress, style her hair, and wear make-up. The Wilburns began featuring her on their nationally syndicated TV series. She sang a series of sassy domestic ditties with her childhood hero, Ernest Tubb.

"Most of my songs were from the women's point of view," Loretta wrote in her best- selling autobiography. "That's who I'm singing about and singing to during my shows. And the girls know it. Most of my fan club is women, which is how I want it." Among Loretta's finest moments on disc are such empowering female statements as *I Wanna Be Free, We've Come A Long Way Baby, Hey Loretta, Love Is The Foundation* and *One's On The Way*. Loretta and Conway Twitty won numerous awards with a number of hugely popular duet performances from 1970-1982.



One of the most remarkable things about Loretta Lynn was how she renewed her creativity time and again. Two years after she was inducted into the Nashville Songwriters Hall of Fame in 1983, she was back on the charts with the hit, *Heart Don't Do This To Me*. In 1988, the year she entered the Country Music Hall of Fame, Loretta recorded a song with K.D. Lang, Kitty Wells, and Brenda Lee. She earned a Gold Record in 1994 with *Honky Tonk Angels*, a trio CD with Dolly Parton and Tammy Wynette.

Doo, the love of her life, died in 1996. Numb with grief, Loretta admits that she was lost in a fog for more than a year. But she came back again with a 2000 CD titled, "Still Country." She also returned to the concert trail. Thanks to the Oscar-winning 1980 film, Coal Miner's Daughter, starring Sissy Spacek, Lynn's story and songs were brought to an even

wider audience, amplifying her impact on several generations of songwriters and artists, in various genres including Jack White, with whom Lynn made the Grammy-winning 2004 album. "Van Lear Rose."

Throughout her 80s, Loretta continued to write new songs, and in 2016, returned to the charts with the Grammynominated, "Full Circle," the first in a series of critically acclaimed albums produced by her daughter, Patsy Lynn Russell and John Carter Cash at Cash Cabin Studio in Hendersonville, Tennessee.

On October 19, 2019, Lifetime aired the highly anticipated movie, Patsy & Loretta, which highlighted her lifelong friendship with Patsy Cline. The movie's release was followed in 2020 by the single, *I Fall To Pieces*, along with Loretta's memoir, Me & Patsy Kickin' Up Dust, a celebration of their music and their relationship up until Patsy's tragic and untimely death.

In 2021, the American music icon released "Still Woman Enough," a celebration of women in Country music, her fiftieth studio album (not including her ten studio duet collaborations with Conway Twitty). The album featured a title track, co-written with Patsy Lynn Russell, of a deeply emotional *Coal Miner's Daughter Recitation* commemorating the 50th Anniversary of the release of Lynn's signature song (October 5, 1970) and album (January 4, 1971).

She is also one of the most awarded musicians of all time. Loretta has been inducted into more music Halls of Fame than any other female recording artist, including The Country Music Hall of Fame, The Songwriters Hall of Fame, and was the first woman to be named the Country Music Association's 'Entertainer of the Year' in 1972. Lynn received Kennedy Center Honors in 2003 and a Presidential Medal of Freedom in 2013. In 2015, she was named recipient of Billboard's inaugural Women in Music Legend Award. With eighteen nominations spread out over every single decade for the last six decades, Lynn has won four Grammy Awards, including a Grammy Lifetime Achievement Award in 2010, and her most recent in 2019. She has sold more than forty-five million records worldwide.

Loretta suffered a stroke and a fall in 2017, resulting in a broken hip. Yet, these challenges couldn't stop Loretta. She fought back hard, determined to enjoy life with her family. She loved keeping up with her fans and Country music through social media. She spent most of her time at her beloved ranch in Hurricane Mills, Tennessee. Surrounded by pets, she would tell you that's what she loved more than anything. She loved spending time with her four surviving children, Ernie, Cissie, Peggy, and Patsy, whom she described as her absolute best friends. She also treasured the memories of her eldest children, Betty Sue and Jack, both of whom preceded her.

Throughout Loretta's career she wrote and recorded many Gospel songs, sharing her faith. She shared a video on social media from Easter 2022. "When I think about Easter I think about the incredible beauty of real love," the caption reads.

"Love that gives when it doesn't have to. Love that gives even when it doesn't receive. It's what Christ did for us. I think of hope and redemption and forgiveness. There aren't words to share how thankful I am for all God has done for me. My faith means a lot to me. If it wasn't for God, none of us would be here. Jesus is my friend. I keep hold of his hand and I don't let loose. If I ever let loose, well, I hope he grabs me because I'll be lost." Loretta has also shared how much it means that Jesus died for her sins. "Oh my, it hurts. I won't be able to tell Him much I appreciate what he did," the beloved songstress said. There's no way you can repay Jesus for what he done. There's just no way. You just have to show him how much you love him, and I think that's the way we all have to repay him. It's in your actions."

Lynn's daughter, Peggy Marchetti shared how important her fans meant to Loretta. "Over these last few years, after the stroke, she missed her fans, her music, her friends, singing and performing. She missed her tour bus, her dresses, and most of all her connection to her audience. She spoke about going back on tour again and singing all the time. She would sing all the time at home. She would scare the caregivers to death, in the middle of the night, when she would break out in song at the top of her lungs! She was and will always be Loretta Lynn. I guess she needed to remind them she had chops! Thank you, Mom... for everything. You have been the best mom. You have been an inspiration to so many."

Granddaughter, Tayla Lynn also spoke of their loss and acknowledged her fans. "Getting to meet Jesus was something that brought her so much joy and comfort. This loss, this grief, we all feel it. You feel it like I do; you are family. To her, you were her family for so very long. She's wasn't just ours. She was yours too. As sad as we are, we are so thankful she is home with her Father in Heaven, her mommy and daddy, her children, and her husband."

Tre Twitty, son of Conway Twitty shares, "Being around Loretta was like being around family. She wasn't my "Memaw" but I called her that, and she didn't mind at all. She would talk to me for hours about my family, and my family's

history. It showed me that what her and Poppy had was true love and friendship, and not just two people singing together. I'm so grateful for the time I got to spend with her. Your family and the world will miss you dearly Memaw, but your music, wisdom, humor, and kindness will live on forever."

"Mama and Loretta were four years apart, mama being the oldest. They always reminded me a lot of each other. Strong women, who loved their children and were fiercely loyal," Reba McEntire wrote in a statement to Variety. "Now they're both in heaven getting to visit and talk about how they were raised, how different country music is now from what it was when they were young. Sure makes me feel good that mama went first so she could welcome Loretta into the hollers of heaven. I always did and

Dolly Parton, who was close to Lynn, posted a statement Many from the Country Music Community, family, on social media, which began, "So sorry to hear about my sister, friend Loretta. We've been like sisters all the years we've been in Nashville, and she was a wonderful human being, wonderful talent, had millions of fans, and I'm one of them. I miss her dearly as we all will."

> Actress, Sissy Spacek who won an Oscar for portraying Lynn in the film, Coal Miner's Daughter, said she is "heartbroken" over the death of the Country music star. "Today is a sad day. The world lost a magnificent human being. Loretta Lynn was a great artist, a strong and resilient Country music pioneer, and a precious friend."

> Close friend of Loretta and the Lynn family, Kid Rock added these sweet words. "RIP Miss Loretta. I find it very difficult to put your beautiful soul, talent, and friendship into words right now... so I will use the ones you said to me and so many others, so many times... I love you honey."


> Jack White, who produced her "Van Lear Rose" comeback album in 2004, posted a two-minute testimonial on Instagram. "What a sad day today is," White said. And she thought that she was just different and that's how she made it, but I think she was all three of those things. Artist Spotlight EDNA'S KIN



Patriarch Warren Koontz plays bass and sings, eldest son Andrew Koontz plays fiddle and sings, and youngest son Dan Koontz plays guitar and sings. They play fun, upbeat Americana music, including many original songs inspired by classic Country and Blues music along with countrified covers of some of the most unlikely songs. Their bluegrass version of *Iron Man*, originally by Black Sabbath, has been viewed over 128,000 times on YouTube.

While the origins of the band extend back to the early 80s when the family lived together and played together frequently, the current incarnation began in 2007. Since that time, Edna's Kin has performed their goodtime music at numerous festivals throughout the Northeast, bringing smiles everywhere they go.

Edna's Kin's latest album release, "Two Thumbs," was recorded during the pandemic, and is another romp through Country and Blues styles. Father Warren gets his chance to shine vocally on the mordantly funny *Old Man Blues* and also

on the wistful ballad *Bottom of a Bottle*. Older brother Andrew contributes some fun originals, including the back porch bayou Blues of *Bon Soleil*. And Dan returns with about a half-dozen new tunes that range from the goofy *Bees and Birds* to the heartsick *Every Day*. The title track, *Two Thumbs*, is also one of Dan's new ones, a tribute to the old-fashioned Country instrumental - but with a quick vocal chorus thrown in for good luck. Finally, there's one for the Rock and Rollers: a fiddle-heavy cover of Led Zeppelin's *Hot Dog*.

Their debut CD, "Whiskey and Wine," was released in April 2019, and features eleven original songs written by Dan Koontz and arranged by the band. In their recordings the band seeks to recreate the energy and fun of their live performances. Several tracks off "Whiskey and Wine," including the honky-tonk style *All This Lovin*', received considerable airplay.
